

As the story goes, there was a very popular restaurant in a small Mississippi town and the local newspaper reporter went to find the secret of its success. When the reporter asked the owner, the reply was simply "we serve good food". So simple but factual.

The Episcopal Church is just like that restaurant...serving "good food" and there is no better place than right here at Nativity. Just think of all the "good food" we serve! A few examples come to mind...worship, education, fellowship, music, and many great ministries led by our laity.

What about those not at our table? How do we get them to know this great Episcopal/ Nativity food? How do we share God? People are always looking for "good food"...healthy, nutritious, and life giving.

The word *invite* seems to be the answer. We (you and I) are called to *invite* people to our table. This simple word was the message of recent meetings I attended with our Bishop, Kee Sloan. We were directed to "invite, inspire, and transform" or in other words to "invite, welcome, and connect" others to our table. It all starts with the invitation and that is where you and I come in. We all know someone to invite to Nativity....whether it be a neighbor, friend, business associate, or a youth. You might even have a feeling about someone that God has been nudging your heart to issue an invitation to visit our Nativity community. Remember we do serve "good food" and we have plenty to share.

As Bishop Kee says "ships are safe in the harbor but we don't build ships to stay in the harbor." Is your ship staying in the harbor or are you going out and inviting others? God needs us "on the water sailing." The choice is clear. What will you do?

The Nativity Choir In Concert

You will not want to miss The Nativity Choir's Spring Concert on Saturday, May 18 at 5:00 p.m. in the church Nave. Closing out The Nativity Music Series this year, the concert features The Nativity Choir and Friends singing Louis Vierne's Mass in C# Minor with Nicholas Bergin, organist. Dr. Stephen G. Schaeffer, interim Organist/Choirmaster, will conduct. Bergin, organist at First Presbyterian Church, Nashville, will also perform solo organ works by Vierne and Tournemire to frame the choral offering.

The blind French organist Louis Vierne (1870-1937) was organist at Notre Dame from 1900 until his death at the end of his 1750th concert at the console of this famous Parisian church. Vierne composed the *Messe Solennelle (Solemn Mass)* in 1899. Scored for two organs, this majestic and ingratiating choral piece will be sung on May 18th from the new edition for one organ and choir. Make plans now to attend what promises to be a wonderful musical finale.

On Saturday, May 11th the Outreach Committee is sponsoring a Meal Packaging Event from 1:00-3:00 in the parish hall. We need 35-40 people to make a commitment to help package the meals. We will package 10,000 meals in two hours. This is a fun, hands on mission project that is suitable for all ages - children, youth, families, adults, everyone!



Stop Hunger Now's meal packaging program is a volunteer-based program that coordinates the streamlined packaging of highly nutritious dehydrated meals comprised of rice, soy,

vegetables, flavoring and 21 essential vitamins and minerals. The meals are easily transported to crisis-burdened areas or supplied to school feeding programs around the world. The meals cost only \$0.25 per meal to create.

Outreach, making a difference

305 8th Street, a home for intellectually disabled adults, houses 19 full time residents. They receive no federal assistance, because their residents are just above the IQ range to qualify, yet they are far from able to live independently. 305 8th Street is totally dependent on the generosity of area churches and individuals like you. Your Outreach committee was able to fund two needed picnic tables to be delivered to the home in the coming two weeks. Thanks to Mike Innes for the identification of this need, the legwork to get it done, your Vestry for the approval of the project and Greg Brooks of Brooks & Collier for his special pricing. We hope to have more involvement with this worthy group in the future.

Our Neighbor, The Vine

Using faith resources, The Vine Pastoral Counseling Center, helps the individual, couples and families find relief from depression, anxiety, distress, trauma, and many other issues. Supported by Nativity and nineteen other area churches, The Vine, is Nativity's neighbor at 333 Franklin Street, it brings healing to those members in the Body of Christ.

Since it's beginnings it has grown to five area offices, has four full-time staff and two part-time staff, has served members from over 150 congregations with over 32,000 counseling hours. Through the support of Nativity, it's other nineteen congregational partners, and YOU, services are available to all on a sliding scale (ability to pay) scale. Thanks to your invaluable support, 2012 saw 3647 sessions, 879 of these were scholarship sessions.

A self-help lending library, full of devotional and self help books is available for anyone who would like to borrow, keep, or simply use and return, is open to all. This library is supplied by monetary and book donations. If you have any devotional books you are ready to pass on, The Vine will receive them 8 - 11 a.m. Monday through Friday.

Stewardship of Creation tip for May 1, 2013

Several years ago, at the General Convention of our church, a resolution was passed entitled "Affirm Environmental Responsibility and Establish an Environmental Stewardship Team".

In honor of Earth Day, and our Diocesan Care of Creation Sunday, both of which were recently observed, here is the text of the main body of that resolution, to remind us of the importance of our Christian Stewardship of God's creation and of the amazing gifts we have been given AND the responsibility we have been given.

Resolved, the House of Bishops concurring, That the 70th General Convention of the Episcopal Church, affirming our responsibility for the earth in trust for this and future generations:

- 1. Declares that Christian Stewardship of God's created environment, in harmony with our respect for human dignity, requires response from the Church of the highest urgency;
- 2. Calls on all citizens of the world, and Episcopalians in particular, to live their lives as good stewards with responsible concern for the sustainability of the environment and with appreciation for the global interdependence of human life and the natural worlds; and
- 3. Urges all Episcopalians to reflect on their personal and corporate habits in the use of God's creation; to share with one another ideas for new responses; and to act as individuals, congregations, dioceses, and provinces of the Episcopal Church in ways that protect and heal all interdependent parts of creation. Such action should include prayerful theological discernment and factual knowledge. It should also consider global and local links and the balance of environmental integrity with economic sufficiency for human living; and be it further

Resolved, That the Episcopal Church, acknowledging the sovereignty of God and God's call to us in the servanthood of Christ, continue to engage environmental issues, passionately caring for the earth and striving to live into the promises and mandates which are ours as stewards of creation; and be it further

Resolved, That this Convention calls upon the Presiding Bishop and the President of the House of Deputies to appoint an interdisciplinary, multicultural Environmental Stewardship Team, 14 members, representing each Province and a broad spectrum of Church membership, whose gifts and expertise are suitable to the task. The mission of the Environmental Stewardship Team is to educate, motivate and facilitate congregations, dioceses and provinces toward local and regional plans, advocacy and action. The Team will work with other environmental groups of common interest..."
