

The Wind of the Spirit and our Ministry Together

The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit. Jesus reminds us in John's Gospel (3:8) that we are people of the Spirit. The Spirit infuses us with life and then sends us forth to do God's work as we are able and as we are called.

Nativity's Vacation Bible School this week explores the exciting force of the Spirit as the wind blowing us along in life and ministry. Our children are having a wonderful time and will share some of what they are learning this week at the 10:00 a.m. service this Sunday. The vibrantly blowing Holy Spirit has been all around Nativity this week in the experiences of our children and their VBS leaders!

A little over three years ago, the gentle wind of the Spirit blew Father Brad Landry and Elizabeth and their children into our harbor at Nativity to work with us in this vineyard for a while. Now the wind of the Spirit is taking the Landry's to San Antonio. We pray for a gentle and smooth landing for them as they set their sails westward on August 1st. Let's surround them with a large showing of Nativity love this coming Sunday on their last Sunday at Nativity when we honor them with a grand Nativity reception following the 10:00 service. Brad's last official day is Wednesday, July 24 and he officiates at our healing service that day.

Our ministries and life together at Nativity continue to flourish and gain momentum through the power of the Spirit among us. Our stride in ministry is strong and growing. The pastoral care and sacramental needs of our parish call for three full-time priests and I am in the process of discerning the process wherein the Spirit will bring that third priest on board.

Meanwhile, I am excited to let you know that I have worked out an interim solution to keep us moving ahead. Nine years ago, the winds of the Spirit brought Deacon Mary Groff among us to share our ministry. Mary has wonderful and wise pastoral care and organizational gifts that the Spirit has enabled us to draw upon in interim periods between Associate Rector calls in 2006, 2009, and this past November and December.

I am happy to let you know that Mary will again assist us in this interim period with her strong pastoral presence on Tuesdays and Thursdays. She will be making hospital and homebound calls, and helping Rusty McCown coordinate some of our pastoral care lay ministries. She will also provide clergy leadership with our Outreach Ministry. Mary knows the parish well and her caring, friendly approach enables us to maintain our efforts in reaching out in care and concern. She will be available for pastoral care appointments at the church offices as well.

When Mary retired as our Deacon in 2011 (as required by Canon Law) it was just in time to welcome the gifts of our current Deacon, Jeannie Robison. Jeannie is a blessing to Nativity's ministry and our life together. Jeannie will be sharing in the Pastoral Emergency On-Call support and will also be present at some of our Wednesday noon services. We are fortunate, indeed, that the Spirit has brought such capable clergy among us in Brad, Rusty, Jeannie and Mary. I am blessed to share this ministry with the fine people God sends our way for a season. The Spirit indeed is blowing us in the direction God intends us to go!




