



### We Begin Anew

Winding down the summer, August looks toward new beginnings. The school year for our children and their families begins soon. Goodbye sleeping later, afternoon swims, and flexible evenings. Hello car pools, school activities, and homework. Summer, with its change in pace and leisure activities, came as a gift. Many parents are perhaps feeling that the returning school schedule also comes as gift! We may laugh at that thought, but new schedules, new opportunities, new challenges infuse the ordinary routine of our lives with grace.

Although life sometimes feels like a series of starting the same thing over again, each new beginning contains a whole new world for us; a whole new way of knowing ourselves, others, and the creation God charges with grandeur. And so we always begin again, but we always begin anew.

This is not only true for the upcoming fall schedule, but for every day we live. *Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy we have been born anew to a living hope through the resurrection of Christ Jesus from the dead (1<sup>st</sup> Peter 1:3).* The Prayer Book, in the section Daily Devotions for Individuals and Families, encourages us to consider this great thought every morning as we begin our day. We are born anew to new hopes and joys because of our belief in the Resurrection.

We can choose to live into the routine of each day with resurrection possibilities or we can choose otherwise. We can hope to meet Christ in people and events. We can look for the God who changes disappointments and shortcomings into new life by forgiveness and grace. The choice is ours, for us and for our children.

What possibilities will the fall schedule bring for you and your household? How can you bring the possibilities of Resurrection Life into recurring or new activities? Someone once put it well, "We have to make room for God, otherwise life's busyness can squeeze God out."

Our church family begins our new year of activities after Labor Day. But now is the time to begin making room for and committing to God's presence we share in the church. Our choirs for children and adults begin rehearsing in August. Some Bible Studies and Education for Ministry Classes will begin in August, others after Labor Day.

The parish staff is busy making plans for superb Christian Education classes for all ages. Lane Tutt and the Adult Christian Formation group are on fire with creative new options this fall. William Blackerby and the Youth Council are making final plans for a renewed youth ministry with sustainable programming and lay leadership. A planning retreat with parish leaders August 22-24 will reap the fruits of last 12 months renewed focus on our youth ministries. Club 56 (5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grades) and Junior High Youth will convene in the most beautiful space in the whole campus outside of the church and chapel! Elizabeth Foster continues to lead our exciting Children's Ministries with new things happening in the fall as well.

This Sunday, August 11, we welcome the Rev'd Van Foreman to the pulpit. An Alabama native, Father Van recently retired after 31 years of parish ministry in our Diocese. He has served parishes in Decatur, Pell City, Albertville and Gadsden, and was Secretary of the Diocese for many years. Fr. Van is a graduate of Birmingham-Southern College and Yale Divinity School. Before attending seminary at Yale, he pursued graduate studies in theology at Tübingen University in Germany as an International Rotary Foundation Fellow. 


## Dave Ramsey Class



## Stewardship of Creation tip

### **Eat Fresh – Eat Local: Come to the Nativity Local Foods Tasting benefiting the Fresh Food Initiative**

Just what is the **FRESH FOOD INITIATIVE**?

It grew out of discussions among the members of the Food Bank of North Alabama, the City of Huntsville and the Alabama Sustainable Agriculture Network.

“It was clear residents wanted to know more about where and how their food is grown, wanted greater access to fresh, healthy food choices, and wanted to support local north Alabama farmers,” says Kathryn Strickland, who is community food security director of the Food Bank of North Alabama. One of the results of these discussions was the Fresh Food Initiative, which is an organization that seeks to make fresh, healthy food choices accessible to seniors and families who qualify for SNAP benefits (formerly food stamps) and are trying to eat healthfully on a limited budget. The program doubles the value of SNAP benefits up to \$20 when participants purchase foods directly from farmers at participating farmers’ markets. This is a win-win-win for local farmers, the local economy and seniors and families who are trying to eat healthy. The organization is a partnership among Greene Street Market, Food Bank of North Alabama, Huntsville Housing Authority, and the North Alabama Food Policy Council.

**The Greene Street Market at Nativity is hosting its second local foods tasting event to benefit the Fresh Food Initiative.**

**This celebration of local foods and farmers is open to everyone.**

We hope that you will attend this benefit, coming up next Sunday - AUGUST 11 - from 5 - 7 pm in Ridley Hall at Nativity. We hope you will encourage your friends & neighbors to be there, too. Families are welcome. Come taste recipes made with fresh ingredients from North Alabama farmers.

Tickets are \$15 per person and are available at the Greene Street Market or by email from [sbeckgrace@aol.com](mailto:sbeckgrace@aol.com) or by sending a check made payable to GSM at Nativity, to Local Foods Tasting, 415 Randolph Avenue, Huntsville 35801.

In addition to attending the Local Foods Tasting, what else can you do to help support the Fresh Food Initiative and local food producers? Here are some suggestions:

- Make monetary contributions to the Food Bank of North Alabama designated in support of the Fresh Food Initiative.
  - Urge area businesses to support local producers. Kathryn Strickland says, “We encourage residents to ask where their food comes from, in restaurants, or grocery stores.” If local businesses know that consumers are interested in knowing the source of their food, they will be encouraged to buy from local sources.
- After attending the Nativity Local Foods Tasting, host a local foods dinner for family and friends, asking guests to make a contribution to the Fresh Foods Initiative.
