

### **Nativity Serves Good Food!**

People are paying attention to what they are eating these days. Our Greene Street Market at Nativity provides healthy, nutritious vegetables, dairy, and meat products as well as special artisan foods to satisfy and reward. We eat more vegetables (served with a side of *Tutt and Tutt's relish*, of course) so that we can enjoy *Pop Culture*, *Sweet Thangs and Carleton's* goodies! The buzz is all about gluten free or vegetarian and the Zone, which by the way, *What's for Supper* does well. The best restaurants now have a vegetarian option and can make your meal low-carb, even vegan if you are that serious.

And if we are not paying attention to what we are eating, the media certainly is doing that for you by zeroing in on the high caloric and fat content of most fast food choices. The consequences of obesity and poor diet are clear in spite of most fast food establishments offering a few "lite and healthy" options (but who are we kidding....I'll have the apple slices side with my Cheese Whopper!).

We should be concerned about our diets, especially if we want to keep healthy bodies and minds. Again, one of the purposes of our Greene Street Market is to help us do that, and most importantly, help us promote healthy foods to those people whose economic circumstances inhibit healthy choices. A healthy diet is critical to well-being.

In John's Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples who urge him to eat something after a long day's work, "I have food to eat that you do not know about....My food is to do the will of him who sent me..." Jesus offers us food for the soul that sustains and strengthens us spiritually.

Our Bishop Kee Sloan reminds us often that in the Episcopal Church, we serve good food! In the midst of the world's smorgasbord of offerings, we face many options that are not nourishing our souls. How is your spiritual diet? Are you getting the nutrition that will sustain you when life gets tough?

Jesus tells us, *I have food to eat that you do not know about....* Jesus is the bread of life and living water, a never-failing spring that wells up to eternal life. Nativity offers food for our hearts and souls that the world cannot give. Here are some of the things we offer this fall to serve on the table of your lives in addition to our regular worship:
