## Walking with Integrity: The Heart of the Christian Journey

Walking with integrity involves reflection, discernment and evaluation from time to time. All Christians are called to periods of reflection and discernment regarding the integrity of their faith. The Episcopal Church gives priests of the church the invaluable opportunity to explore what it means to live an undivided and whole life, a life that is congruent with one's values, beliefs, and faith—a life that is whole and holy—through participation in the CREDO conference.

CREDO conferences are committed to the work of the heart, body, mind, and the spirit in a learning community with other clergy and professional leaders to offer new tools of inquiry about one's life and work, and new lenses through which to view vocation and relationships. The conference encourages the integration, application, and transformation of knowledge in practice in four major areas of health: spiritual, vocational, financial, and physical. The three-legged stool of Anglicanism of Scripture, Tradition, and Reason reflected upon in our experiences undergirds the work (including time for worship, prayer, and rest).

This week, I am immersed in the sacred space of CREDO at the Duncan Conference Center of the Diocese of Southeast Florida. I am grateful for this time that allows for me to reflect on my relationship with God and God's relationship with me in my life, both professional and personal. I have time to look at where I am now in life and to reflect on the path that has brought me thus far. The conference aims to renew the passions that enliven my relationship with God while refreshing my vocational commitments, relationships, and creativity.

*O God, in whose presence I am made whole; create within me the desire to seek you with all my heart, mind, soul, and strength. Teach me that the external worth of my soul is the gift I am given to tend and steward. When the demands of life interrupt my commitment to nourish my relationship with you, awaken me to the reality of your presence that is as near as my breath. When sadness, trouble, or willfulness keep me from you, grant that I may turn my eyes inward and listen once again to the silent longing that alone will lead me back to you. Keep me tethered to heaven through the power of your love that is boundless, unconditional, and everlasting in Jesus Christ our Savior, who, with you and the Spirit lives now and forever. Amen.*

## Comments from Dave Ramsey regarding Stewardship (from his 'Financial Peace University' series)

*We had a great crowd to view the Dave Ramsey video on stewardship during the Sunday School hour on September 8<sup>th</sup>. If you missed this inspirational presentation on stewardship, here are is a summary of what Mr. Ramsey had to say.*

### WHAT IS OUR RELATIONSHIP TO OUR FINANCIAL RESOURCES?

- Everything belongs to God (The Earth is the Lord's and all that is therein–Psalm 24:1)
- We are merely stewards – MANAGERS – of what God has given us, not owners (Dave Ramsey refers to us as “asset managers for the Lord!”)
- God gives us EVERYTHING we have and only asks for a small portion of it back to do His work!

### WHY GIVE?

- God doesn't need our money (as Dave put it, “if God needs your money, he'll take it and there will be a greasy spot where you were!”)
- We are made in God's image – and God is a GIVER (for He so loved the world that He GAVE his only begotten Son....)
- When we give, we are most God-like

### WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF GIVING?

- The more we give, the more we move from SELFISH to SELFLESS
- When you give, you become the person God meant you to be
- We are happiest when serving and giving (a great side effect of giving!)
- Giving reminds us who the real owner is...God
- Giving is PRAISE and WORSHIP to God

### HOW MUCH SHOULD WE GIVE?

- The Biblical standard is the tithe...10%
- Gross or net? God will take either, but the Bible talks of FIRST FRUITS, which would be off the top!
- Your tithe should go to your local church, the present-day equivalent of the biblical storehouse
- Offerings are above the tithe and are to be given out of surplus and of free will
- Never give with the motive of getting something in return



### STEWARDSHIP OF CREATION TIP

As we begin to see signs of fall around us, and we begin to think about the end of our summer gardens and preparing for cooler weather, we may want to evaluate our tree and shrub plantings. Fall is an excellent time to plant new trees and shrubs. Evaluate your site and do research on the type of trees you might want to have in your landscape in the coming years.

Planting trees is one of the most basic of environmental acts. Planting trees also happens to be a smart economic decision. Studies show that trees increase property values and can significantly reduce heating and cooling costs if placed carefully. They also help to reduce air pollution, improve soil and water quality and shield living areas from noisy neighbors — whether those neighbors are people, school playgrounds or highways. The evidence:

Strategically planted, trees can reduce home energy use by as much as 30%. The Arbor Day Foundation recommends planting deciduous trees on the east and west sides of your home to provide shade in the summer, but allow sunlight through in the winter. Plant evergreen trees to the north and northwest to shield your home from cold winter winds without blocking winter sunlight.

- Trees raise property values for the entire neighborhood; a 2010 Forest Service study estimated that "a neighborhood tree growing along the public right-of-way added an average of \$12,828 to the combined value of all houses within 100 feet."
- In 1985 dollars, the Forest Service estimated the value of an individual tree at \$273 annually — well over \$57,000 over its lifetime. The estimate includes the value of climate control, soil erosion and stormwater management, wildlife shelter and air pollution reduction. Those numbers will be even higher in today's dollars!

Early spring and late fall, when the climate is moderate and trees are dormant, tend to be the easiest times to successfully plant trees. Look for offers of free and low-cost seedlings from local soil and water conservation districts, municipalities and environmental groups. Those little trees will take years to reach maturity, but that's part of the satisfaction; you can watch your investment — in natural beauty and dollars — grow.
