

# Thanks Giving and the Reign of Christ

Before observing Thanksgiving next week, we celebrate the Reign of Christ this Sunday on the Feast of Christ the King. Claiming Christ's reign in our lives, indeed in the world, we recognize Christ's great love for us on the Cross enabling God's presence and power that strengthens our lives. Paul reminds us in his letter to the Colossians that we may then

joyfully give thanks to God for reconciling us to God and to each other through the forgiveness of sins Christ makes possible on the Cross.

For God's people in Christ, our national day of Thanks Giving is rooted in knowing that Christ is all in all....that in Christ all things in heaven and on earth were created, and in him all things are held together. There is a center that holds. At our Thanksgiving Eve service next Wednesday at noon in the Bibb Chapel, we will read from the Letter to James: Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights... In fulfillment of his own purpose he gave us birth by the word of truth {Jesus}, so that we would become a kind of first fruits of his creatures.

The first fruits of creation God gives the world are not our material blessings which we acknowledge on Thanksgiving Day. God's people generously sharing Christ's love and presence with others is what God gives the world first and foremost. God gives us life and purpose in Christ Jesus so we can, in turn, give life to others. In Christ, we are reconciled to God and to each other. And so we are called to continue the work of reconciliation as an expression of our joyful thanks to God. We are called to give as generously as God gives to us. And so we give love, forgiveness, money, talent, hope.

The Reign of Christ and Thanksgiving are intricately connected. Thanksgiving is not simply about the gifts we receive. We give thanks and then we give as God in Christ has given to us. We share what we have received with others. Thanks giving leads to stewardship so that we may be the "first fruits" of God to the world. We cannot observe Thanksgiving without answering the call to be faithful stewards of the gifts we have received.

Our annual Stewardship Campaign for God's Mission in 2014 is seeing a faithful response. Almost 300 of our 850 households have made a pledge. In the past few years, usually around 450 households pledge by the end of the campaign season. Wouldn't it be wonderful if ALL pledged?...if ALL acknowledged the Reign of Christ in their lives? Whether you realize it or not, your live is rich with God's love.

Our national and church observance of Thanksgiving reminds us that God wants us to give our lives away for the sake of the world just as Christ has done. Being mindful of God's call to us to be the first fruits of creation in blessing the world, we make our stewardship gifts for 2014. We give our time and talent. We become reconcilers and peace makers. Be a blessing this Thanksgiving as God is blessing you in Christ! A happy, and especially, a joyful Thanks Giving to all.

### About the OB Doppler Monitor:

The importance of being able to use a Doppler is to verify viability of fetus early in pregnancy and to monitor heart function to assess any early signs of fetal difficulties. This would help them seek more comprehensive care before delivery at a clinic off the mountain. It would also help the midwives prepare and educate the mother as her pregnancy progresses. Over all, the hope is to decrease the mortality rate of our mothers by getting them to more comprehensive care early. The current rate in the Crochu area is somewhere between 30-40%. We would like to have one for mobile clinic use and one for our permanent clinic, Lepswa Timoun. The following is an excerpt from the Huntsville Times article on Karim Shamsi-Basha, author of *Paul and Me*, and leader for the Women's Retreat in February.

Karim Shamsi-Basha spent his childhood in Damascus, Syria, and when he tells that to Christians, they ask if he knew the road to Damascus where the Apostle Paul converted to Christianity.


Shamsi-Basha grew up a Muslim, so for a long time he didn't know what they were talking about. "I would say, 'Yes, we have roads in Damascus.'" Finally, someone told him he should read about Paul in Acts.

"The first time I read the ninth chapter of Acts, I said, 'Whoa! That's where I grew up'", Shamsi-Bashi said. "Syria is throughout the Old Testament, too. Damascus was Damascus before the Bible was the Bible."

Now Shamsi-Basha has written a book about leaving Syria, and about leaving Islam. It's called *Paul and Me: A journey to and from the Damascus Road, from Islam to Christ.* 

"It's a love story," he said. "God loves every person on the planet the same. He doesn't love believers more than nonbelievers. He just cries and watches what we're doing to each other. Why has love taken a backseat to violence? Where did we go wrong?

This is a short foretaste of what is in store for us at the retreat. We think he will be an exciting and inspiring speaker.


### Energy-saving tips to help your budget

As we approach the holiday season and colder weather, both of which raise our electricity use, let's look at some ways we can be better stewards of our resources, both our money and God's gift to us of this beautiful earth. *If we all do something* to lower our energy use, we will lower the demand for energy production in our country.

A simple gadget, a **portable watt meter** costing between \$20-\$45, can help you save money on your energy bills. The gadget will measure how much energy your appliances are using. Many appliances continue to drain energy even when they are turned off – a phenomenon known as "vampire power leaks." it is estimated that *five to ten percent of US home electricity is used powering devices that are turned off or are on standby mode.* Using a watt meter you can find your home's biggest power drains.

In addition to the watt meter, here is a short list of musthave gadgets to help lower your energy bill:

• Programmable Thermostat (\$50-\$150) Heating and cool-



• Stick of incense!! (\$1)Light a stick of incense on a windy day, and hold it around window

frames, doors, and areas where plumbing and wiring go through walls. How much the smoke drifts horizontally reveals how serious the leak is and you can seal any areas that are letting in cold air.



- •Vacuum cleaner hose attachment (about \$7 or less) Use to clean your refrigerator coils at least once a year to keep the fridge running efficiently. The refrigerator is usually the appliance that uses the most energy in a home.
- Powerstrip (\$10 up, depending on features): To combat

vampire energy leaks, plug several appliances into a powerstrip and switch them off when you are not using them.

Some of these gadgets might be good gift ideas for giving Dad instead of yet another tie or pair of socks, or for Aunt Susie, who is hard to buy for, but you know she really cares about the environment and/or is always looking for ways to cut down on her expenses.
