

God's family at the historic Church of the Nativity is joyfully and energetically committed to sharing Christ's love and healing by proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel through worship and service to the world.

### Celebrating 2013: A Year of Faithful Ministry and God's Abundance!

Nativity has reached new levels of faithfulness in our service to Christ through God's mission and ministry we support in our life together at Nativity. We have much to celebrate from this past year as we move ahead into the exciting future God is unfolding for us in 2014. And the main reason is YOUR commitment to your growth as Christ's Body, offering your lives as living and holy and reasonable sacrifices to God. You have walked in love as Christ has walked in love and so much has been given! Recognizing God's blessings of life, you have given generously of your time and talent and resources. Thank you!

First of all, 2013 saw the highest level of financial resources pledged and given to God's mission ever! Our faithful members pledged almost \$1,350,000.with pledge attrition the lowest ever: less than one-half of one percent! This number is historically 5% and has been as high as 7% or 8% in the past. Total financial resources received in 2013 are over \$1,550,000!

Thanks to the Stewardship Ministry's focus (ably led by David Collette) on how our giving impacts our relationship with Christ. God blesses us with so much and so we respond by giving ourselves. Thanks to all who made a pledge and did your best to keep it. Circumstances sometimes prevent us from keeping our pledges, but this year more were able to keep their pledges than ever! We are still counting on others to join our exciting efforts for 2014.

Your response to God's abundance and generosity has led to our having an almost \$100,000 operating surplus over expenses...enabling us fully to meet our Outreach obligations, make significant improvements to our children's and youth space on the second floor of Ridley (have you seen the beautiful Club 56 and Junior High space!), and commit to installing a new sound system in the church. The Vestry of Nativity has been visionary and bold in trusting God's call and God's provision in encouraging these things to take place and be a priority.

This outstanding position we find ourselves in now will enable our meeting the needs of our Capital Reserve so that our historical and beautiful buildings can maintained. We will also be able to do needed renovations in the WoRM and Godly Play rooms in Ridley Hall and update The Loft, our Youth Room, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor Joffrion. Combined with the incredible response we are having to Stewardship for 2014, we will be able to increase the church's outreach efforts and continue to support our growing children's and youth ministries, and much more.

All this is a sign of our expanding faithfulness and giving of our whole selves to Christ and his mission. We have seen so many more people involved in ministry efforts with our children and youth, with outreach, and especially with our wonderful Greene Street Market at Nativity. The Greene Street Market was named Downtown Huntsville's "Event of the Year" in 2013; another reason for us to give thanks and celebrate. This ministry takes a huge commitment of time and talent by our many volunteers led by Marilyn Evans. Its impact is exponential.

2014 will see the installation of our new Church sound system (next week!), the powerful Icons in Transformation exhibit at Nativity, new outreach efforts, and expanded Christian formation opportunities. The Sophye Lowe Young Foundation for Historic Preservation is established as a new vehicle for ongoing support of our historic and treasured buildings.

We heard Paul writing to the Corinthians last week and I echo his words: *I thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus!*

# ICONS in Transformation

# **COMING to NATIVITY February 23 – April 20**

Stunning Display of over 90 pieces of Art

By acclaimed abstract artist

### Ludmila Pawlowska

Church of the Nativity will host **ICONS in Transformation**, a stunning 90-piece traveling art exhibition featuring the contemporary icons of abstract expressionist Ludmila Pawlowska. After touring cathedrals and churches throughout Europe and the U.S., this must-see exhibit will be displayed for two months at Nativity.

Featuring both paintings and sculptures, **ICONS** in **Transformation** presents the mystery and spiritual power of the icon transformed into modern masterpieces of art. The exhibit also includes traditional Russian icons painted at Vassilevsky Monastery (Russia) and highlights them as a source of inspiration for Pawlowska's contemporary art.

The modern three-dimensional artwork incorporates traditional icon elements such as the use of eyes, metallic paints, and the colors red, blue, and gold – while at the same time "bending the rules" through the use of sculpture, collage, large-scale wood panels, natural stone, fabric, and even handwriting in multiple languages.

Pawlowska's work includes 12 very large, two-sided panels that will hang in the arches of the Nave, as well as traditional size pieces that will be dramatically displayed throughout Nativity – locations to include the Bannister Room, the Ambulatory, and Bibb Chapel.


