

God's family at the historic Church of the Nativity is joyfully and energetically committed to sharing Christ's love and healing by proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel through worship and service to the world.

Bethany Village: Where Jesus' Friends Live

Bethany is the home of Jesus' good friends, Lazarus and his sisters, Mary and Martha. This is where Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, showing his tenderness and love as he wept over his dear friend before calling him forth from death to life. It's the place where Jesus spent the night before he made his triumphal entry into Jerusalem. At dinner there, Mary anointed his feet as a gesture of preparation for his death. Jesus retreated to Bethany after confronting the religious authorities when he cleansed the temple. Bethany was a safe, warm, and secure place where Jesus could rest with those he loved.

Everyone needs a place to go to enjoy the company of friends—even Jesus. In the Diocese of Alabama, we are creating such a place—a village where everyone can go and gather as friends of Jesus. Fittingly, we are calling it Bethany Village, and it may be the most ambitious and exciting project our Diocese has taken on in many years. Our Bishop Kee Sloan is sharing his bold vision of Bethany Village with us this week, inviting us to share his faith, enthusiasm and commitment.

Many of us love Camp McDowell. We spent summers there as children and youth. We went to Cursillo as new pilgrims, returning again and again to celebrate the gift of the Fourth Day. We have attended the Folk School or gathered for a conference or journeyed on spiritual retreat, embracing the riches that Camp offers. Our parish family has made Camp McDowell a second home holding our annual Parish Weekend on its sacred grounds. Our vestry meets there on retreat to plan for the future. Many of our children and grandchildren have attended the Environmental Center along with other students in our local schools. Camp McDowell has helped shape the lives of countless children of God, and our parish has been a part of it all.

Everything we love about Camp McDowell will grow through the Bethany Village project. New cabins, new lodges, new meeting spaces, a new dance and music hall, a new lake, a new swimming pool—it will be a whole new camp that does even more of what we have always loved. But the vision is even larger. Bethany Village will make use of "green" technology so that our life together will model more closely what the whole world should be like. It will include a teaching farm that will open opportunities for school children to come and learn about where their food comes from. Perhaps most importantly, every cabin, every sidewalk, every resource, every activity will be designed as accessible to all—especially those who are mobility impaired. Special Sessions Camp will be expanded. *All* of God's children will be able to gather at Bethany Village and enjoy "Wonderful, Wonderful Camp McDowell."

The vision for Bethany Village is compelling, and Nativity cannot afford to let this opportunity go by without our being part. It is time for Jesus' friends at Nativity to step out in faith to support this \$9,000,000 capital campaign—but the benefits to our parish, to the Diocese, and to people from all over is far deeper and richer than a dollar-figure. Yes, it will require all of us giving to make this dream incarnate, but, in doing so, Nativity joins something truly remarkable and enduring. We will help build a place where Jesus' friends come to rest and be renewed, and that is something to celebrate.

Mel Ford, Betty Hornsby, and Chris Whitney are chairing Nativity's campaign. I am grateful to them for their leadership. In the coming weeks, every household at Nativity will be contacted, and we hope that each will take part in the campaign, making a pledge over three to five years. Wouldn't it be great if we could build the Nativity Lodge, raising \$400,000 (which by the way, could be done with 27 people making a \$3000 gift for 5 years)! For generations to come, may we stand alongside those who shared the vision for making Camp McDowell a place where all of Jesus' friends can gather and experience the beauty of God's creation.

Stewardship of Creation tip for February 5th: A note from your Stewardship Ministry

On these cold days, get a head start on spring cleaning. Here is some information about getting rid of 7 Nasty Things that may not be good for you or your family:

Piled-Up Plastic Containers

Containers with recycle codes 3 or 7 may contain BPA, a hormone-disrupting chemical that leaches into food as containers age or get heated in the microwave or dishwasher. Tupperware made before 2010 can also have BPA. Replace with glass or new plastic containers, which do not contain the chemical.

Hazardous Waste

Aerosol cans, batteries, motor oil, antifreeze, paint — they all need to be disposed of properly so they don't contaminate the environment or accidently harm children or pets. Remember, you can take items to the local Household Hazardous Waste Collection Site on the first Saturday of each month from 8:00 a.m. to noon at the Huntsville Landfill, which is at 4100 Leeman Ferry Road, just south of the Leeman Ferry and Johnson Road intersection. Add a reminder on your calendar for a few days ahead so you have time to gather things to take.

Expired or Unused Medications

Toss your old drugs in a safe, legal, eco-friendly way. Do not flush them down the toilet or put them in the trash. Take them to official collection sites on *National Take-Back Initiative Day, April 27*. Check the SMARxTDisposal website on/after April 1st for nearby local collection sites and other approved disposal ideas. On occasion, there are additional local collection events.

Old Spice(s)

Dried-up, decades-old spices won't make you sick, but they won't add flavor to food or impart any nutrients either. The experts at McCormick say: seasoning blends last one to two years, herbs and ground spices, one to three years, and whole spices, up to four years.

Moldy Makeup

Makeup stays safe for only a limited time; after that, bacteria that may cause infection can start to grow — especially in eye makeup. Mascara has the shortest shelf life (two to three months), followed by lip gloss (six months). Replace foundation after six months to a year, at most.

Pathetic Pillows

When was the last time you replaced your pillow? Pillows older than 18 months contain fungi, dead skin and dust mites that can aggravate allergies, asthma and sinusitis. Try this: Fold your pillow in half and squeeze out the air. If it doesn't spring back, it's too old. When you get new pillows, put the date on them with a permanent marker in an inconspicuous place.

Germy Kitchen Sponge

start fresh with a new kitchen sponge. Studies show it's the germiest thing in most American households, with bacteria thriving in the damp crevices, says microbiologist Philip Tierno, Ph.D., of New York University. To cut contamination, microwave your sponge daily in an inch of water for a minute on high heat.
