The Psalmist says to worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness. Episcopalians take this to heart by claiming that beautiful architecture, music, art, flowers, vestments, hangings, and liturgy are means of glorifying God. Our senses are fully engaged and drawn into the beauty of holiness when we gather as God's people at Nativity. The beauty we know through our worship is not only a means of making our praise to God the very best we can possibly offer, beauty draws us close to God, transforming us to reflect God's eternal truth in our own lives. Beauty and art inspire us to a greater and a nobler plane of living.

Stewardship of Creation Tip Plant a Tree!

First proclaimed in 1887 by Alabama Governor Thomas Seay, in 1975, the Alabama State Legislature passed an act designating the last full week in February as **Arbor Week**.

Trees provide beauty, give us a sense of history and well-being, make our communities more livable, help connect us to nature, provide habitat for wildlife, and shade our homes, helping us save money on utility bills. A single tree will absorb nearly a ton of carbon dioxide over its lifetime. Trees also filter air, decreasing health risks caused by pollution.

The best times to plant in Alabama, especially for balled and burlapped or bare root trees, are fall and winter.

Have a soil analysis done. It's only \$7. Find soil testing information at your county Extension office or visit the Auburn University Soil Testing Lab website at www.aces.edu/anr/soillab.

Before digging, always call 811 to locate water and utility lines.

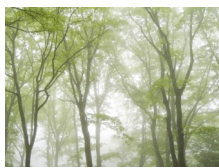
Plant trees in **large, wide holes rather than in narrow, deep ones. Do not dig the hole deeper than the root ball of the tree being planted.**

Mix any soil amendments, such as organic matter, topsoil, or lime, *into the entire planting area.*

When your hole is dug, spread the root system out laterally. Cut circling roots that could grow around and girdle the tree trunk in the future.

Watering is critically important. When a tree is first planted, add water slowly every day or two at a rate of about 2 gallons per inch of trunk diameter. After a few weeks, decrease the frequency but increase the volume and expand it to a wider area to encourage wide-spreading roots. You may need to water for six months or even a year, depending on the size of the tree and the time of year you plant.

Inspire your friends, family and children to appreciate trees - in your own yard and neighborhood, and your community's trees. What you pass on to others will last a lifetime.

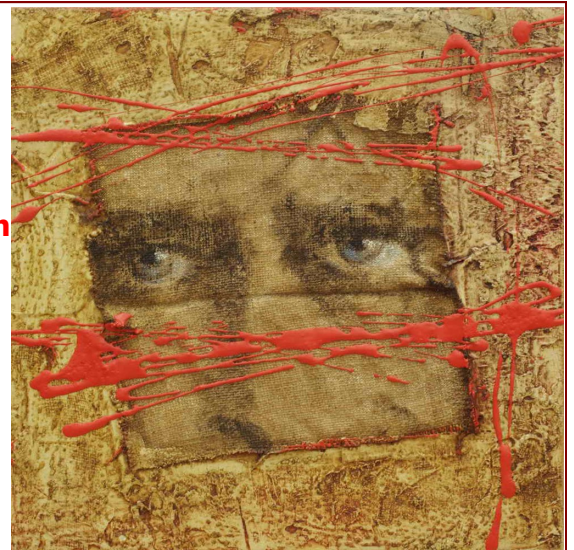
