God's family at the historic Church of the Nativity is joyfully and energetically committed to sharing Christ's love and healing by proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel through worship and service to the world.

#### RenewalWorks: Taking the Next Step of Spiritual Growth

What would it mean for you to take the next step along the journey of spiritual growth? What tools do you need to grow closer to Jesus, to know him and to know the ways and purposes of God's Kingdom Jesus proclaimed in his life, death and resurrection? Our individual and community spiritual growth is a priority in the church...it gets down to the basics of increasing our love of God so we can increase our love of neighbor.

Before we were called Christians, members of the early church were described as people of the way. They were on the move. Because their life in community was so dynamic and was so clearly marked by love of God and neighbor, these first Christians transformed the world around them. In the Acts of the Apostles, we read that the church grew as outsiders witnessed the ways that Christians lived in community. People said: "See how they love one another. I want to be part of something like that." As Christians grew and changed, the world was transformed in remarkable ways.

It's all about movement and growth. As St. Paul guided the first Christian communities, he spoke of those who grow in maturity in Christ, some only able to digest the basics, others able to chew on meatier stuff. He had in mind the vision of a spiritual progression, a spiritual continuum. The letter to the Ephesians describes the Christian community as the body of Christ, growing, dynamic, changing, evolving, building itself up in love.

Growth, change and movement are part of the Christian story from day one. For Episcopalians, sometimes jokingly described as the frozen chosen, there is a call to spiritual growth reflected in *The Book of Common Prayer*. It is captured in the baptismal service, as sponsors for young candidates pledge to help a child grow into the full stature of

Christ. That's not a bad aspiration for all of us.

Your Vestry and I have enthusiastically endorsed a way for us to engage spiritual growth as a parish, **RenewalWorks**. On Thursday, we are mailing a letter to every household inviting you to participate in what I believe is the most important work we are undertaking as God's people in my almost 12 years as serving as Rector of our vibrant parish.

The purpose of *RenewalWorks* to foster spiritual growth and discernment by providing an opportunity for all parishioners to reflect on the extent to which the church inspires and supports them in their spiritual journeys by taking an anonymous, on-line Spiritual Life Survey. A leadership team of 25 parishioners will spend time over the next three months reviewing the background of this monumental work and developing guidelines about where we need to go to challenge us to grow spiritually through worship, Bible reading and study, personal prayer, and service to people in need.

I often ask that people give to God's work through our parish in a variety of ways. Before our Stewardship Campaign asking for a return of your financial blessings, your Vestry and I ask that you give about 30 minutes of your time in the next 3 weeks to take this survey. At Nativity, we welcome you wherever you are on your spiritual journey...whether you are exploring, experiencing some growth, deepening your walk with Christ, or completely centered, let's all commit to taking the next step!
