Lent's Clarity

Today on Ash Wednesday the world is cold and gray as Lent begins. Although our word for Lent comes from an Old English word that means lengthening, as in the lengthening of days pointing to spring, today it is snowing. It's winter out there and definitely not spring! The trees are bare of leaves, revealing the basic forms of their structure. We come to church on Ash Wednesday and discover a similar barrenness inside in this beautiful and holy place stripped of brass and flower and flourishes, pointing to God's truth behind the symbols.

With ashes placed upon our foreheads, our lives, too, are stripped bare, reminding us of the stark reality of our mortality. Today we encounter death and dust. In facing our mortality, just as anyone who has had a close scrape with death knows, we can breathe more deeply and claim life more fully. Once a year, the church gives us all the opportunity to look at death straight on and choose life.

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." I am finite and fragile, a creature who has been given these few short years to live. I have been given this time now, before I return to the dust, to be who I have been given to be by God.

The gray and cold days of winter encourage me to be more alive when the skies are blue and the sun is warm. I can see further through the winter landscape, seeing the real structure of the strength of the trees that offer shade when they are fully leafed. Ash Wednesday enables me to see who God has created me to be in spite of my efforts to cover up the truth that life comes from God alone.

The Lenten landscape is full of confession and repentance because we have failed to live the lives God hopes we will live; we have failed to commend the faith and life that is deep within us. Something mysterious and life-giving happens as we strip away the things that get in the way of God's life leafing forth from us.

Our prayers of confession are our acknowledgment that we are made for better lives deeper, truer, wiser—than we are living. The first thing the doctor asks when we arrive for an appointment is, "Where does it hurt?" The first step to health is naming the pain. Our confessions allow us to take off the mask of our coping so well, and to name, within the silence and great loving Mystery of God, where our lives are caught, or hurting, or hurting others. Our confessions acknowledge that there is One who cares and forgives, and who is always giving us more life and joy.

Lent calls us to fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. In our fasting and sacrifices, we are stripping away things that we have found pleasure and comfort in so that we may, in the emptiness of the space provided, learn to trust God alone. We can make room for the life that God alone wants us to have and share.

I love the winter landscape and I have grown to love the Lenten landscape. Stripped bare, God is able to breathe new life into this dust that I am, so that I may leaf forth with God's life and love for this world. And one day, I won't simply return to the dust, I will return to the One who created me, redeemed me in Christ, and has sanctified me to share fully in that life forever. A good and holy Lent to all.

RENEWALWORKS

A letter from the survey presentation team:

As you know, our parish participated in the RenewalWorks spiritual life survey last September, and a Workshop team was put together to review the survey results in combination with the RenewalWorks material. This was done in the idea that "spiritual growth becomes a matter of taking the steps needed to deepen relationship with God, with neighbor, with the world and with ourselves." A RenewalWorks team of 21 parishioners, plus your clergy, participated in 4 workshops conducted during September, October & November. We spent over 12 hours together in these workshops, producing the results we put into the Vestry report (and which the Vestry endorsed).

The final report to the Vestry from the RenewalWorks workshop team, the survey results, a document entitled "Footsteps," and an introduction written by Brian Taylor (for a book entitled "Strength for the Journey, A Guide to Spiritual Practice") are all links contained within this site for you to access and review. In an effort to help guide you through the overwhelming amount of data, we'd like to suggest a less complicated approach to understanding the data.

Initially, we recommend that you start with the Report to the Vestry. That gives you a good summary of what happened in each of the workshops, as well as a summary of the recommendations and the highlights from the survey. This should give you a good framework from which to approach the rest of the data.

Next, you might read the "Footsteps" document, which sets forth the framework within which we worked during this process. It is about 21 pages, but it gives good insight. In addition, the article written by Brian Taylor gives great insight into the words "spiritual practice" and what it means, and what it doesn't mean.

Finally, with this background data in mind, review the Data Pack from RenewalWorks (Nativity's survey results). Reviewing this last might seem odd, but we believe it will make more sense to you after having read the other documents first.

We will hold at least two informational sessions about the data & the process we followed. Anyone who would like to hear more or ask questions is encouraged to attend. The first, with lunch, is set for 12:15pm on Sunday, March 8. The second will be during Sunday School on Sunday, March 15. More information on both will be posted in the Steeple and Nativity Notes.

We thank you for your interest thus far, and look forward to sharing these new opportunities for spiritual growth within our parish.


The process of spiritual conversation and prayer is for anyone who feels a longing for a more peaceful and

STEWARDHIP OF CREATION

"THE EARTH IS THE LORD'S, AND THE FULLNESS THEREOF" PSALM 2:1

Many faith communities and groups are taking a look at the issues of climate change and global warming. Recently, Interfaith Power and Light, headed by Episcopal priest The Rev. Canon Sally Bingham, organized a "synchronized Climate Prayer event" to draw attention to the issues, during which people all over the country joined in prayer at a designated hour, praying for the health of our planet. There also were other activities, including a "National Preach-In on Global Warming" and a postcard campaign. See the IPL website

The IPL mission statement is: The mission of Interfaith Power & Light is to be faithful stewards of Creation by responding to global warming through the promotion of energy conservation, energy efficiency, and renewable energy. This campaign intends to protect the earth's ecosystems, safeguard the health of all Creation, and ensure sufficient, sustainable energy for all.

The National Association of Evangelicals has also engaged in the issues of climate change and in an excerpt from a larger document on civic responsibility, issued the following statement:

As we embrace our responsibility to care for God's earth, we reaffirm the important truth that we worship only the Creator and not the creation. God gave the care of his earth and its species to our first parents. That responsibility has passed into our hands. We affirm that God-given dominion is a sacred responsibility to steward the earth and not a license to abuse the creation of which we are a part. We are not the owners of creation, but its stewards, summoned by God to "watch over and care for it" (Gen. 2:15). This implies the principle of sustainability: our uses of the Earth must be designed to conserve and renew the Earth rather than to deplete or destroy it.

The Bible teaches us that God is not only redeeming his people, but is also restoring the whole creation (Rom. 8:18-23). Just as we show our love for the Savior by reaching out to the lost, we believe that we show our love for the Creator by caring for his creation.

Because clean air, pure water, and adequate resources are crucial to public health and civic order, government has an obligation to protect its citizens from the effects of environmental degradation. This involves the urgent need to relieve human suffering caused by bad environmental practice. Because natural systems are extremely complex, human actions can have unexpected side effects. We must therefore approach our stewardship of creation with humility and caution.

Human beings have responsibility for creation in a variety of ways. We urge Christians to shape their personal lives in creation-friendly ways: practicing effective recycling, conserving resources, and experiencing the joy of contact with nature. We urge government to encourage fuel efficiency, reduce pollution, encourage sustainable use of natural resources, and provide for the proper care of wildlife and their natural habitats.

Here at Nativity, Harvey Cotten is teaching a Sunday School Class: "How Christians are Cultivating a Middle Ground

on Climate Change" where we study the issues around climate change and global warming. Many scientists and concerned lay people believe we are at a critical juncture, resulting from the influence of human beings on nature. Others believe that the changes happening now are part of a natural, cyclical pattern. Each week we will try to separate fact from fiction and quiet the intense noise surrounding this issue.
