

God's family at the historic Church of the Nativity is joyfully and energetically committed to sharing Christ's love and healing by proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel through worship and service to the world.

## Ensuring Nativity's Legacy: On Making a Will and Supporting Nativity

Thank you! There are some things in life, and in the church, that we often assume we don't need to say. They should be obvious, either from common sense, or from custom and courtesy themselves. Saying "thank you" is one of the things we can't say enough.

Another of these obvious and customary statements has to do with making a will, regardless of the size of your estate. We will all die, and one of the most considerate things we can do for our successors is to leave a will.

It is noteworthy that the Episcopal Book of Common Prayer includes a specific direction in this regard: "The Minister of the Congregation is directed to instruct the people, from time to time, about the duty of Christian parents to make prudent provision for the well-being of their families, and of all persons to make wills, while they are in health, arranging for the disposal of their temporal good, not neglecting, if they are able, to leave bequests for religious and charitable uses." (BCP p. 445)

So, the church calls me to instruct: Make a will!

But the second item in the church's instruction is worth repeating: *Please do leave bequests for religious uses, and especially for this community, the Church of the Nativity.* The church where you have been baptized and married, the church where you have been nurtured and challenged, the church where your children have been raised, the church where you have honored the holy, the church where you may have your funeral, does not serve in all these ways without you contributing financial gifts.

The Church of the Nativity is able to serve with grace and hospitality because so many of you contribute annually to our mission. Thank you! You get it. God is counting upon a faithful and generous community of people to enable the Kingdom to grow!

But every year, although we always have enough to do what we've been doing well, there is rarely anything left over for new efforts. Although we are now regularly funding capital reserves in our annual budget, we cannot fund all the reserve needs these beautiful and complex historic buildings require without sacrificing ongoing ministries.

Planned gifts through your will can help support these critical needs beyond annual stewardship efforts by offering endowment and trust funds. We are launching *Ensuring Nativity's Legacy* in order to let you know that there are two programs you can make planned gifts and other gifts to in order to ensure Nativity's vital future. The **Nativity Trust** established in 1998 enables funding for new, creative ministries reaching out to the wider community that can't be supported by annual funds (75% of the income distributions) and some funding for capital needs (25 %).

Restoring the Church through our 2007 capital campaign, we realized that the treasures of our historic buildings must be proactively maintained and that corners could not be cut. In 2014, the **Nativity Historic Preservation Foundation** was established to ensure that we could build appropriate funds for historic preservation needs.

We plan for our children's future needs by the inheritance we leave them. You can assist Nativity's future children's needs in the same way! A letter and brochure are being mailed to your home further explaining how you can participate. The next two *Steeples* will highlight each fund.

As you enjoy God's blessings through Nativity and in so many other ways every day, may your gratitude for these good gifts inspire you to do the same for others through *Ensuring Nativity's Legacy*. Please pray for how God is calling you to help expand the Kingdom's impact and growth through Nativity's mission and ministries. I am grateful for Nativity's visionary leadership and for your generosity. Thank you!



This concert includes the Nativity choir, and additionally singers who are travelling to England to sing services in Cathedrals.


