Nativity's Stewardship Ministry



The Feast of All Saints John 11:32-44

When Jesus found out that his friend Lazarus was dead, he started his journey toward "unbinding" him. Jesus had been teaching and showing his followers the abundance of living in God's realm. God gives life, not takes it. God releases resources, not buries them. God expects us to circulate and "flow" our gifts, not bind and restrict them. Perhaps Jesus was "greatly disturbed in spirit" because of the way the people around him resisted his movement toward showing God's abundance. First they declared Lazarus dead and buried him; there was no hope and there was nothing anyone could do. Then they blamed Jesus for his death: "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus insisted that they take away the stone, they complained: "Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead four days."

How often do we use the same techniques to resist giving and releasing our resources? We might say: How can we give when we are still grieving our loss. We blame it on the bad economy. Some of us blame God for not doing something to turn our economy around. In fear of losing more, we lock up our resources. And yet, we complain that it might smell really bad if we open it since we instinctively know that by stopping the flow of resources, they will decay and turn rotten. Resources are like water: When it doesn't flow, it turns rotten and smells and becomes opportunities for destructive things to grow.

Jesus finally confronts us by naming the heart of the issue: "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?"

Do you believe in God the giver? Do you believe in the abundance that Jesus had shown us? Do you believe in the resurrection? When we believe in the abundance of God, we can have the courage to open and unbind our resources. In doing so, we join Jesus, with all the saints in the past and in the future, in becoming the extension of God the Giver causing resources to flow and rejuvenate our lives, communities and creation.

Why does the Church bell ring 37 times on Sunday Morning?



37 is a weird number and has little symbolic meaning. When the bell rings on Sunday morning, or Thursday afternoon at 4:00pm, or at any other time it is programmed to ring, it rings for exactly one minute. The bell clock computer is set up so the bell can be programmed minute-by-minute. if we wanted to ring the bell for five minutes, then we program the computer to ring for five consecutive "one-minute" rings. It is a great capability of our bell clock computer to respond to the needs of the community.

So why 37 times in one minute? Well, here is the story.

The bell striker is designed so Huntsville hears the ringing as it was in 1866. The bell used to be rung by people pulling on a rope. That gives a "loud - soft" bell ring. The ringer used to pull hard on the rope (the "loud" ring), and then let the bell swing back and let the clapper ring the bell (the "soft" ring). Nativity's computer was programmed to slam the hammer on the bell with a "hard" strike and then a "soft" strike, in an approximate tim-

ing like a bell ringer pulling on a rope. People in Huntsville, whether they realize it or not, are hearing the Nativity bell ring just like it did in 1866. That sequence of 37 rings takes one minute.

Stewardship of Creation

"Good reasons to avoid bottled water": PART 2

Yes, it's expensive, wasteful and – contrary to popular belief – usually not any healthier for you than tap water – and more:

It seems innocent enough, buying and drinking bottled water – right? Unfortunately, bottled water is wreaking havoc on Earth's precious resources. Plus, in most cases it's almost definitely not safer or cleaner than tap water; and in some cases it's worse.

Some information about the bottled water habit:

- The world drinks over \$100 billion worth of bottled water each year; that's roughly 50 billion bottles.
- The U.S. consumes 30 billion of those bottles each year; that's 1,500 bottles of water per second.
- Even though the U.S. has some of the safest tap water in the world, it has the largest market for bottled water. Here's that "just for my convenience" thing!
- Bottled water costs 300 to2,000 times more than tap water.

Tap water costs, on average, \$0.002 per gallon

An interesting fact to think about: If you used bottled water for all of the water around the house (showers, dishwashing, watering plants, etc.), your monthly water bill would be about \$9,000.

Environmental Impacts

- 17 million barrels of oil are used in the production of disposable water bottles each year. That's enough to fuel 1 million cars for an entire year!!
- It takes more than 50 million barrels of oil each year to pump, process, transport, and refrigerate bottled water.
- It takes 40,000 18-wheelers to deliver our bottled water each week.
- It takes three times the amount of water to produce a bottle as it does to fill it.
- Producing bottled water requires up to 2,000 times the energy cost of producing tap water.
- More than 80% of water bottles end up in landfills.
 Some get recycled; the rest end up as litter on roadsides and in waterways!
- Averaged out, every square mile of the ocean has more than 46,000 pieces of plastic in it.
- Some bottlers extract the water used in bottling from springs and aquifers, which can dry up wells, deplete wetlands and drain rivers.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- Buy BPA-free reusable water bottles for yourself and all members of your family. Carry them everywhere you go. Filling up is basically FREE!
- Give reusable water bottles as gifts to family and friends for birthdays, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Christmas, etc.!!
- Take a stand. Contact your reps in Congress, the FDA, and our governor and ask them to maintain high standards for municipal water systems.

THE BEST LONG-TERM SOLUTION IS TO MAKE TAP WATER SAFE FOR EVERYONE.
