Our Mission

God's family at the historic Church of the Nativity is joyfully and energetically committed to sharing Christ's love and healing by proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel through worship and service to the world.

Resurrection Community

During the Great Fifty Days of Easter, we pick up the Gospel writer Luke's continuing story of the Resurrection by reading from the Acts of the Apostles on Sundays. Jesus' fearful, downtrodden and selfish followers were empowered by God's presence in the Risen Christ among them through the Holy Spirit to be a community of love and transformation.

Luke-Acts captures their energy and faith in chapter 2:42-47: They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Awe came upon everyone.... All who believed were together and ...would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any who had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

People long to be a part of something this purposeful. In this fractured and hurting world we deeply desire an enduring spirituality that connects with our whole life. The Church fulfills this longing as we daily commit together to be the resurrection community.

The very nature of our life together and the church's teaching point to this goal: the communion of saints, a shared life in one family, inclusion in the Trinitarian relationship of love we know from God, and indeed the very "Reign of God," what Jesus called the Kingdom of God which is now and is always coming. The community of the Church revealed in Acts is a resurrection community that nurtures and supports us on this journey.

Nativity is a vital part of Christ's resurrection community as we come together for worship and fellowship, and as we learn (together) from our Bible Studies, Church School Classes, EFM and other formation opportunities. We are a resurrection community as we gladly and generously share God's love among us and with those God calls us to serve in Huntsville and the world, giving not only our financial resources to God's mission through the church but our time and our very selves to blessing others as God blesses us. We are a resurrection community as we pray together in many ways that connect us to God's abiding presence.

At the Church of the Nativity, we follow the lead of those first Christians. Wonderful, transformative, life-giving things are happening that bring life and love, hope and healing. The Easter Day proclamation from Paul's letter to the Colossians begins, "Since you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above..." A friend of mine once paraphrased these lines into one of the shortest Easter homilies known: "Since you have been raised with Christ, act like it!"

Look around and you will see that many people at Nativity are acting like Christ is raised. They are seeking the things of God's Kingdom and reign. If you haven't already, won't you join us? Join a class or prayer group on Sundays or mid-week. Be a part of one of our many transformative ministries. Give generously and gladly and you will see for yourself.

And this resurrection community cannot be contained within the walls of Nativty. We have much to celebrate. Join us at our last Family Spaghetti Supper on April 27 and celebrate the many ways we know and share God's love among us and out in the wider community. We've got a story to tell because we are the resurrection community! Be thinking about and prepared to tell others about what you've discovered. **Nativity is...**



CELEBRATING OUR NEW COMPANION DIOCESE RELATIONSHIP WITH THE VIRGIN ISLANDS

The Rev'd Gregory Gibson, Priest-in-Charge at St. John's Episcopal Church on St Croix will be our guest preacher Sunday, May 1. Father Gibson is originally from Barbados and was in seminary with Bishop Marray! He joins seven other priests and the Bishop of the Virgin Islands who will be visiting other parishes in our diocese.

Our new Companion Relationship with our Diocese of Alabama and the Virgin Islands (and also Alaska) is based on a mutual covenant of shared ministry, shared worship, shared mission, a relationship of give and take, of mutuality, where we hope to learn from each other and deepen our bonds of friendship to grow God's kingdom. The general areas of relationship for 2016 are Clergy/Lay Leadership Development/Exchange, Youth Engagement (their youth are coming to Summer Camp and will be counselors at

Sawyerville and we hope Foothills Day Camp), Spiritual Formation and Deepening with a focus on Cursillo (they will send pilgrims and staff to our fall Cursillos). As we deepen our relationship, there are opportunities for parish-to-parish relationships and involvement of other diocesan groups such as the Episcopal Church Women (ECW) and the Daughters of the King (DOK).


