KEEP ON GIVING!

The point of this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you can share abundantly in every good work. – (2 Corinthians 9:6-8)

It's vital that we continue to give during an economic downturn, and not only because of our faith communities and charities depend on our giving. We give because we need to give. The Holy Spirit is continually at work, shaping and growing our hearts, leading us to reflect the generosity of God's nature, as well as the depths of God's self-giving nature made known in Jesus. As we give, we experience the deeper joy of growing into the full stature of Christ.

One advantage of thinking about our giving in terms of giving away a percentage of our income is that it helps us adjust our giving as our income goes up or down. When we have less money coming in, we can give less, but do so knowing that our relative generosity is unchanged.

<u>Action</u>: Review your giving, setting it in the context of your income. Do you know what percentage of your income you give back?

<u>Pause for Reflection</u>: The passage above challenges us to give cheerfully. One way of increasing the joy found from giving is to become deeply aware of how your purpose is aligned with God's purpose of *shalom*, which is the Biblical understanding of peace that comes from living in right relationship with each other and all creation. Understanding your purpose leads to joyful giving.

Words from the Senior Warden

May 15, 2016, Vestry meeting had a very busy agenda with Allison Bodan, Treasurer, walking the Vestry through a review of the Treasurer's report and how the State Dioceses' Fast Fund bookkeeping account works. The Vestry was asking questions about the report in the April meeting, and we needed Allison to inform us about how the different accounting categories in Fast Fund are set-up. This was a very informative session.

The Vestry is reading and studying the book of "5 Keys For Church Leaders"; we are on key 3, which focuses on building new membership. New membership is a big goal for St. Luke's!! Vestry Members, Father Doug, JoAnn Pearson/Sr. Warden and Dale Anderson/Jr. Warden are working on a grant, through the Foundation for the Episcopal Diocese of Wyoming. Our goal for this grant is to increase our membership. This grant will pay 2/3 of the cost to beautify the exterior condition of our church. 1. Refinish and weather seal the church front doors and Onderdonk Hall front doors 2. Scrape, seal and repaint front outside of church entrance 3. Repair the rock wall along the sidewalk in front of Jubilee Hall. We all appreciate and draw a positive conclusion about our church, if it is well maintained!! Seekers of a new church often draw their conclusion within 5 minutes of their first visit. This grant will be submitted in June for the July 1, 2016 deadline.

We have been blessed with lovely rains! St. Luke's landscape looks so green and well trimmed after Dale Anderson got the tree trimmers to work on many of the trees and bushes (money used from the Doyle Kincaid donation). Father Doug and his daughters did some leaf raking and trimmed several small bushes also! It takes a church family to make a church run well!!


THANK YOU, ECW!


