## **Radical Hospitality**

Like many of you, one of my favorite things to do is to walk around the Greene Street Market on a nice Thursday evening. The sights, sounds, and smells have become part of the downtown experience. Since I'm usually wearing my clerical collar, there are times when I get an odd glance as I'm sure I stick out in the casual throngs of people. There are also times when someone from the community wants to engage in a conversation about the church. I gladly do this wanting to remind them that GSM is part of the church.

One of these conversations still resonates with me. It occurred a couple of years ago with a local citizen. He was telling me how much he enjoyed the market and how he appreciated that we sponsored it. The discussion then turned to the beauty of our church. What I recall was his comment, "I love your church, but I hate your fence." He saw the fence as a way to block out people from coming in.

Now I'm not in the position to say whether we should have a fence, but his opinion says something. As a cradle member of Nativity, I have not thought much about the fence except that it is part of our beautiful grounds. But what can seem beautiful to some may be an ugly hurdle to others.

Episcopalians, especially those in historical churches, are often met with this challenge of honoring the past while looking towards the future. This is where we have the opportunity to expand our vision of hospitality. And in some ways, we must be radical in our thinking.

Radical hospitality, while not necessarily a new concept, is a new approach to sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It is a model of transformation that speaks to the ever-changing need for spiritual renewal. In his book, *Serving with Power*, Kortright Davis wrote,

"...this requires of us a persistent openness to the leading and urgings of God's good Spirit. These urgings often take us down the paths of a new and surprising spirituality as we discern fresh ways of expressing the age-old faith once delivered to the saints."

Over the past year or so, we have been looking at ways to be more inviting. Nativity and the Episcopal Church have a great story to tell. It's simply a matter of bringing people to the church to hear it, see it, and live it.

You may have noticed we recently began giving tours of the church during the Greene Street Market. This is another way to welcome people into the church that is open and inviting. This is just one example of ways we are thinking "outside the box" when it comes to hospitality.

What ways are you bringing someone to Christ? Be radical. Let your love for God show in the hospitality that you show others. Let's demonstrate that the church is more than wrought iron fences and large doors and tall steeples. The church is a haven for everyone looking for their spiritual home. Let's radically welcome everyone to Nativity, showing what being a true follower of Jesus Christ is all about.




