My Stewardship Story - Lee Hicklen

My introduction to Outreach at Nativity came at our Ministry Fair in 2006. Rev. Mary Anne Akin pulled me aside and introduced me to Gayla Kidd from the Huntsville Assistance Program (HAP). After our "conversation," Mary Anne asked me to be the Alternate HAP representative and to drive Ruth Anne Haymes to the monthly board meetings. When I agreed, she then replied, "GREAT, you are also now a member of the Outreach Committee!"

Now, 10 years later, I can say, without hesitation, that getting involved in Outreach at Nativity has been the most rewarding thing I have ever done. And, we have come a long way in 10 years. From a committee that met 2-3 times a year to write checks, we are now a finely-tuned organization that tracks every dollar spent and schedules disbursements throughout the year.

We begin every meeting with a reading from Matthew 25 that concludes with the well-known quote "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Your pledge response every year, is what allows Outreach at Nativity to happen. Your Vestry has worked diligently over the past several years to meet their commitment to fund Outreach at 10% of Pledge and Plate. And, it is you, the members of the Parish who determine our Outreach Budget each year. We are only limited by the extent of your generosity.

Jesus tells us in Matthew 26:11, "You will always have the poor among you." And James tells us in Chapter 1, Verse 27, "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress..." We ARE the hands and feet of Christ on the earth. We absolutely need your pledge dollars, but we also need your time and talent. I challenge you this year, as you prayerfully consider your financial commitment for 2017, to also consider making a commitment to use your time and talent to support one of the MANY Outreach Ministries. From a Meals on Wheels delivery one day a month or stopping by the Oscar Mason Library to help a child with their homework occasionally, I promise you; you won't regret it!

The Outreach Committee meets the first Tuesday of every month at 5:30pm in the Banister Room. We would be thrilled to have you join us to learn more about how you can help share the Good News of The Gospel with those who are not as fortunate as we.

You must be a confirmed Episcopalian and at least 16 years of age to serve as a Chalice Bearer. If you are interested, please contact Connie in the church office.

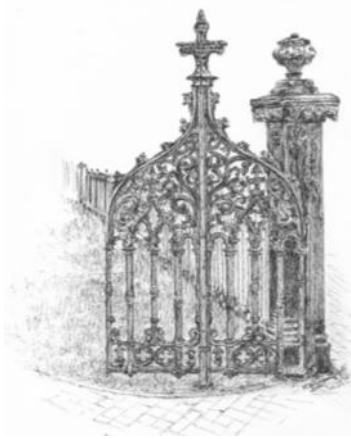

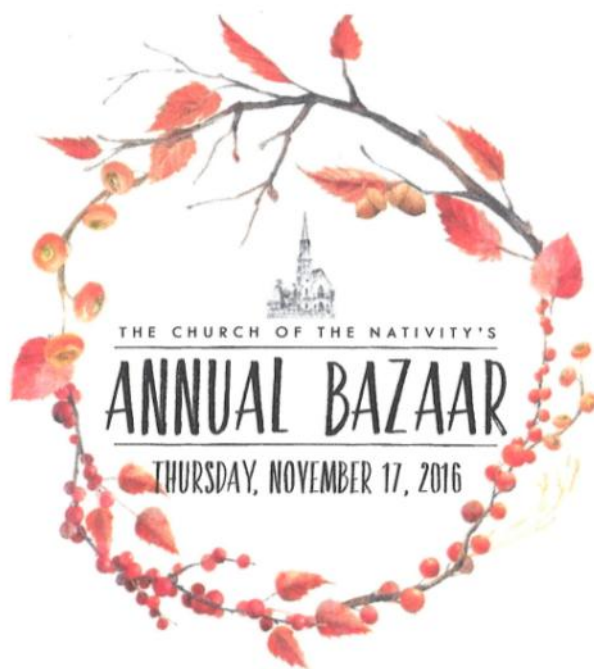



STEWARDSHIP OF CREATION

As we think about stewardship in our lives, here are words to help us think why stewardship of God's creation is important and how we can make it a daily focus of our intentions and actions:

Covenant for Stewardship of Creation

I believe that God made and loves the universe with all its marvelous order and the infinite complexities of living creatures.

I believe that God has given humanity the gift and responsibility of serving as stewards of creation.

I believe that our diocese encompasses a fragile ecosystem of surpassing beauty with an unusually rich diversity of plant, animal and aquatic life.

Therefore, from this day forward, I will strive to be a good steward of creation.

I will educate myself, my family, friends, and neighbors, those with whom I work, and the members of my parish.

I will advocate for wise and just environmental policy; I will provide and engage in opportunities for service in the stewardship of earth.

This is my solemn covenant.



And here is a practical action to help you put this covenant into practice...

It's that time of year again when our lawns are being covered with leaves. Instead of bagging those leaves down by the street for the city trucks to pick up and haul off, save tax dollars and fossil fuel by COMPOSTING them.

Harvey Cotten offers this idea: place the leaves in a compost bin and create a wonderful garden product, what Harvey calls "Black Gold!" Here's how: he suggests using the lawnmower, with the blades raised to the highest setting, to cut all the leaves into smaller bits. Then rake them up and put in a simple compost bin made of welded-wire fencing (12 feet long by 4 feet tall) joined with cable ties to make a cylinder. Mix in some grass or vegetable scraps and you are well on your way to making compost.

Add some garden soil for the micro-organisms and turn periodically to provide oxygen and by next spring you will have a wonderful batch of compost, "Black Gold!"

You can feel good about these benefits of recycling leaves:

- Reduces waste going into landfills
- Encourages improvement of soil through natural processes
- Reduces need for fertilizer, which saves money, and also reduces the environmental impact of commercial fertilizer use

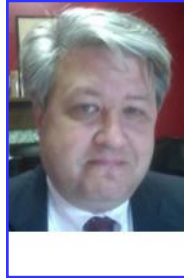
