God's family at the historic Church of the Nativity is joyfully and energetically committed to sharing Christ's love and healing by proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel through worship and service to the world.

Living in the Green in 2017!

We find ourselves living in the green of this season of the Church Year after Epiphany. Green is the color of the hangings and vestments as we gather as God's people on Sundays. This season after the extraordinary and special foci of the Incarnation cycle of Advent and Christmastide, and before the Passion cycle beginning with Ash Wednesday through Lent, Eastertide and up to Pentecost, is a period of stable, steadfast growth in God's love and service.

This is what we call Ordinary Time. Most of the church year is in Ordinary Time remembering that the long season after the concluding Great Fifty Days of Easter (Pentecost) stretches across the summer and into late fall until Advent begins. We live most of our spiritual life in ordinary time, in the green.

This Green Season after Epiphany is at the beginning of a new year. In January life is new. Two Sundays ago, we celebrated Baptisms, and at the edge of the Font, life is new. Every Sunday, when bread and wine are offered, blessed, broken, and shared at the altar, life is new. God's strong message we hear from Isaiah in the Morning Prayer readings this time of year is, "I am about to do a new thing, now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? [Isaiah 43:19] God brings new life, now, as we live in the green.

This is not a time of sitting back, but of intentional growth. We listen to God deeply and notice where God is at work and doing a new thing. We listen to each other and to what God is saying in and through others we share the journey. We pay attention to our relationship with God and what God is calling us to do, even in the midst of great challenges in the culture around us. Living in the green calls for pruning and clearing out old growth to make room for the new. It is a time to plant and fertilize and nurture the growth we know God is always giving.

In our other readings this time of year we hear from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians on Sundays. Paul begins with these words: I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus! Paul reminds the Corinthians and us, that since we are in Christ and Christ's body, God is blessing us TOGETHER with every spiritual blessing and gift. The community faces divisions as any community does, but Paul encourages them and us to recognize that we are one in Christ Jesus through his Cross of reconciliation. It takes everyone sharing their gifts. That greatest gift is, of course, love.

We are usually energized by the new and extraordinary that the other church seasons bring, and so it can be harder to find focus in this green time. The poet W. H. Auden writes The Time Being is, in a sense, the most trying time of all. But this is where we live and where life keeps happening and we keep growing. It is where we are as a parish as we find ourselves after beginning RenewalWorks and The Story, after expanding our understanding of God's welcome and inclusivity, after monumental church restoration project a few years ago, new stewardship approaches just implemented, and looking forward to our 7th year of our growers market, The Greene Street Market at Nativity and many other things.

Your new vestry is meeting this weekend in our annual planning retreat and our theme is "Living in the Green," a model of leadership vision and energy discernment offered by The School of Theology at Sewanee. We celebrate the faithful lay leadership of Sr. Warden Margaret Devenish, Jr. Warden Robert Dunn, Treasurer Donald Christian, and Clerk Dottie Crawford. We celebrate the continued faithful leadership of 3rd year returning vestry members Lee Hicklen, Chad Hinton, Brandon Smith, Linda Watts; 2nd year vestry Kim Huskey, Fisher Hutchens, Dorrie Nutt, Bob Thompson; and new vestry members Paul Bonner, Don Evans, Margaret Gleason, Donald Lambert, Teresa Pinson, and Grant Thomson.

Keep us in your prayers as we celebrate the rich and diverse blessings God has bestowed upon us in Christ Jesus. Living in the Green we will have a wonderful year at Nativity of steadfast growth in our faith and embrace of God's mission through Nativity as we all, together, share the gifts God is abundantly bestowing upon us and through us bless the world.





STEWARDSHIP OF CREATION

Our prayer: Creator God, you have generously blessed us with an abundance of gifts in this, your world. Help us to share in that generosity by living in a way that ensures that your gifts will continue to be available for future generations.

Amen

What is the voice of the Lord saying to us today, in the midst of the environmental issues we face? At a time when Planet Earth is more threatened than it has ever been – by a storm of our own making, ...there are two responses that we **cannot** make:

Defeatism "I can't do anything - the problem is too big". There are so many actions that can be taken, small ones in your own life and family, larger ones at work or by influencing politicians.

Apathy "I don't care". We hold the lives and future of the most vulnerable in this age and in the age to come, in our hands.

What will we feel like when our grandchildren look at us and say "you knew about climate change and you did what? Nothing???"It is time for us to wake up, to realize the importance of our decisions and actions.

Some of these may be big – there is a big movement towards divestment of fossil fuels, with many deciding they can no longer reap profits from fossil fuels if they are causing so much harm.

Some of these actions may be small - It may be time for you as a family to make small but significant changes in your home, changing light bulbs, starting a compost heap, beginning to recycle or being more faithful about recycling. You will influence other people by the decisions and actions you take.

God may be calling you to dedicate time, passion and energy to become part of the environmental cause, to challenge fracking, or waste management practices at your place of work. What is God calling us to do in this congregation??

Another ECO-JUSTICE thought SHOP TILL YOU DROP???

There is no such thing as a cheap product. An advertisement only shows us the final bargain price of the item that will 'make us happier'. It does not show us the impact of the production of this item on other people, communities and the environment.

For example, plastic is an extremely durable material, taking 500 years to biodegrade, yet it's designed to be

used for an average of 5 minutes, and so often then it's just thrown away. Few know where this mass of junk will end up - In the oceans, killing and silently destroying everything, even us. Today there are six mega-vortexes, islands of floating plastic: five between the continents and a sixth close to the Arctic, which is similar in size to Brazil (8.5 million square kilometers) and is 10 meters thick. They have a density of over 200,000 pieces of debris per square kilometer

So what should our response be? First, we're reminded we need to remember and put into practice the three **R**'s: **R**educe, **R**e-use and **R**ecycle. Recycling is important because it reduces the pressure to produce new products. We should all recycle. But recycling is not enough. The waste coming out of our houses is just the tip of the iceberg. For every bag of waste you recycle, 70 bags of rubbish were created in the production of those items.

More important is to reduce our consumption and to re-use items. In order to do this we need to cut ourselves off from the spiritual force of consumerism. Let's stop serving mammon and serve God and what God loves.

Walk lightly.

Each leaf, each petal, each grain, each person, sings your praises, Creator God.

Each creature on the earth, all the mountains and the great seas, show your glory, spirit of love

And yet, the hand of greed has patented and plundered your splendor,

has taken and not shared your gift,

has lived as owner of the earth, not guest.

And so the ice is cracked, the rivers dry, the valleys flooded and the snow caps melt.

God our Father,

show us how to step gently,

to live simply,

to walk lightly

with respect and love for all that you have made.

The Reverend Dr. Daniel Deupree McKee, II

The Reverend Dr. Daniel Deupree McKee, II, 71, died Wednesday, January 4, 2017 at home surrounded by his family. A Requiem Eucharist was celebrated at 3:00pm. Friday, January 6, 2017 at St. Andrew's Episcopal Cathedral followed by a reception in the parish hall.

Dan was born on May 16, 1945, in Vicksburg, the son of the late William Wells McKee and Helen Priestly McKee. A 1963 graduate of Clarksdale High School, he continued his education at Millsaps College, attending on a tennis scholarship. During his time at Millsaps, he was a member of Kappa Alpha fraternity. In 1967, Dan earned his Bachelor of Arts.

Following graduation, Dan began his studies at the School of Theology, in Sewanee, TN, studying abroad in Edinburgh, Scotland for a year.

In 1971, he earned his Master of Divinity and in 1990 he earned his Doctor of Ministry.

Dan was ordained in the Diaconate on June 20, 1971 at St. George's Episcopal Church in Clarksdale and to the priesthood May 27, 1972 at the Chapel of the Holy Family at Camp Bratton Green.

Reverend McKee's first church was St. Thomas Episcopal Church and All Saints Episcopal Church in Inverness. Here, he met the love of his life, his wife of 43 years, Diane. Reverend McKee served at St. Christopher's in Jackson, St. Mary's in Lexington and St. Paul's in Newport, AR. Reverend McKee was called to serve as the Canon to the Ordinary for the Diocese of Arkansas, a position he served for 9 years.

After serving on a diocesan level, he served as an interim rector at Nativity Episcopal Church in Huntsville, AL. He returned to Little Rock, serving as the Sub Dean at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral. Reverend McKee retired in 2010 to Madison, MS, to be closer to family. Reverend McKee was currently serving as the Priest in Charge at Holy Trinity in Crystal Springs as well as other Episcopal churches as a supply priest.

Reverend McKee enjoyed Special Sessions at Camp Bratton Green and Camp Mitchell and served as director for many years. He also enjoyed fishing and hunting.

Survivors include: wife of 43 years, Diane Tolbert McKee of Madison; daughter, Helen McKee of North Little Rock, AR; daughter, Katharine McKee Surkin (Joe) of Madison; grandchildren, Adam Surkin (Leian) of Pelahatchie; Mary Kate Surkin of Madison; Joseph Surkin of Madison; great grandchildren, Shelby Surkin and Evelyn Deupree Surkin of Pelahatchie; brother, William McKee (Milinda) of Houston, TX.
