God's family at the historic Church of the Nativity is joyfully and energetically committed to sharing Christ's love and healing by proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel through worship and service to the world.

Go Forth in Peace

On Sunday, we heard the Prophet Micah asking...and what does the Lord require, but that we do justice, love mercy (also translated kindness) and walk humbly with our God. We come together at Nativity regularly to learn how to do these things the Lord requires. And sometimes we struggle mightily with what God requires in the face of what is going on in the world around us. We know that we can't do justice and love mercy and kindness in a vacuum.

These things God asks of us can only be enacted as we are sent forth into a world that is politically and ideologically charged with competing visions. We go forth into a world that is broken and in need of healing and love. Faithful followers of Jesus choose several ways to fulfill the Lord's requirements. There are differing faithful responses but they are all accomplished as we walk humbly with God and with each other.

By now, you may recall the blessing that I use when I send us forth from the Eucharist. These words are taken from Paul's letter to the Romans, and were used by one of my mentors, The Rt. Rev'd Duncan Gray (a remarkable man of faith, Bishop of Mississippi, and civil rights activist in the 1950's and 60's). These words shed light upon the prophet Micah's guide to God's life:


Go forth into the world in peace. Be of good courage. Hold fast to that which is good. Render to no one evil for evil. Strengthen the faint-hearted, help the afflicted, support the weak. Honor all people. Love and serve the Lord rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit! And the blessing of God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be with you forever.

However you are called to do justice, love mercy and kindness and walk humbly with God, may we do so in the name of our Trinitarian God whose changeless name is love. May we seek understanding and remain connected to our brothers and sisters who don't see things the way we do. May we do everything in love, having the same mind that was

> even to the point of death on the cross, to share our humanity so we could show forth God's Divine life of love and mercy and justice.

What Are You Reading? My Stroke of Insight by Jill Bolte Taylor, PhD Contributed by: Mary Johnson

My Stroke of Insight is a book written by Jill Bolte Taylor, PhD. She is a brain scientist, a neuroanatomist, who at the age of 37 experienced a massive stroke from a hemorrhage in the left side of her brain. Her story is of the remarkable things she learned through the experience, about the brain, from the inside- out. With her left side language center obliterated, she learned that her right side was the spiritual center.



In spite of great pain and concern for her loss of her old self, she was fascinated to learn that she felt herself to be a fluid, not a solid. She perceived her spirit to be enormous as it flowed out to join All That Is in the universe -like a genie, liberated from its bottle. There was no past or future, only the present moment and it was beautiful to her. The energy of everything blended the edges together. Things were no longer seen as separate, but all connected. She saw everything in the dynamic molecular state of activity that the physicists tell us it actually is. It felt like Nirvana or heaven and part of her wanted to stay there.

She takes us on a fascinating journey of her eight years to complete recovery and to her new knowledge of the power of thought as energy. On that journey, she perceives that All That Is is creative energy and that she is infinitely connected to it. She has learned much about the brain that she could not have imagined from her scientific work, and is now thankful for the experience.

Her remarkable recovery has inspired her to share advice for the medical community, caregivers, visitors to the sick and patients alike. They are ideas worth spreading and as such, she also has a heart-felt TED talk that you might enjoy on TED.com.

STEWARDSHIP OF CREATION

Here are thoughts and words about stewardship of God's creation to take into your heart and to guide your actions as you go about your daily activities:

"As the stewards of creation, what account will the Human Race be able to give of our stewardship?" D. Denise Dianaty

Marcia Bunge writes, in a Web of Creation article:

"All of the biblical passages that command us to love our neighbor also have strong implications for environmental responsibility ... As we better understand the dimensions of our environmental problems, it is clear that they are often connected to social injustices. We cannot adequately show love to our neighbors, therefore, without taking into account the environmental problems that affect them."

"Do all the good you can. By all the means you can. In all the ways you can. In all the places you can. At all the times you can. To all the people you can. As long as ever you can." — <u>John Wesley</u>

We Are Called "to Serve and to Preserve"

...the Bible contains insights that can help form the basis of a sound environmental ethic.

...Genesis 1:28 and 2:15 call human beings to preserve and protect the earth and its creatures.

... the biblical texts emphasize a humane and compassionate rule that displays responsibility for others and that results in peace and prosperity.

... Genesis 1:28 does not advocate tyrannical exploitation of nature but rather responsible care of it.

The Hebrew word for "keep" means to preserve for future generations. Hence, the mandate "to serve and to preserve" the land places human beings not in a hierarchical position over creation **but in a position of service to it.**

Just as the later Christian message (in the New Testament) depicts Jesus as a servant-king, so humans are challenged in this creation story to assume a similar role: "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all" (Mark 9:35).

Care for creation is to be exercised not to serve our own wants and desires but to serve the best interests and well-being of all Earth-community together, including ourselves.— adapted from Web of Creation

The Catechumenate: Episcopal Faith Seekers' Class

Begins February 12, 2017 at 10:00am in the Parish Hall

A class for Adults seeking to be Confirmed and Baptized Episcopalians from most other traditions (or no tradition) or Received into the Episcopal Church from the Roman Catholic, Orthodox and Lutheran (ELCA) traditions. This class is also for Confirmed Episcopalians seeking to deepen and renew their faith and Baptismal Vows

This class is introduced with a five-week series, Nativity 101, that gives a broad sweep introduction to the Episcopal Church for anyone new to Nativity or old-timers who want a refresher. Nativity 101 leads into The Catechumenate, the Seekers' Class on February 12. The church's catechumenal process, an ancient pattern for initiating Christians into the full life of the community of the faithful, is at the heart of our Seekers' Class for people new to the Episcopal Church and for other Episcopalians who want to renew and deepen their faith. This process enables participants to reflect upon the traditions and practices of Christianity as the Episcopal Church has received them. Each Seeker or Catechumenate (the historical name for people seeking church membership) will be assigned a sponsor to walk the journey with them. Sponsors are already members of Nativity who will encourage you and be available for questions and discussions about the faith we share as Episcopalians. This class is for anyone who desires to be a confirmed communicant of Nativity and for those adults who are not baptized. This class is specifically for:

- People who have not been baptized
- People baptized as infants who want to make a mature public affirmation of their faith
- People seeking out this church community for marriage or for baptism of a child
- People baptized in other traditions but who have not shared in the Episcopal Church's understanding of Confirmation by a Bishop in the historic, apostolic tradition
- Newcomers to the Episcopal Church from other traditions
- Former Roman Catholic or Orthodox Christians who will be received into this Communion
- Evangelical Lutheran Church in America members who have not been confirmed
- Returnees (for a variety of reasons)
- Active members seeking to deepen and renew their commitment
- Nominal members seeking basic formation
- Lapsed members willing to reconsider Christian Commitment
- Christians seeking deeper faith understanding in a time of crisis

On May 14th, the Bishop of Alabama will be present with us to celebrate these commitments made in Confirmation, Reception, and Renewal of Baptismal Vows. Adults seeking Baptism will baptized at the Great Vigil of Easter on Easter Eve at 7:30pm on April 15, 2017.

The class convenes in the Parish Hall at 10:00am with a presentation by one of the clergy or by a lay leader in the congregation. On March 5, the class hears a presentation by a member of the clergy and then breaks into small groups for table discussion. These classes concludes around 11:30am.

Child care is available on these Sundays past the Children's Church School time until 11:30, but you must register for child care. Participants are asked to attend the 8:45am worship service beginning March 5.
