Stewardship in Lent:

The Call to Living Simply In Order to Serve and Grow

I invite you in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent....is the clarion call to each of us today. A holy Lenten observance is set apart from our regular ways of living in order to help us know and serve God in deeper ways, not only for 40 days but every day.

In our year round focus on Stewardship, Lent gives us special opportunities through the stewarding our lives in more simple ways, getting rid of things that get in the way of our sharing blessings and growing in relationship with Jesus; getting rid of things that keep us from easily following Jesus. As you will also note from other information in the Steeple, Lent is a time for those who are able to consider, pray about, and to make legacy gifts for the future. Our Lenten stewardship efforts enable us to build a brightly burning fire of love for our lives and for the world now, and for future generations to come.

Simplicity and the ethics and spirituality of simple living help us examine what gets in the way of God. We are busy people with full and often over scheduled lives. The commitments on our time and money are significant. In Lent, we strive to travel more lightly, not because things and obligations are bad, but because God wants to use our time and talent and financial resources to help us love our neighbor and God above all else.

Jesus reminds us in the Sermon on the Mount to "consider the lilies" in order to learn to trust God more and stuff and schemes less. He tells us "make purses for yourselves that do not wear out." When he sends his disciples out to tell the world about God's Kingdom purposes and to enlist others in spreading the Good News, he tells them to simplify. "Don't carry more than you absolutely need to get by, learning to trust the generosity of others."

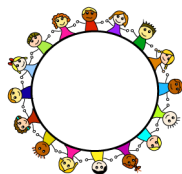
Wonderful Lenten commitments are being made by Nativity's faithful people. Paying attention to how we are stewarding God's blessings, or not, through self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, self-denial, and alms-giving; and by reading and meditating on God's Word found in holy scripture, we are all growing in our relationship with God in Christ. But the point of these things is not as an end in themselves, but as a means to an end: The full stewardship of all of our lives and God's blessings which always results in service and love for God and neighbor.

Make a commitment to attend our weekly Lenten preaching series at Noon on Tuesdays and our Wednesdays in Lent evening programs to inspire and guide. Forty days of cleaning out drawers or closets or even your inbox can be liberating (pages 4, 5, & 7). Choose a fast that matters. Simplify. Allow God to set your life on fire with love this Lent.

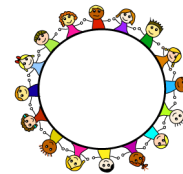
Consider these beautiful words from Miskin T'Filah as you strive for living more simply: What makes a fire burn is space between the logs, a breathing space. Too much of a good thing, too many logs packed in too tight can douse the flames....So building fires requires attention to the spaces in between, as much as to the wood.A fire grows because the space is there...

I hope during this Lenten Season we learn to and embrace living more simply, intentionally avoiding packing our lives so full of things and our schedules so busy with obligations that the fire of God's love may burn brightly, as brightly as God's love shines in Christ.

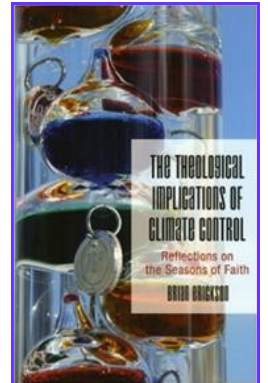
The Theological Implications of Climate Control: Reflections on the Season of Faith

Wait! Before you skim past this one because the title sounds boring or complicated, it is most definitely not. I have found that I continually return to Brian Erickson's reflections on the liturgical seasons and biblical stories to go with them over and over again.

While I may not directly use his book in the Sunday School classroom or EYC, I have found that my worldview and the way in which I enter into, engage, and teach scripture and each liturgical season has been shaped and informed by my continual turning to Erickson's poems and prose. He has a way of setting a particular biblical story or season in context and bringing it to life in a way that enables readers, sitting in their climate controlled living rooms centuries later, to truly enter into these ancient narratives of our faith. He gives the stories a new voice and a new life which, I have found, opens my eyes to the various ways these stories still play out in our own lives.

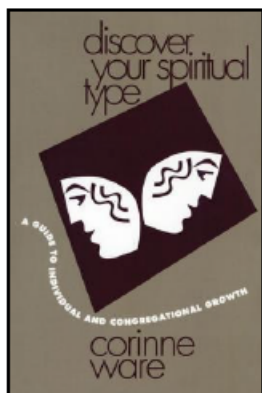
