445 of our Book of Common Prayer. Parishioners have two opportunities for leaving Nativity in their wills: The Nativity Trust that Sally referred to and The Nativity Historical Preservation Foundation. Both are wonderful opportunities to support Nativity for many future generations.

The idea of the Nativity Historical Preservation Foundation came from the Preserving Our Heritage Campaign. We realized that the expense to maintain our beautiful and historical church buildings requires a consistent effort each year to fund our long-term buildings' capital needs. Our annual budget is always challenged with so many needs to support. As a result, we established the Nativity Historical Preservation Foundation which creates an endowment that allows funds to accumulate and grow to support the future needs of our beautiful church buildings.






It turns out that the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu are old friends because they are both Nobel Prize Laureates for Peace and attended many meetings together. Bishop Tutu traveled to Dharamsala, India to celebrate the Dali Lama's 80th birthday. This book is a result of the week spent together, sharing, caring and enjoying each other's presence. They gave talks twice a day exploring their experience and wisdom. Each has suffered terribly - Bishop Tutu with apartheid while the Dali Lama had to flee his beloved country and followers. Yet, in spite or because of the sadness and grief they experienced, they both show great compassion, humility and forgiveness. They both accept where they are and have been and are grateful to be alive. They are very aware that their experiences could have embittered them, yet we see the fire burned off the dross instead, leaving these spiritual leaders full of joy. They 'teach it is possible to be joyful in the face of our daily troubles." The last part of the book gives us practices to follow as we seek our own joy.

It is also a bittersweet book, these old friends are in their 80's and their health is declining. They will probably never see each other again, yet they share a love and understanding of each other as members of a very exclusive club, world spiritual leaders; through this book we share this special time.

I enjoyed this book so much that I bought copies to share with family members. The Book of JOY is available for checkout from the Huntsville Madison County Public Library.



### The Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Alabama

The Rt. Rev. John McKee Sloan Bishop of Alabama

Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope you're all well, taking care of yourselves and your families and the people you are called to serve in our little part of God's Church.

At the January meeting of the Diocesan Council we put together a budget for 2017, taking the covenants pledged from the parishes and using some imagination in assuming what other parishes might give if we didn't have their covenants in hand. I want to thank you all for your support of your Diocese, and especially to thank the parishes who increased either their percentage or their money amount, or both.

Still, despite all of your generosity, costs continue to go up, and a few parishes have found it necessary to decrease their covenant for one reason or another. At the budget meeting we were faced with the unhappy fact that we had more than \$300,000 less than we needed to fund all the ministries across the Diocese, and so some cuts had to be made. I suggested to the Council that it made sense for us to not hire an assistant bishop in 2017, which saved us well over half of that gap, and then we had to find other things to trim or reduce. The Council and I were not willing to cut support the Diocese gives to college work, Sawyerville, youth ministries, Camp McDowell, Special Session, or the General Convention of the Episcopal Church.

It isn't unusual to have to cut from the parochial or diocesan budget, but I want to tell you about the decision to not hire a second bishop, because it will affect the life of your parish. Right now I'm visiting all the parishes and ministries scheduled for me and for Santosh through Easter Day. I want to thank all of you who have had your visitations rescheduled, and your flexibility in getting your folks to come out on Wednesday or Sunday evenings. I can make it like this through Easter Day, but after that we' II need to adjust our assumptions.

For years with two bishops we have been able to visit every parish and worshipping community every year, but with one bishop we're going to have to expand the schedule so that every parish and worshipping community is visited every other year. I don't like it, because we are a relational diocese that values hospitality; I don't think this is the best way for our diocese to work, because it reduces the connectedness between the bishop and the parish. But this is what we have to do given the financial realities that leave us with one bishop.

I wouldn't be honest with you and I wouldn't be doing my job if I didn't say that I hope next year's budget will allow us to reconsider this decision. As you all know, that can only happen as we increase healthy stewardship in the parishes so that the covenants to the Diocese increase along with it. Please do not hesitate to be in touch with Danielle Dunbar, our Development person at the diocesan office, for help or ideas about stewardship.

My long-suffering and hard-working assistant Judy Hall and I have put together a two-year schedule through 2020, which is included. Some parishes will be visited in 2017 and 2019, and others in 2018 and 2020. Our goal is for every parish and worshipping community to be visited every other year, whether you're near or far, whether you're large or small. We've tried to pay attention to the month or time of year a bishop has normally come to visit, but sometimes we've had to volunteer some of you to extend your hospitality at a time when you haven't normally anticipated the bishop's visit. Almost all the visitations are scheduled for Sunday mornings, except for those places that normally meet in the afternoon or evening. It's all very complicated and I suspect there might have been some algebra involved, but we've done the best we could.

I hope you'll be happy with the dates we've assigned you. If you're not, I hope you will try to find a way to make it work and suffer through with quiet grace. If you can't make it work, if the anguish is unbearable, please call or email Judy and we'll do everything we can to make it better for you. If we call you and ask you to consider switching dates with someone else, I hope you'll understand that the other parish must surely have good and dramatic reasons for needing to trade with you and that you will be easing unimaginable sorrow and misery for your sisters and brothers in Christ in another part of our diocesan community.

We have scheduled most of the visits for Sunday mornings, as that seems to work out best for most parishes. If the Sunday you are scheduled for a visitation just won't work, and you have a weekday date that would work better, please call or email Judy and we'll work it out.

Thank you all for your work in our Lord's service, for your support for the Diocese, and for your support for me as your bishop. And thank you for your flexibility and good grace as we make our way through this together.
