## Celebrating Summer's Gifts of Creation, Rest, and Renewal

We end our "church school year" this Sunday with a great celebration of creation and summer as we move to the summer Sunday worship schedule of 8:00 and 10:00am. We celebrate Rogation Sunday with our Children sponsoring the Heifer Market after the 10:00am service, with our Youth sponsoring a Parish Cookout with burgers, dogs and the fixings, and by honoring our Greene Street Market at Nativity ministry. Dress casually and enjoy the fun!

Few of us today directly derive our livelihood from the production of food, yet it is good to be reminded of our dependence upon those who do and our responsibility for the environment. This is part of our Greene Street Market's mission. It is easy for us modern urbanized and suburbanized people to forget that God is counting on us to be fellow stewards of creation for all. We honor our Greene Street Market this Sunday.

Our children will bring back our Heifer Market this year with animals filling the churchyard for us symbolically to purchase to send people, our *neighbors* in "third-world" economies (including Appalachia USA), livestock to help them sustain their food production needs. Don't be surprised if some of the animals look like our kids dressed in sheep costumes!

To top off the celebration, we will enjoy a fun picnic with our youth grilling hamburgers and hotdogs for us to enjoy for lunch as we enjoy the fun and each other's company. So wear your summer casual clothing to relax and stay cool.

**Come back at 5:00pm for our choir's Annual Spring Concert!** And then we know its summer when schedules are more relaxed. We Episcopalians like to joke about the fact that God trusts us enough to take the summers off. But this is not exactly true. God does not take a vacation from us. But God can be found in new ways. So, while you are taking a look at summer's possibilities, consider the following ways to abide in Christ's presence:

**Sunday on Thursdays Eucharist at 6:00 p.m. in the Bibb Chapel.** Come as you are, from work, the gym, the pool for this casual service that looks ahead to the upcoming Sunday—especially if you are going to be away that weekend.

**The Thursday afternoon Greene Street Market at Nativity.** Come out and see your friends, buy good things from God's good creation, and serve in this important expression of our life.

**Permission is granted to dress casually on Sundays!** Sign up to help Blue Apron Ministry host "Lemonade in the Shade."

**When travelling out of town, do your best to get to church.** Bring the service leaflets back and we'll post them so all can see "where we've been."

**Please keep your stewardship gifts current.**

**Experiment with a new spiritual discipline for 10-20 minutes a day.** Light a candle, pray in silence, read the daily office, read the Psalms or section of scripture.

**Rest, enjoy life, be grateful, accept God's blessings and peace.**

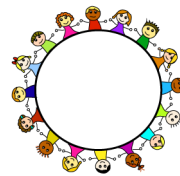

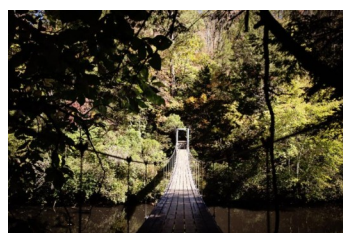

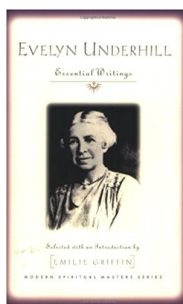

## Outreach in Action

### How do we know where God is calling us to be his hands and feet in the world?

“The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world’s deep hunger meet.”  
~ Frederick Buechner

One way is through *discernment* of using God’s abundant gifts to us. We most often hear in the church in reference to someone in a “discernment process” of pursuing ordination. But discernment is used for more than vocations in the church! Discernment is defined as grasping or comprehending, often of something that is obscure or difficult. It is not a simple decision-making process, it is not majority rule, and it is almost always most effective when done in relationship with others. Discernment requires paying attention to how the Holy Spirit is leading us into “deep gladness” and “deep hunger!”

Deciding how and where to direct our parish Outreach resources is not an easy task: it requires real discernment. The Missional Engagement Initiative (MEI), along with its predecessor, “Be The Change Alabama,” are systems built to help us discern when, where, and how we can best serve our neighbors. Through these initiatives, Nativity Outreach has better ways to mobilize our time, talent, and treasure to help others. We can be good stewards of our resources – human and financial – by taking the time to build strong relationships with the organizations and ministries we wish to support. We want to be more than benefactors; we want to be partners, true neighbors in a relationship of mutual love and respect!

### Looking to enhance your spiritual life? Take a look at CURSILLO!



Cursillo is an incredible experience that transformed the lives of over 8,000 Episcopalians in

the Diocese of Alabama and several hundred parishioners at Nativity. If you are looking for a means to energize your relationship with God and to become more active in the life of the church, Cursillo may be the answer.

The Cursillo Community is made up of Episcopalians who have attended a three-day spiritual retreat, then continue to meet together in small groups within their parish. All Alabama Cursillo weekends are held at Camp McDowell and are guided by volunteer staff members (including clergy) who have already attended a weekend retreat. Once back at Nativity, the Cursillo Community will help you find a reunion group with which to meet on a regular basis.

These small reunion groups generally meet weekly and members discuss their **piety** (prayer and worship activities), **study** (how they have studied God’s word or come in contact with information that enhances their understanding of His word), and **action** (those things we

have done to bring others closer to Christ). The purpose of these group meetings is to encourage and hold each of us accountable in these aspects of our Christian life.

Throughout the year, we also hold larger group meetings. These meetings may consist of several reunion groups at Nativity, groups from other parishes in North Alabama, or diocesan-wide meetings with Cursillo Community members from all over our diocese. These meetings often consist of the sharing of a meal, an enlightening talk, and fellowship with one another.

There are five Cursillo weekends held in Alabama each year (you only attend one!) – March, April, June, September, and October.

### **Nativity’s Cursillo community will have an informational event Sunday, June 25 after the 10:00 am service.**

Lunch will be provided and members of the Cursillo Community will be available to tell you more about Cursillo.
