#### Time to Say Good-bye

It is not easy to say good-bye to the wonderful people of Nativity and to this ministry we have shared. It is not easy to collect my thoughts for this last Steeple article after sharing my reflections and musings about God and the church, and especially our life together, for over 14 years.

So let me begin by saying how grateful I am for each one of you and for the Holy Place and People that are the Church of the Nativity. Tippy and I have been overwhelmed with both joy and sadness, and with such deep emotions, by your gracious words and acts of kindness to us. So thank you from the depths of my heart! You are a great community of God's people in Christ. God's mission has grown in remarkable ways and God has accomplished much through us. You have taught me what it means to lead a vibrant Episcopal parish, even when the lessons were sometimes hard. The power of God's reconciling love and mercy has fueled our moving ahead into God's Resurrection life.

Nativity is not the same parish it was fifteen years ago. And looking at the pictures of Rally Day in 2003, I am not the same either—physically (!)—and of course spiritually. Nativity has reached a new place of spiritual depth and growth. Nativity is a spiritual well in the heart of the city of Huntsville and this parish has much to celebrate now. Nativity is blessed with remarkable lay, clergy, and staff leadership who are faithful, inclusive, and hold a vision of God's Kingdom that embraces Nativity's core values and ideals, while at the same time, are committed to moving forward into that bright future God desires. Change is inevitable in this life if we are alive, vibrant and growing, and so we are called to manage change effectively, not avoid it.


So with all the good we celebrate, there are yet challenges. The church is emerging into a new way of "being Christ's body" in this brave, new, interconnected world we live today. Our anxiety and fear about this must fade in the knowledge of God's enduring love and purposes we share, knowing that the Holy Spirit is among us and leading us. Funding God's mission through the church is recognized as a challenge across all denominations, but, thankfully, Nativity has creative, vibrant and new leadership who are working together to help you meet this challenge.

Also, being church today is no longer just about who is present on Sundays, and so we creatively find other times and ways to gather as God's people in worship and prayer. Our gatherings also includes gatherings like the Greene Street Market, gatherings for musical offerings, gatherings in interfaith collaborations, gatherings at Camp, as well as in all of us gathering with others, inside and outside the church, in the ways each are called to serve the most fragile in our world.

And so my farewell reflections are from ideas I shared in my first year at Nativity. Your gathering together in the many ways available constitutes the strongest symbol of God's presence in the world. The church is a gathering of people in a particular place who together, through different and specific means, are participating in the mystery of Christ, being formed and transformed as God's continued presence in our day and time. Your gathering together, in spite of diverse differences and interpretations, is Nativity's strongest witness to God's healing love and power to a hurting world.

So keep gathering as God's people. Keep praying; keep learning; keep serving; keep giving. *Keep showing up!* And then, my friends, keep inviting others into this gathering which is indeed itself, God's mantle wrapped around all of humanity; a place where the jaws of death are opened and the Crucified/ Risen One is pulling all into the glory of God's enduring life for all creation.

It is time to say good-bye and this is a sad thing for me and for my family. I will never forget the beauty and love of Nativity, and I will not forget each one of you. And so I say good-bye in its truest sense: "God be with you." May you, and I, go with God—who will hold us together with bonds stronger than time or distance.






#### CELEBRATION OF OUR RECTOR



from September to May. Tuition is \$375, which includes books.



#### It's time for ACOLTYE TRAINING!

Who should attend Acolyte Training? The Acolyte program is open to all 7-12<sup>th</sup> graders at Nativity. Even if you didn't start as a 7<sup>th</sup> grader, you can jump in anytime and join us! We do require all new and returning acolytes to come to one of the training sessions.

How do I join the Acolyte program at Nativity, and what will be expected of me? You will need to attend training to learn how to participate as a leader in the worship services, and then you will be assigned to serve once or twice a month for Sunday worship and other special services. We will expect you to serve when you are scheduled OR you will need to arrange for a substitute to take your place. (You can swap Sundays with another acolyte if you are unable to serve.) Most of the substitutions are arranged by email. We also expect you to arrive on time for

your scheduled services.

For all **PROSPECTIVE and RETURNING ACOLYTES**, training will be held on Sunday, August 13th following the 10:00 service. We'll plan to start in the church at 11:30 and be finished by 12:30. Parents are welcome to attend, or you may drop your child off. If you're not available to attend that day, a make up session will be held Monday August 14th at 7 p.m. in the church. If you can't come to either of these sessions, email me and we'll set up a time to meet individually after school one afternoon or between Sunday services.
