God's family at the historic Church of the Nativity is joyfully and energetically committed to sharing Christ's love and healing by proclaiming the Good News of the Gospel through worship and service to the world.



Over the past few weeks we have witnessed marked devastation from 3 powerful Hurricanes. We have seen other disasters unfold over the past few years including fires, earthquakes and floods. Not only is loss of life an issues with these forces of



nature but people's way of life is altered for months, years and sometimes forever.

After a disaster there are three phases of recovery-rescue, relief and restoration. Rescue efforts are best handled by the professionals: police, fire department, rescue squads and the military. We are now in the relief and restoration phases from the recent hurricanes.

Our natural response is to reach out and try to help those affected. To try to relieve some of the suffering they experience because of the losses. It is a human reaction that I believe God the Holy Spirit motivates.

The Rev. David Knight offers some reflections on how he and his community recovered from Hurricane Katrina 12 years ago and some tips and lessons for those wanting to help communities impacted by the storms. 
**Listen to folks on the ground**. They are trying to keep folks alive and one of the most difficult thing to deal with was having volunteers show up with big hearts and great intentions but with no way to sustain themselves and looking for us to provide food and shelter.

Don't send clothes, do send monetary donations. Managing mountains of donated clothes was a huge burden...much of what was sent was unusable. The best way to help is monetary donations especially as local businesses are able to reopen...the donations will be an enormous help locally.

Go with trusted partners. ERD supported Camp Coast Care as a place for volunteers to be fed and sheltered as they worked in the community. Once such places are established in Texas (and Florida) I am sure many of you will be able to join in the recovery effort.



October 31, 2017 marks the 500th anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. One of Martin Luther's greatest contributions to the church is the large number of hymns and tunes that we still sing today. Later in the 18th century, Johann Sebastian Bach harmonized a vast number of these tunes and other Reformation chorales for congregational singing (see hymn 174, 309, 688, etc.) but also in his two passions (St. Matthew and St. John). Bach's contribution to world of church music is one of the largest and most important. Not only did he write harmonizations of chorales, a sacred cantata for every week of the liturgical year, and chorale preludes, he composed free works for organ that include his preludes and fugues. In addition to singing several of these chorales that are either Martin Luther original or results of the Reformation during the month of October, I will be playing a Prelude and Fugue of Bach's once a month as a nod to this historic event in Protestant church history and to pay homage to two of the greatest contributors to sacred music.
