Alice W. Greenway Memorial Fund 100th anniversary

From Sesquicentennial History of Church of the Nativity, Episcopal by Frances C. Roberts, page 76, "On October 29, 1917, John C. Greenway create the Alice W. Greenway Memorial Fund in memory of his mother, a devoted member of the Church of the Nativity. Its purpose was to provide presents for all the children of the parish at the Christmas Festival, as well as other children that the rector might see fit to invite. The trustees of the fund were also given the authority to provide funds for the other expenses connected with the Children's Christmas Festival."



"At Christmas time the children in the Sunday school voted to share part of the money from the Greenway Memorial Fund to buy clothes and toys for the poor children of the community. The Christmas Tree report of 1936 reflected this spirit of sharing." In the book, the report in full is printed. The report is a striking snapshot of life in 1936. The full report can be read on the Nativity website www.nativity-hsv.org.

2017 is the one hundredth year of this great church tradition. During the years of the Christmas Eve festival, special gifts were purchased for each child. Children sat with their Sunday school classes in church and were called to the front to receive their presents. For the past 30 years, the trust's funds have purchased personalized Nativity ornaments which are given to each child after communion. Many long time Nativity parishioners have a cherished collection of ornaments thanks to the Greenway fund.



Margaret Gunter notes in The Practice of Prayer, "They draw us together and remind us that we are knit together in a community much larger than our families or our parish." Gunter says, "Pushed back to its Latin roots, intercedre, the word simply means to 'to stand between' or 'to stand in the midst'. 

Stewardship of Creation

Good ways to green your Christmas

Many of us are yearning for ways to be "greener" during the Advent and Christmas seasons. Here are some simple changes that can help you make very meaningful and greener choices for your holiday celebrations:

Transition to using LED lights this year. LED lights are up to 90 % more efficient than the old incandescent bulbs. LED lights are also safer because they greatly reduce the amount of heat produced, compared to incandescent lights.

Use non-disposable: Think less trash! By using plates, cups and glasses and real flatware for your gatherings, you can greatly reduce the amount of trash your household produces.

Meals: Buy local and buy organic. Support local farmers and businesses, and support the organic farming movement.

This year try a "Surprise Envelope" gift. Here's how this can be done:

- 1. Select an organization or address a situation where you see a need. In honor of a family member, give a meaningful gift which will help make a difference in the lives of families or children in our community. You can address some specific need of a family or group. Examples of local places that offer life-changing help are: Second Mile, Boys and Girls Club, New Beginnings School, 1st Stop, The Community Free Clinic, Camp McDowell Scholarship fund. Your neighborhood school principal or teachers may also know of specific needs that could be addressed.
- 2. Place an envelope on your Christmas tree with a message explaining the gift and that this is the person's gift from you. This can become a tradition that is looked forward to each year! This suggestion is inspired by "The White Envelope" story, which has led to "The White Envelope Project" an organization dedicated to educating youth about the importance of giving. The story can be found at WhiteEnvelopeProject.org.
