

Nominees for Diocesan Offices 2009

Trustees & Council:

A nominee for the council should be a person having some familiarity with the organization and structure of the diocese as well as the work of the council. The person should be willing to take responsibility for the work of the council in implementing decisions of the Diocesan Convention, formulating long-range plans and making immediate decisions about the life and work of the diocese. The nominee should be prepared to deal with matters pertaining to the diocese's financial structure in particular. Trustees and Council meets five to six times a year, including one overnight retreat. A trustee may be elected for two successive terms after which at least one year shall elapse before a trustee may be re-elected. Partial terms shall not be considered in determining whether a trustee has served two consecutive terms.

Continuing members are the Rev. James Trimble (2010), Hampton Moore, Jr. (2010), Katherine K. Smith (2010), the Rev. Amy Coultas (2011), the Rev. Michael Lager (2011), the Rev. Delinda S. Buie (deacon, 2011), William Allbritten (2011), Ann Miller (2011). Two presbyters and two laypersons will be elected for three-year terms to replace the Rev. Jerry Cappel, the Rev. Candyce Loescher, the Rev. Matthew Jaeger and Angela Koshewa. One presbyter will be elected for a one-year term to replace the Rev. Barbara Kirk-Norris.

The following presbyters have been nominated for two three-year positions and one one-year position:

The Rev. Paul Collins, rector of St. Alban's, Louisville, and a part of the diocese for three years. In the diocese, Collins is a member of the Department of Mission and Evangelism and the nominating committee. In the past, he served as the priest-in-charge of St. Andrew's, Lexington. In the community, he is a member of Fern Creek United Ministries.



The Rev. Candyce Loescher, rector of St. Mary's, Madisonville, and a part of the diocese for one and a half years. In the diocese, Loescher serves on Trustees and Council and the nominating committee.



The Rev. Alice S. Nichols, rector of Christ Church, Elizabethtown, for one and a half years and a part of the diocese for three years. In the diocese, Nichols serves on the peace and justice committee. In the community, she is vice-chair of the board of Court Appointed Special Advocates.



The Rev. Elizabeth "Libby" Wade, rector of Grace Church, Paducah, for four years and a part of the diocese for 18 years. In the diocese, Wade serves as chair of the 2009 General Convention deputation, chair of the mission funding committee, and a member of the budget committee, the Department of Mission and Evangelism, the Department of Stewardship and Finance, the Ecclesiastical Court and the School of Ministry curriculum committee. In the past, she served as rector of the Church of Our Merciful Saviour in Louisville, vice president of Trustees and Council, chair of the planning committee for the Presiding Bishop's visit to the diocese, chair of the canon to the ordinary search committee, chair of the 2006 General Convention deputation, summer camp chaplain, and a member of the Christian formation children's ministry team and the Department of Jubilee Ministry. In the community, she serves on the board of Paducah Cooperative Ministry, the homeless advisory committee and the steering committee of Faith Partners Healing Parish.



The following laypersons have been nominated for two three-year positions:

Chris Bartholomew, a communicant of St. Matthew's, Louisville, for four years and a part of the diocese for 10 years. At St. Matthew's, Bartholomew serves on the facilities committee and in the past has served as a group leader for the Lenten reflection series and as a member of the buildings and grounds committee, and Episcopal hurricane relief committee. He is the director of facilities at the Episcopal Church Home. In the community, he works with Habitat for Humanity.



Page Curry, a communicant of Christ Church Cathedral, Louisville, and a part of the diocese for eight years. At the cathedral, Curry serves as Eucharistic minister, Eucharistic visitor, a member of the choir, a member of the outreach and the pastoral care committees, and a Tri-Covenant representative. In the past, she has served as a chapter member, junior warden and chair of outreach. In the diocese, she serves on the peace and justice committee and on the Cursillo secretariat. She is a part-time associate professor at Bellarmine University. In the community, she serves as a volunteer for Interfaith Paths to Peace and campus ministry at Bellarmine University.



Sam Dorr, a communicant of Christ Church Cathedral, Louisville, for 27 years and a part of the diocese for 65 years. At the cathedral, Dorr serves as a lay reader and Eucharistic minister and in the past has served as a deputy to diocesan convention and director of operations. In the diocese, he serves as deputy to the 2009 General Convention and on the nominating committee. In the past, he served on Standing Committee, Trustees and Council and as a deputy to the 2006 General Convention. He is retired. In the community, he serves with the Fairness Campaign of Louisville and Pandora Productions.



Callie Hausman, a communicant of Calvary Church, Louisville, and a part of the diocese for 25 years. At Calvary, Hausman serves as the director of community and Christian formation and has served as youth and young adult leader. In the diocese, she serves as a member of the Department of Christian Formation and in the past has chaired the department. She is the director of community and Christian formation at Calvary Church. In the community, she serves on the board of Windsor Place and on the Kentuckiana Interfaith Council.



Robert A. Huffman, a communicant of St. Matthew's, Louisville, for five years and a part of the diocese for 10 years. At St. Matthew's, Huffman serves as the chair of the outreach committee, lay reader, Evening Prayer coordinator and EFM mentor. In the past, he has served as a Via Media leader, and board member of the Choral Arts Society. He is an industrial engineering supervisor for UPS.

Renee J.S. Thompson, a communicant of St. Matthew's, Louisville, and a part of the diocese for two years. At St. Matthew's, Thompson serves as a lector, parent's night out coordinator, and a member of the children's program and the green team committees. In the past, she served as a member and chair of the education commission, lay reader and Sunday morning discussion leader. She is a mother and homemaker. In the community, she serves with Families with Children from China and as a volunteer at St. Thomas Episcopal Preschool.



Standing Committee:
The Standing Committee serves as the lay and clerical expression of ecclesiastical authority in the church and in the absence of the bishop may actually function corporately as the ecclesiastical authority of the diocese. The committee must approve all ordinations and all candidates for the ministry in the

diocese as well as bishops elected for other dioceses. Upon the bishop's resignation, the Standing Committee is responsible for the nomination process for a new bishop.

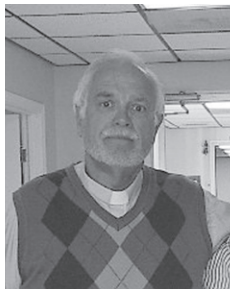
Nominees for the Standing Committee should be persons who can make decisions in the best interests of the national church and respond to questions relating to approval sought by other dioceses and involving our own diocesan structure. This will require willingness to understand and work within the canons of both the diocese and the national church.

The Standing Committee meets about 10 times a year for two to three hours each. No member of the Standing Committee who has served any part of the term for which such member was elected by the Convention shall be eligible for re-election to the Standing Committee until an interval of one year has elapsed. No person may be elected to the Standing Committee, or selected to fill a vacancy of an elected member, if the person is at the time of election, or selection, serving as a member of the Ecclesiastical Court.

Continuing members are the Rev. William Watson (2010), Charles Wible (2010), the Rev. Lucinda Laird (2011), the Rev. Delinda S. Buie (deacon, 2011) and Nancy Northrop (2011). One presbyter and one layperson will be elected for three-year terms to replace the Rev. Charles Hawkins (who was elected by the Standing Committee to fill the unexpired term of the Rev. Paul Jeanes) and Robert Nesmith.

The following presbyters have been nominated for one three-year position (one additional presbyter withdrew his/her name):

The Rev. Karl Lusk, vicar of St. Thomas, Campbellsville, for six and a half years and a part of the diocese for 15 years. In the diocese, Lusk serves as a member of the Department of Mission and Evangelism, the diocesan architectural commission, and is the diocesan disaster preparedness director. In the past, he has served as a member of the Department of Christian Formation, the Department for Congregational Development and Evangelism and as a trustee of the Bishop Dudley Memorial. In the community, he serves as chair of Green River Ministries, vice chair of the Kentucky Community Crisis Relief board, president of the Taylor County Ministerial Association, emergency services chaplain and member of the Campbellsville Kiwanis Club.



The Rev. Ned Morris, rector of Calvary Church, Louisville, and a part of the diocese for four and a half years. In the diocese, Morris serves as coordinator of Fresh Start, and in the past has served on the Commission of Ministry and as chaplain at All Saints' summer camp and chair of the nominating



committee. In the community, he is the president of the board of HELP Ministries of Central Louisville.

The following laypersons have been nominated for one three-year term:

Laura J. Cullinane, a communicant of the Church of the Advent, Louisville, and a part of the diocese for 28 years. At Advent, Cullinane serves on the vestry, altar guild and as a counter. She is a retired nurse. In the community, she has served as a volunteer at the St. John day center and library.

P'Tricia Egbert, a communicant of St. Mark's, Louisville, for one year and a part of the diocese for 10 years. In the diocese, Egbert serves on the All Saints' board and its search committee for executive director. She was as a peer minister at the University of Louisville until her graduation in December. In the past, she has served for nine years as a camp counselor at All Saints'. She is the administrative assistant at Christ Church Cathedral. In the community, she serves on the national church's Commission for Young Adult Ministry.

Phillip R. Patton, a communicant of St. Andrew's, Glasgow, and a part of the diocese for 30 years. At St. Andrew's, Patton serves as senior warden. He is a circuit judge for the 43rd Judicial Circuit. In the community, he serves on the University of Kentucky board of trustees, on the board of the Glasgow-Barren County public library and as president of the Far Off Broadway community theater.



John R. Watson, a communicant of Grace Church, Hopkinsville, and a part of the diocese for 14 years. At Grace, Watson serves as a Eucharistic minister, a member of the Christian education commission and a Sunday forum leader. In the past, he has served as a deputy to diocesan convention and as a member of the resolutions committee. He is the owner of West Kentucky Xerographics. In the community, he serves as chair of the American Cancer Society, as a member of the Christian County Relay for Life and as a member of the board of St. Peter and Paul School.



Trustees, the Bishop Dudley Memorial:

The responsibilities of the trustees are to provide for the investment of funds and for the expenditure of income thereof according to the requirements of the board's charter. The income is to be used for the support of the episcopate. The nominee should have substantial understanding of financial matters and be willing to attend quarterly meetings with the trustees and representatives of the Louisville-based financial institution that

manages the trust's funds. No member who has served for any part of the term elected shall be eligible for re-election until an interval of one year has elapsed.

Continuing members are William F. Chandler, Jr. (2010), Gayle S. Dorsey (2010), Jack Hanstein (2010), Mary Abrams (2011), Barbara Beard (2011) and James Hill (2011). Three laypersons will be elected for three-year terms to replace Kit Kincade, Valerie Smallwood and David Willis.

The following laypersons have been nominated for three three-year terms:

Ralph Barany, a communicant of Trinity Church, Owensboro, and a part of the diocese for seven years. At Trinity, Barany is treasurer and a member of the vestry. He is a senior vice president of BB&T bank. In the community, he serves on the board of the Community Foundation.

David Brooks, a communicant of St. Matthew's, Louisville, for 22 years and a part of the diocese for 66 years. At St. Matthew's, Brooks serves as finance chair and as a counter. In the past, he has served as chair of the endowment committee and chair of the capital campaign. In the diocese, he chairs the Department of Finance and Stewardship and the finance and audit committees. He is the retired chair of Stock Yards Bank and Trust Company. In the community, he serves on the advisory board of the Salvation Army, as a board member of the Fund for the Arts and as vice president and director of the National Association of Credit Management.



Robert East, a communicant of Christ Church, Elizabethtown, and a part of the diocese for 14 years. At Christ Church, East serves as treasurer and on the vestry. In the past, he has served as senior warden, and chair of the ReVision committee. He has worked for more than 20 years in the health care industry. In the community, he serves as the volunteer business consultant for the local chapter of Court Appointed Special Advocates.



Hill Ferguson III is a communicant of Grace Church, Hopkinsville. The nominee did not provide a profile and photo.

Donald F. Kohler, a communicant of St. Francis in the Fields, Harrods Creek, for 51 years and a part of the diocese for 77 years. At St. Francis, Kohler serves as a Eucharistic minister and in the past has served as a member of the vestry, chair of the every member canvas and a member of the stewardship committee. In the diocese, he serves as its treasurer and is a member of Trustees and Council and

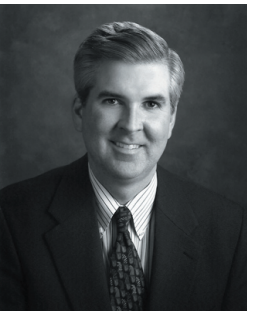


chair of the investment committee. In the past, he has served as chair of the finance committee and as a trustee of the Bishop Dudley Memorial. He is a senior executive at Hilliard Lyons LLC. In the community, he serves on the Home of the Innocents finance committee, the board of directors of the Frazier Rehab Institute and is a member of the Rotary club of Louisville.

Kellie Mysinger, a communicant of Christ Church, Bowling Green, and a part of the diocese for 14 years. At Christ Church, Mysinger serves as a lector, a high school Sunday school teacher and clerk of the vestry. In the past, she has served as senior warden, vestry member, Education for Ministry mentor and member of the building, rector search and budget committees. In the diocese, she is a past trustee of the Bishop Dudley Memorial. She is an accountant with Lee Masonry Products.



Richard Paxton, a communicant of Grace Church, Paducah, and a part of the diocese for six years. At Grace, Paxton serves as a Eucharistic minister, lay reader, lay preacher and acolyte. In the past, he has served as senior warden, church school teacher and member of the choir. He is chief financial officer for the Paxton Media Group. In the community, he serves as treasurer of the EJP Family Foundation and as a volunteer at Paducah Cooperative Ministry.



Trustees, University of the South:

The person elected to this position will be part of the ultimate policy-making body of the University of the South, which includes the college, St. Luke's Seminary and St. Andrew's-Sewanee. The nominee should be willing to learn about the university, represent it faithfully to the church in Kentucky and to support its programs. Trustees are expected to attend one midweek meeting at the university in the fall; they are not reimbursed for travel or lodging expenses. Additionally, each trustee is expected to make an annual, personal financial contribution to the university.

The continuing members are Robert Nesmith (2010) and the Very Rev. Mark Bourlakas (2011). One layperson will be elected for a three-year term to replace Leslie Newman.

The following laypersons have been nominated for one three-year position:

Dabney Nicholls Haugh, a communicant of Grace Church, Paducah, and a part of the diocese for 26 years. At Grace, Haugh serves on the stewardship and the reading camp committees and as altar guild director. She is a

homemaker. In the community, she serves as chairperson of the Paducah Garden Club's conservation committee.

Leslie Newman, a communicant of St. Paul's, Henderson, and a part of the diocese for 39 years. At St. Paul's, Newman serves as youth director, Eucharistic minister, lay reader and choir member. In the past, she has served as a member of the search and capital campaign committees and the bell choir as well as a deputy to diocesan convention. In the diocese, she serves as a University of the South trustee. She is an attorney with King, Deep and Branaman. In the community, she serves on the board of directors of the American Lung Association, the Friends of Audubon, Henderson County Kentucky Agency for Substance Abuse Policy, City of Henderson Parks and Recreation board, Henderson Music Preservation Society, the Bluegrass in the Park folk life festival committee, as grievance office for the Matthew 25 AIDS services, as key communicator for the Henderson County schools, community liaison for Angel Food Ministries and on a number of committees at the University of the South.



J. Sandford F. MacLean Jr., a communicant of Calvary Church, Louisville, for eight years and a part of the diocese for 25 years. At Calvary, MacLean has served as a Eucharistic minister, Eucharistic visitor and lector. In the past, he has served on the worship committee. In the diocese, he has served as a board member of St. George's Community Center. He is the owner and president of Tempus Fugit Services. In the community, he is the president of the Louisville Sewanee Alumni Club.



Ecclesiastical Court:

The Ecclesiastical Court consists of five members of the clergy and four laypersons. All members of the court must be persons canonically resident within the diocese. The members are elected for three-year terms and are eligible for re-election. Their task is to try charges brought against members of the clergy for alleged violations of national canons providing for clergy discipline and standards of clergy conduct.

All members should be emotionally mature, intelligent individuals, capable of understanding and evaluating evidence and able to be fair-minded and objective. Though their title is "members of the Court," it is useful to think of their function as analogous to that of members of a jury in the secular court system. No person may be elected to the Ecclesiastical Court, or selected to fill a vacancy of an elected member, if the person is at the time of election or selection a current member of the Standing Committee or a past member of the Standing Committee that considered a charge, offense or impairment

(as such terms may be defined in the national canons) which has not been fully resolved.

Continuing members are the Rev. Elizabeth Wade (2010), Katherine Kingren (2010), Rob Sexton (2010), the Rev. Mark Feather (2011), the Rev. E. Benjamin Sanders (2011) and W. Bronson Howell (2011). Two members of the clergy (presbyter or deacon) and one layperson will be elected for three-year terms to replace the Rev. Rose Bogal-Allbritten, the Rev. Benjamin Maas and John A. Bugbee.

The following clergypersons have been nominated for two three-year positions:

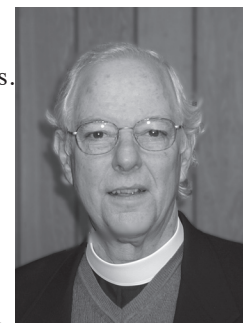
The Rev. Matt Bradley, priest-in-charge of St. John's, Murray, and campus minister for Murray State University for five months and a part of the diocese for 22 years. In the diocese, Bradley serves on the diocesan committee on liturgy. In the past, he has served as peer minister at the Chapel of the Holy Spirit in New Orleans. In the community, he is a member of the Murray Community Concerns committee.



The Rev. Dr. Eva Markham, deacon at Resurrection Church, Louisville, for 11 years and a part of the diocese for 57 years. In the diocese, Markham serves on the School of Ministry faculty. In the past, she has served on the Standing Committee, Trustees and Council, the Commission on Ministry and as co-chair of the Resolution 7 commission. She is a licensed psychologist and a faculty member in the Department of Pediatrics, School of Medicine at the University of Louisville. In the community, she serves as member of the advisory council for the Tourette Syndrome Association and as a member of the board for the Sudanese Refugee Education Fund.



The Rev. Moray Peoples, priest associate at St. Matthew's, Louisville, for four years and a part of the diocese for 24 years. In the diocese, Peoples serves as an Education for Ministry mentor and in the past has served on Trustees and Council and as a deputy to General Convention.



The Rev. Anne Fontaine Vouga, assistant rector at St. Mark's, Louisville, for five months and a part of the diocese for 15 years. In the diocese, Vouga serves as a member of the Commission on Ministry. In the past, she has served as a Eucharistic visitor, Eucharistic minister, lay reader and member of the adult



education committee at St. Matthew's, Louisville.

The following laypersons have been nominated for one three-year position:

Betty Blodgett, a communicant of St. John's, Murray, and a part of the diocese for 12 years. At St. John's, Blodgett serves as senior warden and in the past, has served as chair of the newcomer's ministry and as a middle and high school Sunday school teacher. In the diocese, she is a member of the mission funding committee and the Episcopal Housing Authority. She is a professor emerita at Murray State University. In the community, she serves as chair of the Angels Attic board of directors and is a member of the board of the MSU Federal Credit Union.



Cicely Jaracz Lambert, a communicant of St. Matthew's, Louisville, for 20 years and a part of the diocese for 51 years. At St. Matthew's, Lambert serves in the choir. She is a staff attorney with the Louisville Metro public defender's office.



C. David McDaniel, a communicant of St. Mark's, Louisville, for three years and a part of the diocese for nine years. At St. Mark's, McDaniel serves as a Eucharistic visitor, intercessor and choir member. In the past, he has served as sacristan, lector and human resources committee chair. He is a private compliance assurance officer with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Veterans Health Administration.

Dan Songer, a communicant of Grace Church, Paducah, and a part of the diocese for 12 years. At Grace, Songer serves as a Eucharistic visitor, lay reader and audio and video producer for congregational productions. In the past, he has served on the vestry and as a deputy to diocesan convention. Her is a retired U.S. Air Force lieutenant colonel.



Michelle Yeager, a communicant of St. Matthew's, Louisville, and a part of the diocese for 32 years. At St. Matthew's, Yeager has served as usher captain and oblation bearer. In the diocese, she serves on the Commission on Ministry. She is the UniServe director for the Jefferson County teachers association. In the community, she serves on the board of the Home of the Innocents, as vice chair of St. George's Community Center and on



the advisory board of Ovarian Awareness of Kentucky.

Cathedral Chapter Representative:

A diocesan representative may be either a presbyter or deacon canonically resident in the diocese, or an adult, confirmed communicant in good standing of a congregation—in union with the Convention of the Diocese of Kentucky. Diocesan representatives participate as voting members of the chapter but are not eligible to serve as senior warden, junior warden, treasurer or secretary of the chapter.

Continuing members are the Rev. Thomas Price (2010) and Robert Nesmith (2011). One person (lay or clergy) will be elected for a three-year term to replace the Rev. James Trimble.

The following person was nominated for one three-year term (one additional person withdrew his/her name):

The Rev. Dr. Tim Mitchell, rector of Church of the Advent, Louisville, and a part of the diocese for one year. In the diocese, Mitchell serves on the mission funding and investment committees. In the past, he has served as an associate priest at three parishes in the Diocese of California and on the board of directors and investment committee in the Diocese of California.



Secretary of the Diocese:

A Secretary of the Diocese is elected immediately upon the opening of a convention for a term that begins at the end of that meeting and ends with the next "stated meeting of Convention." The secretary is expected to attend the convention as well as all meetings of Trustees and Council and its executive committee. The secretary is expected to verify the minutes of these meetings and verify certain official documents. The secretary, assisted by the Diocesan Office, oversees the publication and distribution of the Annual Journal as required under Canon 9, Canons of the Diocese of Kentucky.

The current secretary is Kay Shields Wilkinson.

The layperson nominated for this position is:

Kay Shields Wilkinson, a communicant of Christ Church Cathedral, Louisville, and a part of the diocese for 41 years. At Christ Church Cathedral, Wilkinson serves as treasurer, chapter member, usher and member of the planned giving, finance and archives committees. In the diocese, she serves as the secretary of the diocese and member of the executive committee. She is a CPA with Potter & Company LLP. In the community, she is a member of the American Institute of CPAs, the Kentucky Society of CPAs, and as historian of the Louisville Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.
