For "the good of the Order," though neither urgent nor emergent, and in light of my reputation as a rubrical fundamentalist: There is no pecking order between the C&Cs and the BCP (texts and rubrics). The latter are subsumed into the former. The Prayer Book (texts and rubrics) has the force of canon law. So, no matter what canons or constitutional articles apply in the case at hand, the mere fact that the Oath is in the Prayer Book makes it mandatory.
