### “Celebrate what’s right in the world right now”

This, along with “have the courage to be happy where you are,” “rekindle your first love and remember when you first fell in love with God,” and “do what feeds your soul and makes your heart sing,” are phrases that remain with me from my week at CREDO, a wellness conference for clergy that I attended in May. Guided by what is known as Appreciative Inquiry, the leaders of the conference emphasized that “what you pay attention to grows.” In other words, if we focus on illness and dysfunction, those will increase. If we celebrate health and well being, those will continue to grow. If we worry about having little faith, our faith will decrease. If we seek the presence of the holy in our world and in one another, we will discover God everywhere we look. Yes, of course, our lives and our churches are not perfect. We all carry wounds of one sort or another. The question is how challenges can be made into opportunities, how wounds can be transformed into windows for empathy and authenticity, and how cracks can be places where God’s light shines through.

Ask yourself where you put your energy. Do you celebrate what’s right in the world right now? Do you have the courage to be happy where you are? Can you remember what it was like when God and you fell in love? Can you work to rekindle that flame... or do you have trouble even imagining what those questions mean?

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Through April 30 the Cathedral's revenues are on target with budget. Timely payment of pledges has been the norm and is greatly appreciated. Looking forward, we have planned for \$20,000 of revenues from several fundraising events. None has yet occurred, so we are counting on strong volunteer support to make them a great success. If you can help in any way, please let Vestry members know.

With the market upturn, our Endowment has moved back into the black. As of mid May, our year-to-date return is about 5%, which is modestly ahead of market averages.

On the expense side, we continue to benefit from the savings of our new natural gas heating system. We have reinvested a small portion of these savings in repainting the Deanery, a sorely needed maintenance project that did not find its way into the original budget. Also, we have restructured our deposit accounts with Maine Bank & Trust. Better cash management techniques and reduced fees should produce about \$1,000 per year of savings. Lastly, a positive variance in several salary accounts has permitted us to offer a summer stipend to our Christian Education Director, permitting her to strengthen curriculum for the coming year.

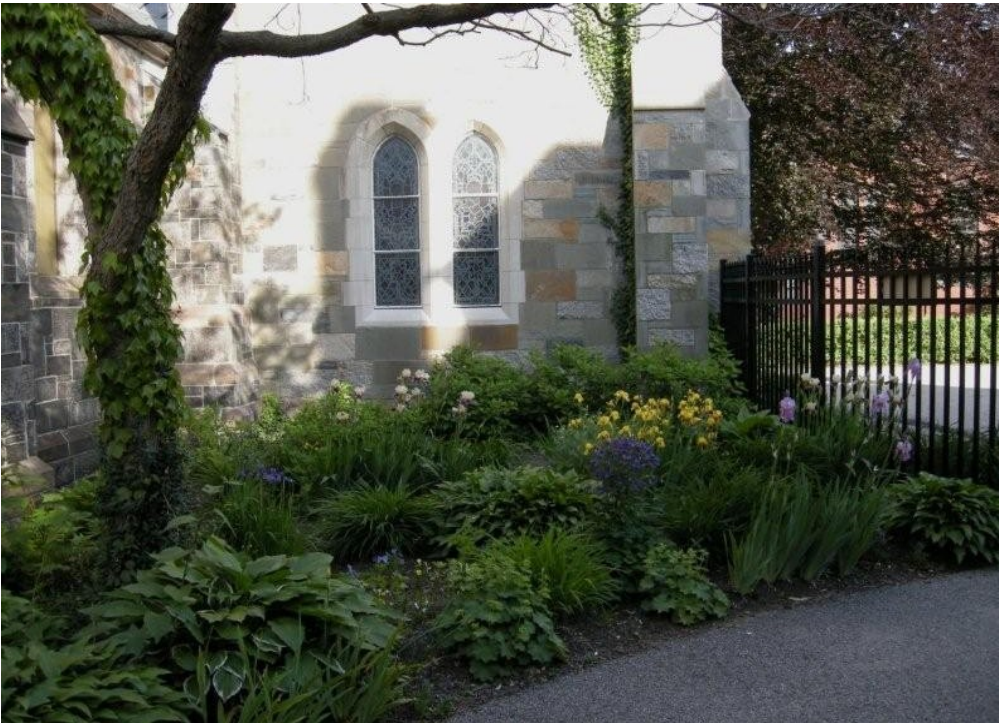

## BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS SUMMER FUN

The face-lift of the deanery facade is a work in progress. The major portion of the painting has been completed. We give thanks for cooperative weather and those who prayed for safe completion of the work. We give special thanks to Bob Hanson for his donation of a forty-foot ladder that enabled the crew to reach the upper portion of the building. We now retire Bob's ladder to the basement where it awaits the next strong and able-bodied team to tackle future tasks. The side porch on the deanery remains to be scraped and painted. Joe Edgar has enthusiastically stepped forward to assist with repair of

St. Luke's next special day to volunteer is July 7th. Come and bring a friend.

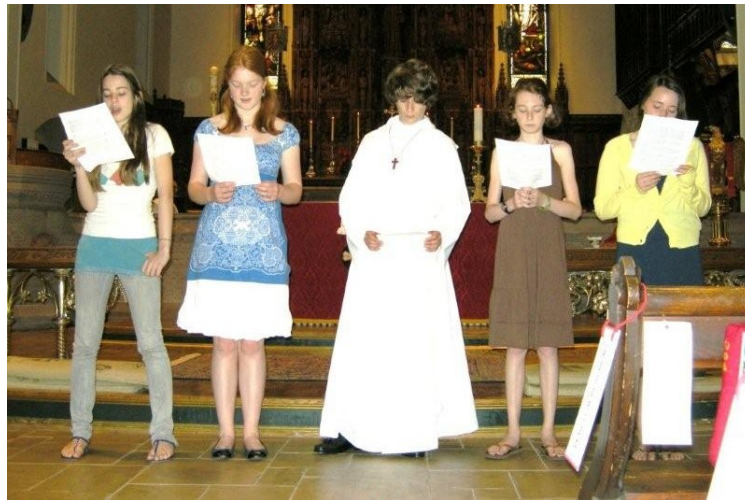
## eBay for ST. LUKE'S!
