At a recent retreat, the vestry discussed plans that we hope will continue to attest to how mighty we can be when we all put our heads together to work in the vineyard. The Portrait Gallery was a project of the 50th Anniversary Committee. I wish to thank Robert Harrell for his excellent work on this project.

The vestry had a very productive retreat last weekend. On Friday evening Veronica and Lorenzo Ridenhour served us a delicious dinner in their home. Saturday morning we gathered in the parlor of St. John's, College Park, for our working and planning session. We left excited and energized. Details of our meeting will be shared later. We have a fine vestry. We work hard, and we have a lot of fun!

Our annual Stewardship Campaign begins this Sunday, October 5. You should receive a stewardship mailing this week. At St. Augustine's we think of stewardship as a celebration, not a chore. I look forward to celebrating stewardship with you in the weeks ahead!

One aspect of our stewardship focus will be an outreach project for Bethlehem Ministries in Haiti. As you know, Haiti has been hit especially hard by hurricanes this year. The people of Haiti live in dire circumstances to begin with, and these natural disasters have only added to their hardships. Several years ago I invited The Rev. Pere Bruno to preach and share with us his ministry at the school he established in Cap Haitian. Our October stewardship/outreach project will focus on Christmas boxes for Bethlehem Ministries school children. Details will be shared this Sunday.

Finally, October 11 is Autumn Faire! Proceeds will go to Holy Comforter Church, a ministry of our diocese, and Securus House, a safe haven for battered women of Clayton County. Volunteer sign-up sheets are in the Parish Hall and the Gathering Room. We need lots of volunteers to make lots of money and have lots of fun! This is our third Autumn Faire for outreach, and each year the celebrations gets better.

May the Wisdom of God, the Love of God, and the Grace of God strengthen us to be Christ's hands and heart in this world, in the name of the Holy Trinity.

What the numbers are saying: Regular contributions for the month of August exceeded budget expectations by \$1,201. We are now behind in our year-to-date projected contributions by only 1,132. August expenses, however, exceeded the budget by \$740. Still, year-to-date we are behind in our spending by \$3,915.

Combined with the contributions shortfall, we are currently 'in the black' by \$3,175, and that's not bad at all.


What the numbers do not tell us: Our financial picture at the close of August continues the optimistic trend that started in July.

Spending is still well within budget and contributions are picking up. If we stay on this track, our Reserve/Rainy Day Fund can continue to grow untapped in the coming months. Thanks be to God!

Chuck's Checks and Balances

Hallelujah! Our contributions year to date are right on target. Through the end of August we are less than one percent behind our projection. Collectively we are all doing well in honoring our pledges.

Thanks to everyone that has stepped forward to financially support the ministry of St. Augustine's. We know the overall economic climate is not so good. We are bucking the trend here in Clayton County. Thank you.


