Dear Ms. Harrison,

This letter is written to advise you that the denial of reaccreditation of Rennert (Rennert New York and Rennert Miami) by the Accrediting Commission of the Accrediting Council for Continuing Education and Training (ACCET) was affirmed by the ACCET appeals panel at the March 21, 2018 hearing. The Accrediting Commission denied reaccreditation to Rennert (Rennert New York and Rennert Miami) in its letter, dated December 21, 2017, citing a serious finding of non-compliance, along with specifying an opportunity to appeal the decision. The institution submitted its request to appeal and subsequently provided its appeals brief and exhibits on February 21, 2018 and March 12, 2018. Upon review of the institution's brief, exhibits, and hearing testimony, the panel affirmed the Commission's findings, as referenced in the enclosed decision of the appeals panel. The appeals panel found that the institution failed to provide documented evidence to demonstrate that the institution was in compliance with ACCET Standards for Accreditation. Therefore, the decision to deny reaccreditation to the institution is a final action. It is noted for the record that the Commission acknowledged the appeals panel's decision to deny reaccreditation to Rennert (Rennert New York and Rennert Miami) after its consideration of the written record, including the appeals brief, exhibits, and presentation provided by the institution during the appeals hearing.

As a closing note, the institution has the opportunity to provide a narrative to the Commission's action within 15 days of receipt of this letter. ACCET reserves the right to redact any inappropriate or inflammatory comments prior to posting the response on the website. It remains our hope that the accreditation process has served to focus the institution's resources and commitment towards strengthening its operations.
