MEETING OF THE DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

July 8, 2020

1. <u>Call to Order</u> – The meeting was called to order at 9:01 a.m. by Chair Rick Winn.

Attendance

2. Approve Meeting Minutes from June 10, 2020

Mr. Kelly noted that included in the June Minutes was an update on the Economic Relief Funding expenditures. He also noted a total of 13 businesses have requested \$71,000 for window replacement costs through the Downtown Enhancement Grant.

Motion: Ms. Dunn, supported by Ms. Sieger, moved approval of the June 10, 2020 Meeting Minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Avila and Mr. Eddie joined the meeting.

3. Air Quality Monitoring Partnership

Mr. Kelly introduced Darren Riley, the Executive Director for Rapids Air Quality, prefacing that Grand Rapids has a history of prioritizing environmental quality as well as economic development, suggesting that these are not mutually exclusive goals. As we learn that severe cases of COVID-19 are linked to areas of poor air quality, we value the opportunity to gather data on air quality in Grand Rapids, and specifically lower income neighborhoods that are more greatly impacted. This data would support policy and land use decisions in the future. Mr. Riley presented the background on Seamless project in partnership with the Wege Foundation which was just acquired by Rapids Air Quality. This single sensor in Grand Rapids tracks basic air quality parameters including particulate matter and nitrogen oxide (CO2 levels). Mr. Riley stated COPD and asthma are long term effects of poor air quality; we

also now know that air pollution is responsible for elevated mortality rates among COVID cases. It is recommended to build a distributed network of sensors throughout cities across the US (the Hive Network). With the improvement of sensor quality and data communication, the decrease in cost for the equipment, and the increased need for micro (community) data, Rapids Air Quality would like to deploy sensors among three neighborhoods in Grand Rapids for a one year pilot project. The request to the DDA is funding for a total of 5 sensors (at the cost of \$30,000) that would be installed throughout Downtown. Ms. Clarin noted the City may have resources to contribute to this project. Mr. Talen suggested Mr. Riley connect with both the Granville Ave Business Association and Roosevelt Park Neighborhood Association and stated his excitement for obtaining this granular data along the corridor. Ms. Dunn agreed and requested clear action steps at the end of the one-year project. Mr. McNeilly stated he supported moving early on this project to entice other organizations to become involved, assuming the project meets the requirements for a city-wide roll out.

Motion: Mr. McNeilly, supported by Ms. Dunn, moved to approve the sponsorship of 5 air quality sensors with Rapids Air Quality, not to exceed \$30,000. None opposed. Motion carried.

4. Social Zone Update

Mr. Miller provided an update on the deployment of 4 connected social zones throughout Downtown, providing outdoor accommodations for over 130 restaurants and 44 retail and service establishments, noting these are meant to be a flexible and adaptable intervention. He presented pictures of each zone and stated there was a lot of collaboration in set up and a continued effort to sanitize, maintain, and adjust these areas to offer the greatest impact. Mr. Talen asked if restaurants could serve alcohol in these social areas. Mr. Miller clarified only if they have the expanded MLCC license at this time.

5. Event Support

Mr. Kelly requested that the DDA approved funding for ArtPrize 2020 (of \$50,000) be repurposed for another event currently in development. Community organizations including the CAA, DGRI, the City, Experience GR, GRAM, GR Chamber and Start Garden are in favor of moving forward with an event that incorporates local art, music, cultural festivities, and small businesses downtown. Preliminarily, this would take place in September and will build off the social zones and mural projects already happening downtown. Mr. McNeilly voiced his concern for funding an undefined event. Mr. Avila agreed but expressed his support in order to develop this cultural event further. Mr. Kelly noted only DDA eligible expenses will be reimbursed and these funds are to be used in the same manner as ArtPrize funding would have been.

Motion: Ms. Dunn, supported by Mayor Bliss, moved to authorize the reallocation of ArtPrize 2020 funds, not to exceed \$50,000, to be used to financially support an alternative cultural event being planned for September. None opposed. Motion carried.

6. <u>President and CEO Report</u>

Mr. Kelly stated the Portland Loo (Heartside Public Restroom) is scheduled to be delivered and installed on July 24th. Multiple public art initiatives including the dog park mural called the Puppy Pad and four Womens Way Alley murals located at GRPD, 20 Monroe Live, Auto Fixit, and GR Children's Museum have been completed or are in progress. Downtown Grand Rapids, Inc has been accepted into the High Line Network for the Grand River Revitalization Project, along with 15 other members, which will be a great resource as we build an equity framework of action along the corridor this fiscal year.

8. <u>Board Member Discussion</u>

Mr. Winn asked if there would be interest by board members to hold face to face meetings or if it is preferred to continue holding virtual meetings. Ms. Sieger stated she would not yet be comfortable attending in person meetings. Others agreed. Mr. McNeilly stated it is worth considering that our board lead by example and take steps toward reopening as we are encouraging local establishments to do. Mr. Talen argued things that can be done virtually, should be done virtually, at least for the time being. Mr. Winn stated we can continue to meet virtually as allowed by the Governor's executive orders but offered to host a mixed meeting (in-person with virtual participation) at The Amway to allow for better social distancing when we are ready. Mr. Kelly added we are in the process of obtaining technology that would allow for a mixed live/virtual meeting to occur.

9. Adjournment

The meeting adjourned at 10:13 a.m.

Pedestrian Counts August 2019 v. August 2020









Pedestrian Counts Adjacent to Social Zones May- August 2020

On Statement A, there were no material changes in the Balance Sheet from May 31, 2020 to June 30, 2020. The June 30, 2020 fixed asset information will be adjusted for deprecation and the sale of 158 Oakes, this will be reflected in the final audited financial statements.

On Statement B, Debt Tax Increment Property Tax Increment revenues decreased due to an accrual for the payment to the State, GRPS, and KISD for the estimated return of captured taxes based on the State of Michigan Form 2604. Interest earnings from investments went up substantially in June, as all investments need to be brought to Market Value even if the investments will not mature for months or even years.

The Authority has sufficient cash to support budgeted expenditures.

The Authority's balance sheet on Statement A indicates the Authority is in a strong position financially with sufficient Pooled Cash to support development plan expenditures for FY2021 and beyond. In the Local Tax fund, the decrease in investments in fixed assets is due to the removal of 158 Oakes and accumulated depreciation.

The City Treasurer has not yet distributed summer tax increment revenues, so Statement B shows a deficit as of August 31, 2020. There are also negative interest earnings from the investments that were brought to market value in June but since they haven't yet matured, that entry is reversed in the current year. As the year progresses interest earnings should cover and surpass the reversal.

SUBJECT: Downtown Tree Planting Reauthorization/Expansion

Urban forests and the canopies they produce have been shown to offset carbon, help cities manage stormwater runoff and reduce the urban "heat island" island effect by reducing temperatures. Dense urban canopies have also been shown to reduce stress, increase physical activity in their residents and make neighborhoods safer.

In 2015, recognizing the immense benefits to increasing its urban canopy, GR Forward established a goal to increase the Downtown tree canopy from 5% to 10%. DGRI began its current partnership with Friends of Grand Rapids Parks (FGRP) in 2018; since that time FGRP has planted 250 trees and created a comprehensive GIS map indicating current tree and planting site inventories.

For FY '21 FGRP will plant 250 new trees, 125 in Fall and 125 Spring. Additionally, FGRP will maintain the approximately 400 trees that they have planted since 2019 as well as perform a condition analysis of all the trees within the DDA district.

For FY '21 it is recommended that the DDA renew their partnership with FGRP to continue to work toward this important community goal. Authorization is requested for an amount not to exceed \$134,750 which would be provided out of the Downtown Tree Planting Line item in the DDA's FY 2021 budget.

Recommendation: Authorize an amount not to exceed \$134,750 for Friends of Grand Rapids Parks to complete Fall 2020 and Spring 2021 tree plantings as well as an in-depth analysis and count on all existing trees within the DDA boundaries.





2020 DGRI TREE PLANTING AND MAINTENANCE PROPOSAL

Introduction

This document is intended to serve as a proposal from Friends of Grand Rapids Parks (Friends) to increase the urban tree canopy for Downtown Grand Rapids Inc (DGRI). In this document you will find background information on Friends and a proposal for planting more urban forest canopy by Friends for DGRI for fall of 2020 through spring 2021.

The document also contains a detailed project timeline as well as a cost breakdown per project milestone.

Friends of Grand Rapids Parks Overview

Friends of Grand Rapids Parks is an independent, citizen led, nonprofit enterprise founded in 2008, working closely with but separate from the City, with the mission to empower people to cultivate vibrant parks, trees, and green spaces in Grand Rapids. We believe that vibrant parks and public spaces are essential to support the community's economic health, competitiveness, and cultural well-being. We understand that a healthy urban canopy is a long-term commitment, and are committed to help achieve the city's goal of a 40% urban tree canopy in Grand Rapids through the work of the Urban Forest Project. The need for these efforts is especially apparent in the Downtown district where existing infrastructure is limiting to a flourishing canopy.

Our project lead, Lauren Davis is a Certified Arborist as recognized by the International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) and an active member of the Michigan and Midwest chapters. Davis is sworn to uphold the high standards and best practices set by these entities for urban forest project planning, management, and project execution.

Past Projects

Since 2018, FGRP in partnership with DGRI have planted over 280 trees and completed a complete street and park tree inventory of the all assets within the DGRI boundary. FGRP has continued to water and maintain trees as well as utilize the time/skills of Neighborhood Foresters and other volunteers to plant and prune trees Downtown.



Current Proposal

Tree Planting

FGRP proposes to plant and maintain 250 trees in the Downtown district as identified in the most recent GIS mapping completed for the area in 2019. FGRP will work in collaboration with the Downtown district to identify the most impactful opportunity sites to plant 125 trees in the fall of 2020 and 125 trees in the spring of 2021. These trees will be planted with volunteers managed by FGRP and maintained for the following season.

Tree Inventory

FGRP will assess and collect data for all live tree assets, dead trees, stumps, and vacant planting sites within the DGRI boundary and provide an updated urban forest management plan. Based on previous data, there are an estimated 6,000 sites within the Downtown area.

SUBJECT: Authorization for FY21 Winter Lighting

In 2014, DGRI took over the holiday décor for Downtown Grand Rapids and worked to develop and enhance some of our downtown public spaces during the winter season. Over the years we have continued this tradition both by replacing and updating the lights and décor from our current displays and adding additional lights and décor to new areas of Downtown.

During the FY21 budget planning process, the reinstallation of current displays and some additional expansion lighting to adorn more of Downtown Grand Rapids for the winter season was again identified as a priority. Additional decor or replacement décor is planned for south Division Ave., Monroe North, Rosa Parks Circle new pathway light tunnels, Ionia and Bridge street.

In 2018 it was made a priority to continue year-round lighting on Monroe Ctr. to help continue on-street lighting ambiance for safety and shopping along the main corridor. This has remained a continued priority. This year we will be able to expand year-round lighting onto the trees along Monroe Ctr. in replacement of the poles with tree friendly lighting

An additional change from previous years' support and this year's proposal is the term of a 3-year contract. This change recognizes that important long-term benefit from a multi-year contract to continue the year-round work needed for installations and to be able to create a multi-year plan for each location within the Downtown.

Downtown lights will officially be turned on no later than December 1, 2020 after installation is completed.

Recommendation:

Approve the expenditure not to exceed \$75,000 to Christmas Décor by DeVries for the provision, installation, de-installation, and storage of holiday decorations for FY21. In addition, authorize negotiation of an agreement for a 3-year term contract approved as to form by DDA legal counsel and content by the Executive Director.



SUBJECT: Blue Bridge Lighting Repair

In August 2012, the Downtown Development Authority Board authorized funding to support a \$1.3 million restoration of the Blue Bridge. The project was undertaken in collaboration with the City of Grand Rapids and Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT), and included repainting, replacement of decorative bulbs and overhead lights, and repairs to expansion joints. The DDA's share of the project was \$900,000.

Since completion of the project, the Blue Bridge has become a magnet for visitors and an icon in the Downtown skyline. In the past 8 years it has served as a venue for countless events, including Art Prize and the Pride Celebration. It has also commemorated numerous local, national and international events through its signature decorative lighting system.

In order to keep the decorative elements operational, the City of Grand Rapids initiated upgrades to the lighting system in late August. Total costs of the repair project are \$80,000 and includes replacing and repairing 53 decorative fixtures and 11 pedestrian walkway lights. To support this work, the DDA is being asked to contribute \$30,000 which will be funded from the FY21 NTI budget via the Bridge Lighting Operations line item.

This project is estimated to extend the working life of the lighting system and additional 5 years, at which point the system is expected to need more extensive repairs or replacement. Prior to this, the City and DDA agree to undertake an evaluation of system ownership and to develop an operation, maintenance, and capital plan for the future improvement.

Recommendation: Authorize an amount not to exceed \$30,000 to support repairs to the Blue Bridge lighting system.

SUBJECT: 86 Monroe Center Downtown Enhancement Grant

Rockford Construction is requesting approval of a Downtown Enhancement Grand for improvements associated with their building at 86 Monroe Center. The project would result in the removal of the entryway canopy and is being undertaken to enhance the pedestrian experience on Monroe Center and improve the consistency of the street wall along the block. It is also expected to help with drainage back up in the building.

Total costs for the project are estimated at \$113,535 and to assist the Owner is requesting reimbursement in an amount not to exceed \$56,767.50 (50 percent of project costs). Work on the project is expected to begin in October 2020 and be completed by December 2020.

As proposed the project will support other infrastructure investments occurring on Monroe Center aimed to support businesses and invite visitors. These include the recently installed social zones from Monroe Avenue to Division, new LED lights, tree pruning, planter refurbishment and the to be completed renovations to Ecliptic at Rosa Parks. Further, in December 2019 the DDA also issued Retail Innovation and Incubation grants for the recently opened Oh Hello! and Art Caribbean restaurant. These improvements all contribute to the continued vitality of Monroe Center and the community's aim to establish it as a destination corridor.

Recommendation: Authorize the execution of an Agreement with Rockford Construction for a Downtown Enhancement Grant to support improvements at 86 Monroe Center for an amount not to exceed \$56,767.

Goal 3 of GR Forward promotes implementation of a 21st century mobility strategy that can be achieved by leveraging Downtown's existing transportation assets and providing additional options for the area's employees, residents, and visitors to get around (page 182). Additionally, Goal 3 recommends providing new and enhanced mobility options (page 204) and enhancing physical and perceived connections to neighborhoods surrounding downtown for all modes (page 212).

The Wealthy/Division TOD Pilot Project is a component of the Rapid's ongoing multi-jurisdictional Transit Oriented Development (TOD) project named *Division United* along the Silver Line BRT route on Division Avenue. *Division United* is a comprehensive planning process that seeks to come up with transportation and development improvements that benefit the people of South Division Avenue by making jobs accessible through a multi-modal network that connects flourishing businesses and affordable/attainable housing – things that are consistent with GR Forward's Goal 3.

As part of this effort, the consultant team is planning a series of temporary and tactical interventions to test solutions, build collaboration, influence best practices, and provide the framework for future built improvements. These interventions are planned near Division Avenue's intersections with Wealthy, Burton, and 44th Street, and will be culminate with a series of events on October 2 and 3.

The Division/Wealthy program is within the DDA boundary and will specifically study the area near Logan Street and the McConnell BRT stops by using pavement paint, pop-up vending, projection mapping, and other lighter, quicker, cheaper deployments to study dedicated bus lanes, bike lanes, third places, crosswalks, pedestrian safety, and development potential at this critical transit node. Refer to image below for more information regarding the location and potential interventions.





This effort will be led by Andrew Howard of Team Better Blocks/WGI and Lynée Wells at Aligned Planning in collaboration with the Rapid, DGRI, and the City of Grand Rapids. Team Better Blocks has implemented similar versions of this tactical deployment throughout the United States while Aligned Planning has implemented several similar efforts throughout Michigan and in Grand Rapids.

The team's proposal includes:

- Site survey and measurements
- Creation of a quick build concept plan
- Meetings with stakeholders and City staff
- Creation of a final build plan and traffic control plan
- Identification of volunteers to assist with tactical build-out
- Building a Better Block tactical build-out (week of 9/28/2020)
- Everyone's Plaza event on October 2, 2020, from 5pm to 9pm
- Data collection and daily monitoring of test site

This project was planned in the FY21 DDA budget as a separate line item for \$50,000. The investment includes consultant fees and all materials and labor to install the temporary/tactical build-out.

Recommendation: Authorize funding in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 for the Wealthy/Division TOD Pilot Project.

SUBJECT: DAKC / Common Notice Phase 2

Goal 2 of GR Forward recommends Creating a True Downtown Neighborhood that is Home to a Diverse Population by requiring "universal design principles in projects with local subsidy" (page 172). Specifically Goal 2 states that "by incorporating these design principles into public projects, the City will send a powerful message of support for all of its residents."

Goal 3 of GR Forward recommends, as part of its **Implementation of a 21st Century Mobility Strategy**, to "provide a stress-free pedestrian experience for all ages and abilities" (page 186).

Finally, Goal 5 of GR Forward recommends to Reinvest in Public Space, Culture, and Inclusive Programming by "rethinking our parks and public spaces to better serve the entire community" (page 264).

To encourage universal design principles, provide stress-free pedestrian experiences for all ages and abilities, and to rethink our parks and public spaces to better serve the entire community, the DDA authorized funding (in June 2019) for *Disability Advocates of Kent County* (DAKC) and the human-centered design firm *Common Notice* to conduct an Accessibility Charrette. This work included utilizing "test pilots" to audit downtown's public spaces (streets, sidewalks, parks, and plazas) and the creation and ideation of a series of accessibility prototypes. *A summary presentation of this work will be given by the Common Notice / DAKC team at the DDA meeting.*

This past work will be continued in FY21 with two distinct projects that help continue our collective accessibility and inclusivity goals.

- 1. The *Inclusive Design 2021 Initiative* will build upon the work from last year's Accessibility Charrette by moving from prototype to programming for the top two prototypes established by the test pilots during the 2019 charrette. These two prototypes include:
 - A comprehensive assessment of Downtown pathways for use by city, building owners, businesses, and downtown stakeholders to better inform decision-making during public realm design.



b. A comprehensive assessment of Downtown's accessible parking and the pathways that connect it to destinations.

This first initiative will also continue inclusive design programming through a series of four additional inclusive design charrettes focused on bringing three additional previously identified prototypes to a point of implementation. These prototypes include:

- a. Targeted expansion of accessible parking
- b. Pedestrian Oasis: how parklets and places to rest help extend journeys
- c. Citizen Navigators + Guided strolls: implementing guided journeys to increase confidence and safety
- 2. An *Adaptive Strategic Plan* that establishes a set of values and design principles that serve as an alignment, communication, and accountability tool for five agencies interdependently building a more accessible Grand Rapids. These agencies include DGRI, City of Grand Rapids, Kent County, The Rapid, and Mobile GR.

These projects were planned in the FY21 DDA budget as a separate line item for \$150,000. The investment includes the professional fees for both the Inclusive Design 2021 Initiative (\$100,000) and the Adaptive Strategic Plan (\$50,000). This is a collaborative effort between DAKC and Common Notice.

Recommendation: Authorize funding in an amount not to exceed \$150,000 for the Inclusive Design 2021 Initiative and the Adaptive Strategic Plan.
