# MICROSOFT TEAMS

## How to Join the Meeting:

- 1. It is recommended to download the App (but not necessary):
  - a. Apple Devices
  - b. Android Devices
- 2. When you click the following link, it will prompt you to choose: Launch App, Download App, or Join by the web. Click here to access the April 20, 2021 Teams meeting.
- 3. Allow access to your mic and camera (this is very important for you to join the conversation).
- **4.** Prior to joining the meeting, it will require you type your name. Make sure your mic and audio are on and click join.

### Virtual Meeting Etiquette:

- Test the app and all technology (including camera/video, Wi-Fi, and audio) before the meeting.
- Always have a contingency plan, you may want to download the app to a second device.
- Mute your microphone when you are not speaking.
- Start a comment by saying your name. Not everyone may recognize your voice. This practice also facilitates the work of the person who is taking minutes.

# Goal 4 Alliance

March 16, 2021

1. Call to order: Mr. Jorge Gonzalez called the meeting to order at 3:07 pm

#### 2. Approval of Minutes

Scott Stenstrom, supported by Caylie Peet, motioned to approve November 24, 2020 Meeting Minutes. None opposed. Motion approved.

#### 3. 2021 Budget Priorities

Mr. Kitavi presented Fiscal Year 2021 priority programs and projects that Goal 4 Alliance (determined to expand job opportunities and ensure the continued vitality of the local economy) had established. These priorities included the Small Business Attraction Grant Program, Incubation Program, Business Resource Fair/Expo, the Doing Small Business Downtown Seminar Series, Downtown Business Association Support, Downtown Retail Marketing, and Data/Research. Due to COVID-19 restrictions and constraints, the programming and business support events did not take place; however, expenditures through the COVID Economic Relief Program have established Social Zones and subsidized winter programming to generate pedestrian traffic throughout downtown. Mr. Kitavi requested feedback as to what programs or projects board members would like to prioritize in FY22 as those budgets are currently being determined for recommendation. Mr. App suggested a rent relief program be created for established small businesses Downtown. Mr. Kitavi stated the

DDA has some restrictions with how funds can be spent and, unfortunately, this type of program would not fall into allowable expenses. Mr. Scales voiced his support for the expansion of the Business Expo which was found to be powerfully encouraging to many small businesses. He stated storytelling should be an area of focus for the next event. Others voiced support for marketing and capitalizing on infrastructure improvements happening Downtown.
