

## World Water Race General Terms and Conditions

1. World Water Race (“the Race”) is open to all registered students on Enactus teams working on water and/or sanitation projects that align with the Enactus Judging Criterion.
2. To join the Race and to be eligible to submit a Progress Report, project teams must have been registered on the online platform and have submitted a completed Action Entry no later than 30 April 2018 at 17:00 GMT.
3. The project submitted may be new or continuing, but must have progress completed between March 2018 and June 2018 to compete for Progress Rewards. The team must also maintain ownership of the project in 2019 to be eligible for scaling funding.
4. All Progress Reports must be received by 1 June 2018 at 17:00 GMT through the online platform. Race teams must also submit a 77-Second Video to be eligible to compete for Progress Rewards. Progress Reports must be submitted in English. 77-Second Videos must be in English or have English subtitles.
5. All eligible Progress Reports will be evaluated using the following criteria.
  - a. SEEING OPPORTUNITY THROUGH SHARED INSIGHTS
    - i. Insights Gathered  
Max Score: 10 points  
Value of information/learnings and clarity of needs assessment
    - ii. Insights Shared  
Max Score: 20 points  
Effective sharing of insights with other Enactus teams
  - b. TAKING ENTREPRENEURIAL ACTION
    - i. Business Innovation  
Max Score: 10 points  
Effective/efficient use of business and innovation in methodology and solution
    - ii. Entrepreneurial Action  
Max Score: 20 points  
Effective/efficient action towards positive impact for people, planet and prosperity
  - c. ENABLING PROGRESS THROUGH POSITIVE IMPACT
    - i. Empowerment  
Max Score: 10 points  
Effective/efficient empowerment of people through transfer of knowledge, skills and/or resources
    - ii. Positive Impact  
Max Score: 20 points  
Clarity and significance of positive impact achieved to date for people, planet and prosperity
    - iii. Sustainability  
Max Score: 10 points  
Effective/efficient sustainability with significant opportunity to scale
6. Progress Reports will go through three levels of evaluation.
  - a. Level 1: A panel of Enactus headquarters and partner employees will review all complete Progress Reports submitted by the deadline. Eligible Progress Reports will be evaluated to determine up to 48 Progress Reports that will move on to Level 2 Evaluation.
  - b. Level 2: Subject matter experts will evaluate up to 48 Progress Reports to determine the top 12 Progress Reports that will move on to Level 3 Evaluation.
  - c. Level 3: World Water Race sponsor representatives will evaluate the top 12 Progress Reports to determine the Final Four project teams who will move on to compete in the World Water Race Impact Competition at Enactus World Cup 2018, taking place in San Jose, California, USA, October 9-11.
7. The Top 12 teams will be eligible to receive a portion of a technology in-kind donation worth up to \$25,000 USD from Dell, to be distributed among the top 12 teams at Dell’s discretion. The top 12 teams will also be invited to attend a collaboration session at Enactus World Cup 2018 in San Jose, California, USA at the team’s own expense.
8. In addition to the above, the Final Four teams will receive a minimum of one 20-minute executive mentorship session from a Race sponsor via Skype or other online conferencing tool. Final Four teams will also receive a travel stipend of up to \$5,000 USD for advancement to the Impact Stage of the competition at Enactus World Cup in San Jose, California, USA. **Travel stipends will be disbursed to the Enactus Country Operation affiliated with the College/University team for administration and/or disbursement.** When possible, the Enactus Country Operation will

directly pay for travel/accommodation-related expenses. Furthermore, the team will receive a minimum of one 20-minute executive mentorship sessions from Roger Love, one of the world's leading authorities on voice and speech training, via Skype or other online conferencing tool.

9. Should an Enactus Country Operation disburse any portion of the travel stipend to an Enactus team, the travel stipend may only be used for the purposes of travel to Enactus World Cup. The team's university administration cannot deduct any fees from the travel stipends.
10. The Final Four teams are subject to an audit, to be conducted by the Enactus Country Operation affiliated with the College/University team. Should a team fail the audit, that team will forfeit their prizes, and the fifth place team (and so on), will assume the team's place in the Impact Stage of the competition at Enactus World Cup. The Top Four teams will compete at the World Water Race Impact Competition at Enactus World Cup 2018 with a 7-minute presentation. Of these four teams, First Place will be awarded \$20,000 USD towards scaling of the winning project. Second Place will be awarded \$10,000 USD towards scaling of the winning project. **Funding will only be disbursed to a banking account owned by the Enactus team, College/University or registered entity associated with the project. Funding will not be disbursed to personal banking accounts.**
11. It is a requirement for the Final Four World Water Race Enactus teams to compete at their country's 2018 Regional or National Competition.
  - a. If your Enactus country has Regional Competitions, you must compete at a Regional Competition. Your team does not have to advance to the National Competition to be eligible for the World Water Race Impact Competition.
  - b. If your Enactus country has a National Competition only, you must compete at the National Competition.
  - c. Project teams that do not compete in their country's competition process are not eligible to compete in the World Water Race Impact Competition.
  - d. Enactus reserves the right to grant exceptions to teams for extenuating circumstances that prevent a team from competing in their country's competition process. Teams seeking an exception due to extenuating circumstances must put their request in writing via email to [waterrace@enactus.org](mailto:waterrace@enactus.org) no later than 1 June 2018. Enactus will review exception requests. Decisions by Enactus are final.
12. To be eligible to compete in the World Water Race Impact Competition, teams must have a minimum of two Enactus students who will serve on the presentation team. Please note that these presenters cannot serve on the Enactus World Cup presentation team, should your team advance as a National Champion to the Enactus World Cup. For any team traveling to the Enactus San Jose, California, USA 9-11 October 2018 you will need at minimum a passport with proper identification; some individuals from specific countries will also need a travel visa. To find out if you need a travel visa, please follow the necessary steps on the United States Government website. Any student serving on the presentation team must have a valid passport (and/or other required documentation) no later than 15 July 2018.
13. The First and Second Place winners of the World Water Race are required to make scheduled progress updates with designated Enactus staff at a minimum of three times after Enactus World Cup 2018: November 2018, April 2019 and August 2019. Progress updates may take place via teleconference or email. At a minimum, the Project Leader and Faculty Advisor are expected to participate in progress updates, but other Enactus members and/or project participants are welcome to participate as well.
14. Monetary rewards will be delivered in two disbursements. First disbursement (50% of monetary reward): The team must submit a current list of anticipated expenses that details how the team will utilize the first disbursement. After the team submits their expenses and the November 2018 progress update is completed, the team will receive the first disbursement. Second disbursement (50% of monetary reward): The team must submit 1) an expense report that details how the first disbursement was spent and 2) a current list of anticipated expenses that details how the team will utilize the second disbursement. After the team submits their expenses and the April 2019 progress update is completed, the team will receive the second disbursement. Monetary rewards may only be expended or committed for the purposes and time period as reported during progress updates. Any amendments to the budget of monetary rewards must be agreed upon in advance in writing with designated Enactus staff.
15. By submitting a Progress Report for the World Water Race, project teams acknowledge and agree that:
  - a. Falsely, consciously, and deliberately over-stating the reach, impact and/or qualitative and quantitative results of any project is an offence for disqualification.
  - b. It is an offence for disqualification to plagiarize, claim or present a project that a team did not implement or did not contribute to.
  - c. We will clearly identify key project partners and distinguish the activities and outcomes achieved by the partner vs. the Enactus team.

- d. With regards to continuing projects, teams must indicate in Race submissions the specific activities undertaken since March 2018, thereby clearly differentiating actions taken this year from those of previous years. Teams must also ensure that the submission of anticipated/future outcomes are clearly identified as 'projections' and not as results already achieved.
  - e. Teams will provide any additional information and support documentation about their project upon request by the Enactus office.
16. Race participants and/or project teams who do not honor any of the above points will become ineligible for Race rewards and/or will be disqualified from the Race.
  17. Participating Enactus teams permit Enactus and Race sponsors to publicize any information provided by the team in connection to the World Water Race.
  18. All materials submitted to the World Water Race must be either 1) original work of and owned by the Enactus team or 2) in the case of a team working with another entity, the team must credit and have permission to use the entity's work. Note: any projects working in partnership with another entity will need to be defined and validated in the Progress Report.
  19. All entries become the property of Enactus and Race sponsors and will not be returned. By entering, each entrant team forfeits to Enactus and Race sponsors all rights to content of its Entry and concepts embodied therein. Entrant unconditionally assigns and transfers to Enactus and Race sponsors all rights, title, interest and claims, which it now has or may in the future have to the entries or any element(s) thereafter including without limitation, the copyright therein. By entering, entrant teams agree that they have no right to bring (and covenant not to bring) any claim, action, or proceeding of any kind or nature whatsoever against Enactus or Race sponsors, or any of their respective affiliated companies, subsidiaries, officers, directors, employees, agents, assigns or shareholders in connection with World Water Race.
  20. Participating Enactus teams may not act in violation of any Anti-Terrorism Law, as defined by any Law relating to terrorism or money-laundering, including Executive Order No. 13224 and the USA Patriot Act. Participating Enactus teams may not include a Prohibited Person—one who commits, threatens or conspires to commit terrorism as defined in Executive Order No. 13224—and/or conduct any business for the benefit of any Prohibited Person.
  21. Participating Enactus teams agree to comply with all relevant anti-corruption laws and regulations and certify that no payments of money or anything of value will be offered, promised, given, or paid, directly or indirectly to any political party, party official, government employee or candidate for public or political office in order to induce such officials to use their influence with a government or instrumentality to obtain an improper business advantage for any Race sponsor or Enactus entity. Enactus and Race sponsors reserve the right to inspect team records to verify compliance with the requirements of any anti-corruption or anti-bribery law.
  22. Race participants must abide by the Enactus Community Guidelines.
