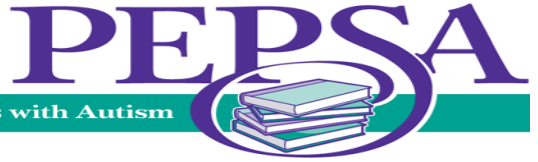

Training Description

The Autism Boot Camp is recommended for teachers, paraprofessionals, administrators and other professionals without prior training in ASD programming. This two-day intensive seminar will cover the basics of ASD programming, TEACCH, classroom arrangement, best practices overview, and IEP development. **Boot Camp participants may also attend days 3-5 of the Summer institute.**

The 2010 Summer Institute will provide educator tracks based on student focus (PreK, Elementary, Middle/High School) to better address the needs of teachers and teacher assistants/paraprofessionals. Featured topics include PreK issues in ASD, Beyond Teamwork, Social Skills Instruction, Creation of Vocational Opportunities, Using Technology to Enhance Instruction, Overview of Vizzle and Unique Learning, Working with Difficult to Teach Students, Panel Discussions, Video and Live Demonstration, and Implementation Activities. Childcare may be possible. Training is appropriate for teachers, SLPs, paraprofessionals, behavior specialists and administrators.

Each day will have a specific focus:

Monday, 8/2 – Social Skills Instruction: Who, What, Where, When, How?

Tuesday 8/3 – Keynote: Positive Mental Attitude & Motivation for Success: Getting It, Using It, Keeping It

Tuesday 8/3 – Be All that You Can Be: Best Practices in ASD

Wed 8/4 –Power to the Paras: Special Day-long track for Classroom Assistants

Wed 8/4 – Powerful teaching, powerful classrooms: Using Evidence-based practices and Technology for Maximum Outcomes

Thursday 8/5—Effective Teaching Practices for the Difficult to Reach Student

Thursday 8/5—Welcome to My Strange Little World: Strategies for students with Asperger’s and High Functioning Autism

Friday 8/6 – Power to the People: Panel Discussions with Parents, Young Adults with ASD, and ASD Model Teachers
