Poll workers are paid for their services.

All poll workers must be able to perform several essential job functions, including:

- The ability to move and assemble forty pound voting equipment with the assistance of other poll workers.
- The visual ability to read precinct registers, ballots, as well as other clerical work assigned by the Clerk.
- The ability to deal with the public in a courteous, patient, and efficient manner.
- The ability to sustain long periods of sitting and standing throughout the day as the demands of the voters may require.
- The ability to do basic math and complete forms for ballot accounting.

Additionally, all poll workers must be registered voters and be willing and able to remain inside the polling room from 6:00 a.m. until dismissed by the Clerk when work is completed after the 7:00 p.m. poll closing. The only exceptions to this requirement are for eating, using the restrooms, outside smoking breaks, if permitted, and only with the Clerk's permission.

Pursuant to F.S. 102.014 (1), all poll workers are required to attend a training session prior to each election.
