2 Peter 1:5-8 reads, "But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, to knowledge self-control, to selfcontrol perseverance, to perseverance godliness, to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love. For if theses things are yours, and abound, you will be neither barren or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."
