**Minimum Qualifications:**

1. Must be 18 years of age; and bring proof when you fill out the application.

Note: Employer may also require a drug test. Employer may require a current valid driver's license.

**Work Description:**

6000 hours (approximately 3 to 3.5 years) on the job training will be required to complete the program.

Plasterers are responsible for finish interior walls and ceilings of residential and commercial buildings, apply plaster on masonry, metal and wire lath or gypsum. They also apply cement on masonry, metal and wire lath (stucco). Sprayed-on plaster, Acoustic Fireproofing and Radiant heat. Mixing materials and plaster repairs.

Mobile, have reliable transportation and the ability to travel to various job locations on a daily basis.

**Veterans** that have GI benefits may use them in this program.

An equal employment opportunity program. Women and minorities are encouraged to apply.

The completed packet must be returned to the above address before your interview.

**Valid Driver License or ID will be required at the time of application.** Failure to bring this document will mean applicant cannot fill out an application or be scheduled for an interview. All applicants that meet these minimum qualifications will be scheduled for an orientation and interview.

### Interview:

2. Applicants are required to attend the orientation.
3. All applicants will be interviewed, scored, ranked and placed on the ranked pool of eligibles list.
4. Applicants will be dispatched in ranked order according to the initial employment policy.
5. You will receive information about sign up and related training at the Plasterers Union Office.
6. All individuals that are placed on the "Ranked List" will retain their position for two years. Individuals will be dropped from the list for refusing a job assignment or no communication with the union dispatch office and Coordinator.

### Work Processes:

a. Applying veneer plaster:	500 hours
b. Mixing material	500 hours
c. Rodding walls	400 hours
d. Browning walls	400 hours
e. Exterior Stucco	1000 hours
f. Applying Finish	1000 hours
g. Scaffold-Covering	200 hours
h. Patching Plaster	250 hours
i. Fireproofing	500 hours
j. EIFS systems	1000 hours
k. Miscellaneous	250 hours

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**Related Training:**

Approximately 160 hours first year, 160 hours second year, 160 hours third year, of related training shall be required each year unless determined otherwise by the apprenticeship committee. Related training may cover the following subjects:

- a. Safety
- b. Tools, Terms, Scaffolds
- c. Hawk and Trowel, Stilts
- d. Materials II and Bases
- e. Applying the Base Coat
- f. Applying the Finish Coat
- g. Materials III
- h. Repairs
- i. Basic Layout
- j. Special Finishes
- k. Sprayed-on Plaster, Acoustic Fireproofing, Radiant Heat
- l. Drywall and Veneer Base, Hanging and Finishing
- m. Blueprints, Quantities, Codes and Regulations

**Wage Schedule:**

The average wage for those journeypersons employed by a participating employer in the occupation on the July 1, 2019 is \$36.97.

The progressive wage rate to be paid the apprentice is:

1 <sup>st</sup>	0 to 500 hour period	60% of average wage
2 <sup>nd</sup>	501 to 1000 hour period	65% of average wage
3 <sup>rd</sup>	1001 to 2000 hour period	70% of average wage
4 <sup>th</sup>	2001 to 3000 hour period	75% of average wage
5 <sup>th</sup>	3001 to 4000 hour period	80% of average wage
6 <sup>th</sup>	4001 to 5000 hour period	85% of average wage
7 <sup>th</sup>	5001 to 6000 hour period	90% of average wage

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
