For the first time there will be youth and adult showmanship classes. During the show a sandwich lunch will be provided by the Board of Directors at no cost to anyone who would like to eat something. Information for the show is as follows.

GENERAL RULES

- *Any Normande breeder or owner is eligible to exhibit at the show.
- *Cattle exhibited must be registered or eligible for registration in the North American Normande Association herd book. Animals recorded in another breed association herd book qualify as long as exhibitor submits a copy of the other Association's registration paper to a NANA representative prior to 11:00 am on October 1, 2016.
- *Cattle can arrive no earlier than 8 am Friday September 30, 2016.
- *Cattle will be released as soon as the show is over.

- *Exhibitors are expected to assist with the cleaning of the barns immediately after the show. (A skid steer and spreaders will be there to make it easier and quicker.)
- *Cattle must have at least 50% Normande genetics.
- *IF ANIMALS ARE NOT YET REGISTERED THERE WILL BE REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE AT THE SHOW AND CAN BE SUBMITTED TO THE NANA REGISTRY SECRETARY BEFORE 11:00 AM ON OCTOBER 1, 2016

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS (See Wisconsin regulations below.)

JUDGING

- *Showmanship classes will be judge before placings classes.
- *Separate classes will be held for dairy and beef Normandes.
- *See entry form for class selections. If a class has less than 2 entries, it may be combined with another class. If a class has a large number of entries it may be split into two or three classes.
- *Class order will be Bulls, Heifers and Cows. During the show classes will alternate between beef and dairy entries.
- *Qualified judges will be hired to place each class.
- *Ribbons will be awarded to the first three places in every class and trophies/platters will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion is each division.

FACILITIES

The Iowa County Fairground is located on Fair Street in Mineral Point, WI.

No bedding or feed will be provided; all exhibiters must bring their own.

RV or camper parking is available at the fairgrounds and several motels are located in Mineral Point.

WISCONSIN HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE

<u>Cattle originating from within Wisconsin:</u> There are no test or health document requirements for cattle from within Wisconsin.

<u>Cattle originating from outside of Wisconsin:</u> A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall accompany all cattle documenting animal identification and all tests or certificates required.

Steers are exemption from any brucellosis test requirement.

Cattle from Brucellosis Certified Free herds in Class A states may enter Wisconsin without a prior brucellosis test if the certified herd number and the last test date appear on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

All cattle originating from Tuberculosis <u>Modified Accredited Advanced</u> states shall have a negative tuberculosis test within 60 days of entering Wisconsin; these states are Minnesota and New Mexico. Call the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health for a current listing of these states. (608-224-4872) Dairy animals from states not recognizing Wisconsin's Tuberculosis Free status shall be required to have a negative tuberculosis test within 60 days of coming into Wisconsin. These states currently include: Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut (beef also), Georgia, Idaho, Indiana, Kansas, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska (beef also), Nevada, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania (beef also), South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Washington, West Virginia (beef also) and Wyoming. Call the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872) to check on the current status of your state if you do not know it.

Cattle originating from Tuberculosis Accredited Free herds (except MI) may enter Wisconsin without a prior test if the accredited herd number appears on the Certificate of Inspection.

Cattle originating from Michigan must have a permit number and require special tuberculosis testing. Call the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872) to determine testing requirements.

If you have any questions about what is needed to bring your cattle into Wisconsin contact your veterinarian or the Wisconsin Division of Animal Health (608-224-4872).

Tammy Voegeli will be our judge for the dairy show.

Tammy hails from Arlington Wisconsin and VoGrin Swiss

Farms. She farms with her parents where they milk 80

cows. Tammy and her boyfriend, Allyn Paulson, also own and operate PV Boarding & Paule View Transport. They board show cattle for various clients and also transport cattle from coast to coast. They have a 2 year old son, Dakota who already has the bug for showing cattle.

Tammy actively exhibits at local, state and national levels. She has be very successful in owning or housing All Americans in four dairy breeds. She is an accomplished dairy cattle judge and has judged the WI State Jr Fair and

the Illinois Jr State Fair, along with many county fairs and district youth shows. Prior to judging the NANA show this fall she will be placing dairy animals at the National Cattle Congress in Waterloo, IA in the middle of September.



Judging the beef show will be Cody Quam of Lodi, WI. Cody and his wife, Tracy, along with Cody's parents own and operate Marda Angus Farms. They run 120 elite registered Angus cows and crop 900 acres of land. Marda Angus Farms has privately sold Angus breeding stock to many parts of the United States and in some of the most prestigious public Angus sales, including the National Western Stock Show Angus Bull Sale and the World Beef Expo Showcase Sale. And they have held herd production sales on their farm as well.

Cody has served on the Wisconsin Angus Association Board of Directors. He currently serves as the president of the World Beef Expo Board of Directors and as the chairman of the Wisconsin Farm

Technology Days Beef Tent Coordinating Committee for the Wisconsin Cattlemen's Association.

NORMANDES PROMOTED IN NEW YORK

In November of 2013 tragedy struck the family of Richard and Caroline Dibble of West Winfield, NY, when their son Elijah was killed in a bicycle/car accident. Elijah loved his Normande cow, Cinnamon, and had a very special bond with her. To honor and memorialize Elijah, the Dibbles created the Hooves and Boots Heifer Program through which they give a Normande heifer to a young person in the New York state area. (This program is much like NANA's Youth Heifer Program.)



In 2015 Dylan Dyn of Jordanville, NY, received a heifer through the Dibble's Hooves and Boots Heifer Program. The heifer, HHA Mr Payday Snowflake is a daughter of SGF Mr Payday 25TK. Dylan had very good success when he showed Snowflake at the Herkimer County Fair. They stood first in their showmanship class and Dylan received quite a bit of attention from the judge and spectators for Snowflake's size and beauty. She weighs 1295 pounds and Dylan is excited to show her next year as a cow/calf pair, as she is due with her first calf in February, 2017.

Rich Dibble writes the following about the 2016 award: "The 2016 Hooves and Boots Award went to Jonas Meays of Holland Patent, NY. When it was time to select a winner we did not yet have a heifer to give, so we had to give Jonas an IOU. The award is in memory of Eli Dibble, so we were pleased that his favorite cow, Cinnamon, gave us a heifer for Jonas. I whispered in her ear that a boy was counting on her and next thing you know she delivered another heifer. We were touched that Jonas named her Cassia because it is a derivative of Cinnamon. It was heartwarming to see Jonas and Cassia together, and we are sure they will be a blessing to one another. The Meays family does not run a commercial dairy, but they do have a small herd of family cows of different varieties and we are sure she will get great care and lots of attention. Cassia came a little too late to make the show circuit this year but, eager to show, Jonas leased one of our heifers from last year for 2016 and will show Cassia as his own next year. It has been our privilege to get to know this fine family a little better at the shows and we wish them well and welcome to the Normande family."



Jonas Meays writes this about his leased managerial heifer: "I had a busy summer caring for and showing a leased Normande heifer, Lilly. I showed Lilly as a beef heifer at the Farmer's Museum Junior Livestock Show in Cooperstown, and at the Boonville Fair. In Cooperstown, Lilly was awarded Grand Champion of the Normande breed, and in Boonville, Lilly was awarded Reserve Grand Champion, and I was selected Reserve Novice Showman. It was an exciting show season for both of us! I have also been busy getting to know and work with my Normande heifer calf, Cassia, whom I was awarded this

spring through the Hooves and Boots Award. She is getting bigger each day, and I have been working with her to have her halter trained and leading well before she gets any bigger!

I have really enjoyed learning about how to show beef cattle this summer. I also enjoyed the experience of caring for a leased heifer, and raising my new calf Cassia."

But giving away two Normande heifers in their sons memory still was not enough for Richard and Caroline Dibble. They have a young friend who had gone to school with Elijah and fell in love with their Normandes and wanted to buy a heifer to show. But because they had no extra heifers to sell, Richard and Caroline leased a bred heifer as a managerial project to Jordynn Alesia of West Winfield, NY until she is able to purchase a Normande. Jordynn was asked to provide some information about her heifer and showing. The heifer's name is HHA Diametrius Aravis and is sired by SGF Diametrius.

Here is what Jordynn submitted about her heifer. "This year I had the privilege of leasing a gorgeous Normande heifer. I got to experience a lot having her around for the summer. Being that she was a bred heifer I had to make sure I paid even closer attention to her. It was a ton of fun having her around. I showed Aravis, my leased heifer, at two local shows. The first was The Farmer's Museum Junior Livestock Show in Cooperstown, NY. This is a youth only show, so you are only competing against kids ages 8 to 19 years old. There I received Grand and Senior Champion, but the more important thing was letting people see and learn more about this not so common breed of cows. I also showed her at my county fair which is the Herkimer County Fair in Frankfort, NY. Here I also received Grand and Senior


