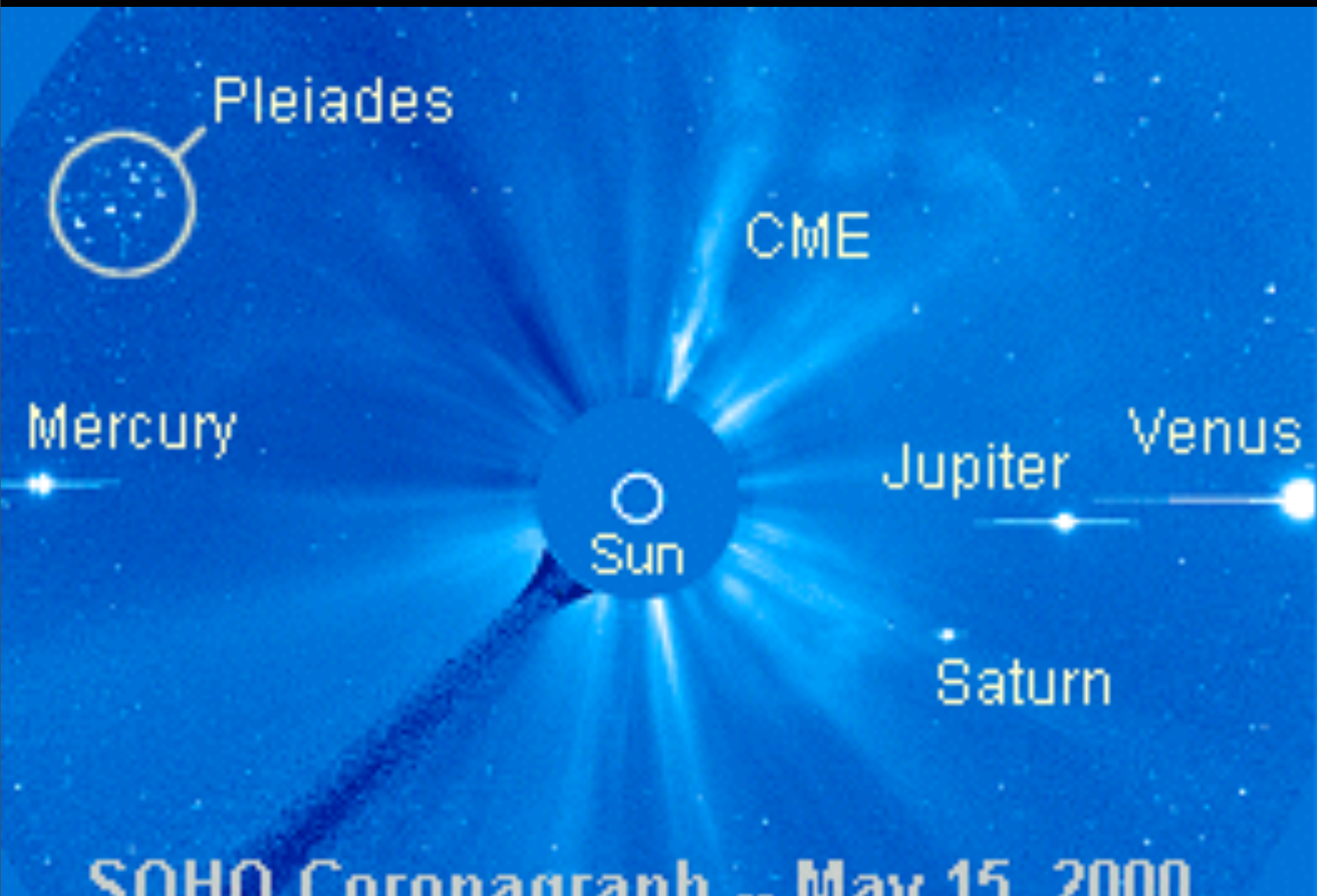

[2:1] Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men [*Magi*] from the east came to Jerusalem, [2] saying, “Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.” [3] When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; [4] and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. [5] They told him, “In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:

[6] ““And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,
are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;
for from you shall come a ruler
who will shepherd my people Israel.””

[7] Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. [8] And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, “Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him.” [9] After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. [10] When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. [11] And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. [12] And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.

advent |'ad,vent|

the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event: *the advent of Jesus*.

- (**Advent**) the first season of the Christian church year, leading up to Christmas and including the four preceding Sundays.
- (**Advent**) In Christian Theology, the coming or second coming of Christ.

ORIGIN Old English, from Latin *adventus* 'arrival,' from *advenire*, from *ad-* 'to' + *venire* 'come.'

adventure |ad'venCHər, əd-|

an unusual and exciting, typically hazardous, experience or activity: *Their recent adventures before Herod the great in Jerusalem...*

- daring and exciting activity calling for enterprise and enthusiasm: *she traveled the world in search of adventure | a sense of adventure.*
- [archaic] a commercial speculation.

verb [no obj.] dated

engage in hazardous and exciting activity, esp. the exploration of unknown territory: *they had **adventured into** the forest.*

- [with obj.] dated. put (something, esp. money or one's life) at risk: *he adventured \$3,000 in the purchase of land.*

ORIGIN Middle English: from Old French **aventure** (noun), **aventurer** (verb), based on Latin **adventurus** ‘*about to happen,*’ from **advenire** ‘*arrive.*

He always guides us to bow before Jesus.

No two journeys are ever the same with our incredibly creative God.

Guidance can be extra-terrestrial like Angels and Stars, or He can guide us in dreams & visions, but often it's more like an inner nudge or 'knowing'.

Dallas Willard says the the more mature our relationship with God the less we will seek & depend on the super-natural means.

We'll shift into knowing and doing as a result of walking with God and knowing His voice and even being guided by his gaze.

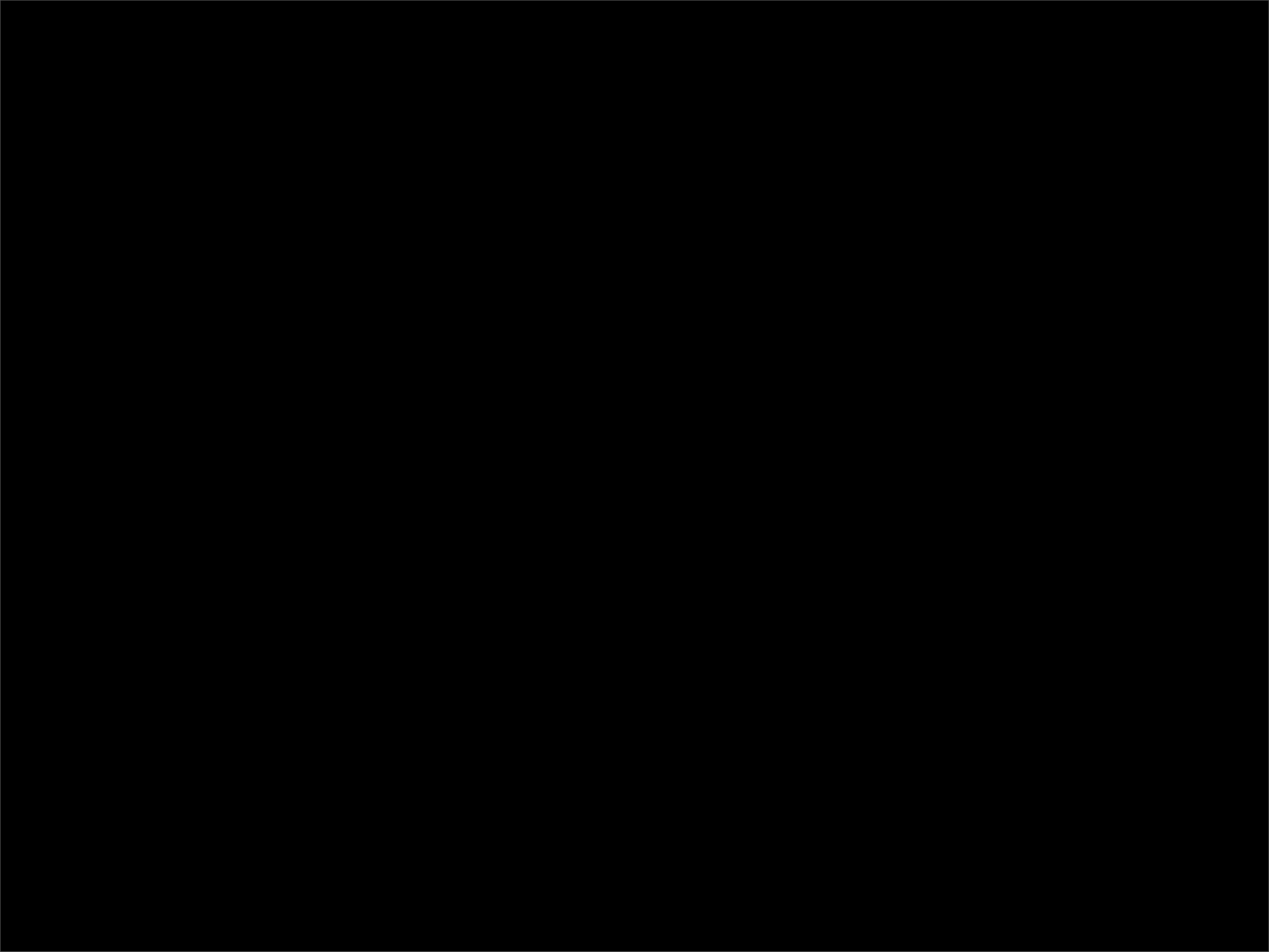
Who or what could stop you on your way to worship Jesus right now?
