The four-time defending AFC West champion San Diego Chargers will close out the preseason on the road Thursday night against the San Francisco 49ers at Candlestick Park. Kickoff is 7:00 pm PDT.

The Chargers fell to 1-2 this preseason following a 36-21 loss in New Orleans last Friday night. A win over the 49ers would give the Chargers their 11th straight non-losing preseason (2-2 or better). San Francisco is a perfect 3-0 this preseason with wins over Indianapolis, Minnesota and Oakland. This is the ninth year in a row that the Chargers and 49ers have met in the preseason finale.

Familiar Faces

For the Chargers, Owner **Alex Spanos** makes his home in the Northern California city of Stockton. Head Coach **Norv Turner** is a native of Martinez, Calif. and spent the 2006 season as the 49ers' offensive coordinator. Defensive Coordinator **Ron Rivera** was born in Fort Ord, Calif. and grew up in Marina. Rivera also was a collegiate linebacker at Cal-Berkeley. Assistant secondary coach **Cris Dishman** spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Menlo College in the Bay Area. Running Backs coach **Ollie Wilson** held the same post at Cal from 1983-90. Director of player personnel **Jimmy Raye** is the son of 49ers' offensive coordinator **Jimmy Raye III**. Long snapper **David Binn** is from San Mateo, Calif. (San Mateo HS and Cal). WR **Malcom Floyd** is from Sacramento (River City HS). Cornerback **Donald Strickland** is from San Francisco (Archbishop Riordan HS) and fellow CB **Dante Hughes** went to Cal. Linebacker **Donald Butler** is from Fair Oaks, Calif (Del Campo HS). Wide receiver **Seyi Ajirotutu** is from El Dorado Hills (Oak Ridge HS).

For the 49ers, defensive coordinator **Greg Manusky**, quarterbacks coach **Mike Johnson** and wide receivers coach **Jerry Sullivan** are all former Chargers assistant coaches. Quarterback **Alex Smith** is from La Mesa, Calif. (Helix HS). Linebacker **Matt Wilhelm** played for the Chargers from 2003-08.

Series History

Nearly annual combatants in the preseason, Thursday night's game will mark the 39th preseason meeting between the Chargers and 49ers, with the Bolts holding a slight 20-18 series edge. The Chargers have won the last three preseason games, including a 20-17 win in the last one played at Candlestick Park in 2008.

What's rare, however, is the teams meeting in the regular season, which they will do Dec. 16 in San Diego. There have been only 11 regular-season meetings and the 49ers hold the edge there, 6-5, but the Chargers have won the last two, including a 48-19 win in the last in 2006. The Chargers and 49ers also met in San Diego's only Super Bowl (XXIX) following the 1994 season.

A Look Back at Last Week's Game

The Chargers' starters played into the third quarter against the defending Super Bowl champion New Orleans Saints and trailed just 17-14 before turning the contest over to the reserves.

Philip Rivers went 16 of 27 for 167 yards with a touchdown in 2 1/2 quarters of work, hooking up with **Antonio Gates** for a team-leading five catches and 66 yards, and with **Malcom Floyd** for a nine-yard touchdown late in the second quarter. During the touchdown drive, Gates had a 29-yard catch to the Saints' 23, the Chargers' longest of the night, and Floyd had a 14-yarder, along with an eight-yarder on a 3rd-and-5 to keep the drive alive.

Mike Scifres had an excellent night punting the football, forcing the Saints to start drives from their own 7, 10, 9, 16 and 17-yard lines.

Louisiana native **Jacob Hester** scored the game's first touchdown on a six-yard run in his first-ever NFL game in his home state.

Eric Weddle ended the Saints' first drive of the night with an eight-yard sack on 3rd down.

Antoine Cason ended New Orleans' first two drives of the third quarter with pass breakups on consecutive third-down plays and finished the night with a team-high four passes defended. **Nathan Vasher** collected an interception in the fourth quarter, his first of the preseason, to set up a touchdown that brought the Chargers to within five points, 26-21.

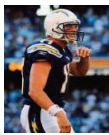
A Look Back at Week 2 vs. Dallas

The Chargers fell to the Dallas Cowboys, 16-14, on a late safety, but out-gained Dallas by 100 yards of total offense (294 to 194), including a 92-54 edge on the ground.

Stephen Cooper and **Eric Weddle** combined to set up the Chargers' first touchdown as Cooper blasted Dallas QB **Tony Romo** and the errant pass landed right in the waiting arms of Weddle. Eleven plays later, **Philip Rivers** scored on a one-yard sneak for a 7-0 lead. The TD drive was highlighted by **Antonio Gates'** seven-yard catch on 4th-and-4.

Seyi Ajirotutu set up the Chargers' second touchdown of the night with a 56-yard catch down to the four, leading to a **Marcus Mason** four-yard touchdown run two plays later. Ajirotutu, a rookie and former roommate of **Ryan Mathews** at Fresno State, had a game-high 71 yards on three catches vs. Dallas. Mathews led the team in rushing with 53 yards on 12 carries, a 4.4-yard average.

Antwan Applewhite had his team-leading third sack of the preseason in the fourth quarter, this one a nine-yarder on a 3rd-and-12 to force a Cowboys punt.

A Look Back at Week 1 vs. Chicago

The Chargers beat the Chicago, 25-10, outgaining the Bears 120-48 on the ground.

The Chargers defense held Chicago to just 48 yards rushing and recorded six sacks, while the Bolts quarterbacks were only sacked one time. The Chargers' starting left tackle duo of **Brandyn Dombrowski** and **Tyronne Green** held Bears All-Pro defensive end **Julius Peppers** in check, not allowing Peppers to record a tackle or a sack.

Philip Rivers gave the Chargers a 7-3 lead on a 28-yard TD pass to **Legedu Naanee**. Rookie **Richard Goodman** ignited the drive with a 51-yard kickoff return and **Buster Davis** kept the drive moving with a big 22-yard catch on a 3rd-and-10.

Ryan Mathews made his Chargers debut and rushed for a game-high 50 yards. The highlight was a game-long 18-yard run in which he broke away from Bears linebacker **Lance Briggs** near the Chargers' own goal line.

Mike Tolbert gave the Chargers a 14-10 lead at halftime with a bruising one-yard touchdown run just before the end of the second quarter.

Paul Oliver had an interception and a fumble recovery on consecutive possessions in the third quarter, both of which resulted in Chargers field goals. He returned the interception 38 yards to the 11, and on the fumble recovery made a heads-up play to push away a Bears player to keep the ball alive and secure the recovery.

Antwan Applewhite had two sacks for 28 yards in losses. He forced a fumble on the first which Oliver recovered, leading to a field goal for a 20-10 lead.

Kevin Burnett had a sack and five tackles while delivering several crushing blows.

Brandon Lang blocked a punt out of the back of the end zone for a safety, while also contributing a tackle for loss and a pressure on the play in which Applewhite recorded the sack and forced fumble.

Donald Strickland had a big night, recording a six-yard sack on a corner blitz, and then forcing a punt and near interception on the next series by drilling Bears quarterback Caleb Hanie on a 3rd-and-9 play.

Cam Thomas was solid with a sack, three tackles, a forced fumble and two passes defensed in his NFL debut.



New Faces

The entire Chargers coaching staff returns intact from 2009. The team returns 42 veterans that saw playing time during last season's 13-3 campaign.

Among the new veteran players added for 2010 are:

Donald Strickland (CB) — 58 career NFL games played, 185 career tackles and two interceptions

Nathan Vasher (CB) — 73 career games played, 185 tackles and 19 career interceptions, including a career-best eight in 2005

Randy McMichael (TE) — 116 career games played in eight seasons, logging 367 career catches, 3,996 yards and 22 touchdowns

Josh Reed (WR) — 115 career games played, 311 career catches for 3,575 yards and 10 TDs

Draft nets six

The Chargers added six players in the 2010 NFL Draft, starting with first-round pick **Ryan Mathews**, a running back out of Fresno State. Here's a glimpse of the team's most recent draft class

Ryan Mathews (RB) — 3,280 career yards and a school record 39 touchdowns at Fresno St., including an NCAA-leading 1,808 yards and 19 TDs as a junior in 2009

Donald Butler (LB) — 238 career tackles, 28 tackles for loss and four sacks at Washington, but suffered torn Achilles in left leg Aug. 2 and will miss the 2010 season.

Darrell Stuckey (S) — 295 career tackles, including 11 behind the line of scrimmage for the Kansas Jayhawks.

Cam Thomas (DT) — 83 career tackles at North Carolina and anchor of the ACC's leading run defense (10th nationally) in 2009

Jonathan Crompton (QB) — 2,800 yards and 27 TD passes as a senior at Tennessee

Dedrick Epps (TE) — versatile offensive player finished career at Miami (Fla.) with 634 yards receiving and six touchdown catches

Streaks

The **Chargers** have scored at least 25 points per game for six straight seasons. The last team to post such numbers in six consecutive seasons was the Cleveland Browns from 1950-55.

The **Chargers** have won four-straight AFC West titles and five of the last six. In the last four years, the Chargers are 20-4 against their divisional foes, going 5-1 each year. The Chargers have won 13 in a row against Oakland, five in a row against Kansas City, and six of their last eight against Denver, including the last meeting in '09.

Philip Rivers embarks on 2010 having thrown a touchdown pass in 13 consecutive games. His career best is 16-straight and the team record for consecutive games with a touchdown pass is 20 (**Dan Fouts**). The Chargers' third game this season is Sept. 26 at Seattle and its seventh is Oct. 24 against New England.

Rivers owns the NFL's longest streak of regular-season games started without throwing three or more interceptions (64) at the start of a career. The previous record (57) had been established by Hall of Fame quarterback **Joe Montana**.

Rivers is the only quarterback in the NFL to post a season passer rating over 100 each of the last two seasons. He had a career-best 105.5 season in 2008 and rated at 104.4 in 2009. Quarterback ratings are based on a complex formula that factors in attempts, completions, yards, touchdowns and interceptions.

Rivers has thrown for 4,000-plus yards each of the last two seasons. The team record is three straight, set by Fouts from 1979-81.

Rivers has led the Chargers to four straight AFC West titles. He's 20-4 in AFC West games; 49-22 (.690) for his career as a starter (including playoffs); 28-8 (.778) at Qualcomm Stadium, and 18-0 in December.

Antonio Gates is the only NFL player with at least eight touchdown catches in each of the last six seasons.

Stephen Cooper has led the Chargers in tackles each of the last three seasons. Cooper had a career-high 179 in 2007, 136 in 2008 and 119 in 2009.

Nate Kaeding embarks on the '10 season with a streak of 63 straight made field goals of 40 yards or less in the regular season. He's also made his last 20 regular-season attempts. The team record for consecutive made field goals in the regular season is 29.



Turner reigning Coach of the Year

Norv Turner, NFL Coach of the Year by *USA Today* in 2009, has led the Chargers to three-straight AFC West titles in his first three seasons as head coach. He's the first Chargers' coach to accomplish the feat and the first NFL coach to do so since Dallas' **Barry Switzer** (1994-96).

At 35-18 (.648), including playoffs, Turner has the highest winning percentage in franchise history. His 32-16 (.667) regular season mark also is the highest as is his 3-3 (.500) mark (tied) in the playoffs.

With Turner calling the offensive plays, the Chargers ranked fourth in the NFL in scoring in 2009, averaging 28.4 points per game (454 total). It's the sixth year in a row that the Chargers have averaged 25-or-more points per game, including three-straight under Turner. The last team to average that many points for six consecutive seasons was the Cleveland Browns (1950-55).

The Chargers ranked 10th in the NFL in total offense (360.1 ypg) in 2009 after ranking 11th (349.0) in 2008.

Under Turner, the Chargers were one of the most disciplined teams in the NFL in '09. The team was flagged just 78 times, fewest ever in a 16-game season in franchise history. The 78 penalties tied for fourth-fewest in the league, while their 570 penalty yards allowed, was third-fewest.



A Look Back at 2009

The Chargers went 13-3 in 2009, including an 11-game win streak to close out the regular season. Their year ended, however, in the AFC Division Playoffs with a 17-14 loss to the New York Jets. The Chargers' 13 regular-season wins were the second most in team history and the team's final record included a franchise-best 7-1 mark on the road, a record of 5-1 in AFC West games and a perfect 4-0 mark against '09 opponents from the NFC East.

The Chargers won the AFC West for the fourth year in a row and the fifth time in the last six seasons.

The Bolts' 11-game regular-season win streak, which is still active, is tied for the second-longest in franchise history.

The Chargers also went a perfect 4-0 in December, running their NFL record of consecutive wins in that month to 18.

Many individuals garnered accolades in 2009. **Norv Turner** was named **NFL Coach of the Year** by *USA Today*. **Philip Rivers**, **Antonio Gates**, **Kris Dielman** and **Nate Kaeding** were selected to the Pro Bowl. Rivers passed for a career-high 4,254 yards. **Gates** set a career high with 1,157 yards receiving, as did wide receiver **Malcom Floyd** (776 yards). **Darren Sproles** had a career-best 840 combined rushing and receiving yards, and scored a career-best seven combined touchdowns. **Legedu Naanee** had a career-high 242 yards receiving and caught his first two career regular-season touchdown passes. And **Mike Tolbert** had a career-high 340 combined rush and receiving yards, and a career-best four touchdowns. **Steven Cooper** led the team in tackles for the third-consecutive year with 119. The Chargers outscored opponents by 52 points in the first quarter (103-51) in '09, the third-highest scoring disparity in the NFL.

A Look Back at 2009, cont.

The Chargers scored on 37 of their last 39 red zone possessions (25 touchdowns and 12 field goals) in '09. For the year, the team scored on 56 of 63 red-zone possessions (.889), tied for the third-highest scoring percentage in the NFL.

The Chargers were one of the NFL's best at moving the chains in '09. In 170 offensive possessions, the offense only had 28 drives end in three-and-outs (16.5%). It was the second-lowest percentage of three-and-outs in the NFL.
