<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Troop Committee</b>	Troop Committee meets every second Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Scout Hut. All parents are welcome to attend and participate, however issues requiring a vote are left to designated committee members.	2 hours/month for meetings. Additional time varies according to position
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Events Coordinator</b>	Work within a team to help coordinate logistics for certain special events (forms, payments, etc.)	Depending upon the event. Generally 1-2 hours total per event
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Permits Coordinator</b>	Secure necessary permits for all outdoor events. Generally can be done online, but may require periodic travel to Aloha Council's office in Nuuanu.	Depending upon the event. Generally 30-45 minutes per event, excluding driving time
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Transportation Coordinator</b>	Arrange and coordinate transportation to and from events. Work with transportation assistance volunteers.	Phone calls, emails, and announcements take roughly 30-45 minutes per event
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Transportation Assistance</b>	Help pickup and dropoff scouts at outdoor events. Need to register your vehicle by completing the Troop 33 Registration and Waiver Form.	Driving to and from the event with the Scout Hut as the usual origin
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Merit Badge Counselors</b>	Teach merit badge classes on a wide variety of subjects. You do not have to be an expert in that particular field. Teaching materials are provided.	Depending upon the badge. Generally 4-12 hours of instruction over several days
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Board of Review</b>	Be on a panel of three adults interviewing scouts who are advancing in rank. A great opportunity to get to know our scouts better.	Board of Review is held once a month on a Friday evening and takes approximately 90 minutes
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Friends of Scouting</b>	Be our troop's liaison with Aloha Council for this annual BSA fundraising event. Involves the collection of donations from scouts and their families.	Phone calls, emails, announcements, and collections total roughly 3 hours over a one month period
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Makahiki Ticket Sales</b>	Be our troop's liaison with Aloha Council for this annual BSA fundraising event. Involves the collection of donations from scouts and their families and the distribution of prizes.	February/March. Varies according to total number of helpers involved
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Popcorn Sales</b>	Be our troop's liaison with Aloha Council for this annual BSA fundraising event. Involves the pickup and distribution of popcorn and prizes.	September/October. Varies according to total number of helpers involved
<input type="checkbox"/>		<b>Refreshments</b>	Help coordinate food and drink contributions for special events such as Court of Honor, Christmas Party, Good Turn, etc.	Phone calls, emails, and announcements take roughly 30-45 minutes per event
