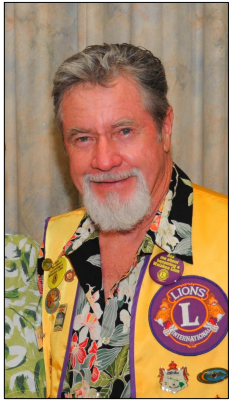

Policy Number 6 **Dues & Fees**, changes (approved)

DUES:

1. The club Secretary shall mail out annual dues invoices to all members by April 15, each year, with a stated due date of May 15.
2. It is the responsibility of every member to inform the club President or the club Secretary by May 15, if he/she does intend to renew their membership.
3. If a member is unable to pay his/her dues in full by May 15, he/she can call the club Secretary to arrange to pay his/her dues in installments, with half of the amount due on May 15, and the remaining half on November 15.
4. If a member fails to pay his/her dues in full by May 15, and does not make an arrangement with the club Secretary to pay his/her dues in installments, he/she may be dropped from member effective June 1, subject to Board action.
5. Active members, Members at Large, Privileged, Honorary, and Affiliate Member's dues will be set in accordance with the International Association of Lions Club's Constitution and By-Laws.
6. Life Members shall pay Club and District dues only. Associate members shall pay Club dues only.

FEES:

1. Initiation, reinstated or transfer member fees shall be as required by the International Association of Lions Clubs.

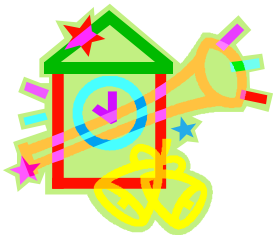
