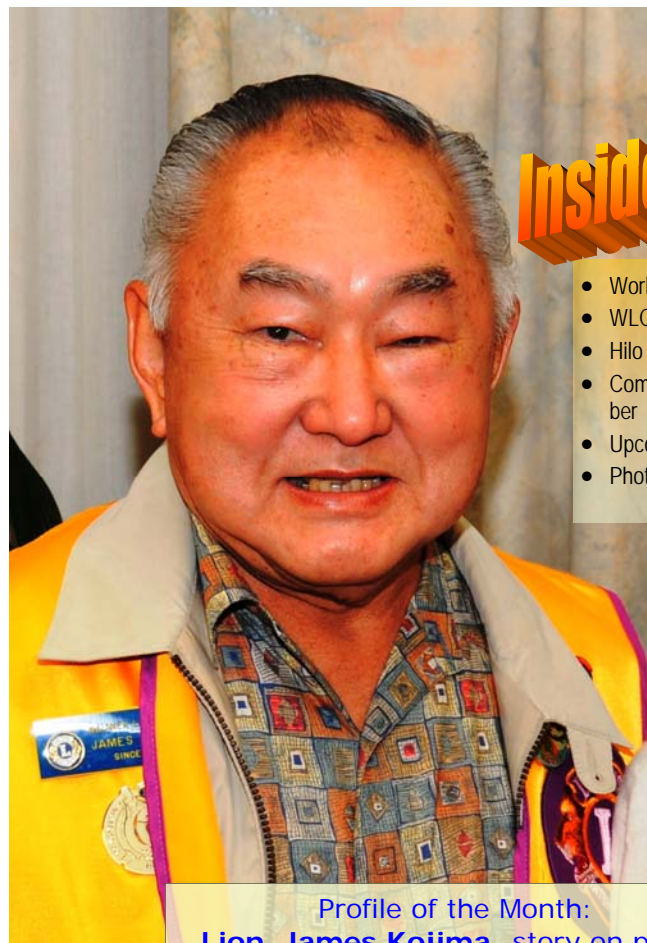

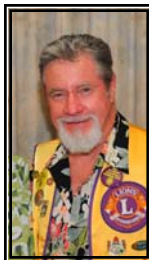

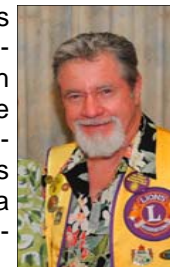


On October 6, 2009

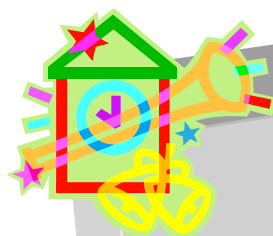
