## LANDSCAPING STANDARD

**No trees of any kind, and no shrubs whose mature height exceeds four (4) feet should be planted on the Right-of-Way.** It has been proven that trees and shrubs exceeding four (4) feet obstruct the inspection of the Right-of-Way, and that their roots damage the protective coatings that are applied to the pipeline. Pipeline Rights-of-Way can be attractively landscaped using this standard and the plants listed below.

Please do not obstruct the Pipeline Markers. They are there for your safety, and are required by the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) Pipeline Safety Regulations.

Pipeline Right-of-Ways are an ideal place for vegetable gardens, because of the open space and sunlight.

Always use the "One Call System" and call before you dig to have your underground utilities located. You should call when you are doing any type of landscaping in or around the pipeline Right-of-Way. This work includes: changing the grade of your property, planting shrubs, installing a fence, or irrigation system. In addition to the Landscaping Guidelines, Colonial prohibits any permanent structures (i.e. storage buildings) or the impounding of water across the Right-of-Way.
