While the Advisory Committee, Board of Directors and staff viewed 2014 as a year of stabilization and learning the ins and outs of our facilities, much has been accomplished in the past eight months! We have reason to celebrate being the "Best in Richmond" again in 2014.

Some of the work that we do is not glamorous or pretty, but it all contributes to the stability and functioning of the amenities, and helps all of our residents enjoy the community, and preserves, protects and enhances property values. As our facilities and properties continue to age, we'll go through the cycle of replacement and refreshing many times over for all of our amenities. We are continually a work in progress!

## EFFICIENT AND ECONOMICAL

Our WCA and WSRC staff members work to spend our budget dollars wisely throughout the year! Whether it's through community partnerships, new or improved programs and services, negotiating lower contract rates, or bartering for services and improvements, we are constantly on the lookout for the ways that we can save! Here are a few quick examples of the ways that we have saved money so far in 2014:

- Community Trash Program. This program saved each participating Woodlake household \$50 - \$175 a year!
- Sponsorship Program. Sponsorships paid for the bands at Friday Cheers in 2014, reducing that budget line item by approximately \$500 each week!
- WSRC staff repainted the interior of the SRC, saving approximately \$1,500.
- WCA Maintenance staff performed the annual inspections of our sixty backflow prevention devices, saving

approximately \$100 on each!

- Landscape Contractor James River Grounds Management removed the old vegetation at the SRC facilities, developed a detailed landscape plan, and provided and installed all replacement mulch and plants! Our cost savings was approximately \$15,000.
- WCA maintenance staff repaired the wood trestle steps at the SRC facility, saving \$5,000 in contractor expenses.
- WSRC countertop refurbishment was paid for with bartering for advertising and membership saving over \$6,000.
- All Tennis Social Events hosted by the Woodlake Tennis Association are paid for, in full, by sponsorships!
- Pruning at the SRC and AFC was done in-house, removing over eight pick-up truckloads of debris. The estimated savings to our budget was approximately \$3,000.
- In-house repairs to our maintenance trucks and equipment at a savings of approximately \$5,000 in labor.

Virginia law requires the seller of a property in a planned community to provide an Association Disclosure Package to a prospective buyer.

Once you have a signed contract or offer, you will need to order a Disclosure Package from the WCA. Fees are collected at closing, or 45 days from the date of the inspection. Order forms available at woodlakeonline.com.

that our members arrived here from many different areas of the country and that their working backgrounds are rich and varied. This diversity of experience is a source of strength which has contributed greatly to the club's success.



# Join Charitable Child In A Walk For Water, August 16

Join Charitable Child for the Walk for Water on August 16, 2014 at 9:00 AM, beginning at the Woodlake Pavilion. The Walk will educate kids about issues related to access to clean drinking water, and it will raise money to build a well at a school in Sudan.

The Walk for Water is co-sponsored by the Woodlake Swim & Racquet Club. It will cover a loop of approximately one mile, and participants will have the option of repeating the loop to complete between 1 and 4 miles (4 miles represents the estimated average distance a child in a developing country must walk to access clean water). Participants will also have the option of carrying water during all or part of the walk. Charitable Child and WSRC are working on the project with the organization, H2O for Life. Funds raised at the Walk will go to H2O for Life to fund a project in Sudan at South Sudan School 6. Our fundraising goal for the Walk is \$2,500. Our team page can be viewed here:

Prior to the Walk, kids are encouraged to read the book "A Long Walk to Water" by Linda Sue Park. This book is geared towards older elementary students and above, but it may be suitable for your younger child with your guidance. The book is for sale through Charitable Child for \$5, while supplies last, with all funds from the sale of books going to fund the well. The book is also available for free check-out at the Charitable Child Community Library at Chesterfield Learning Center. A

discussion guide on this book is also available. Younger kids are encouraged to read "I Walk For Water" by Lindsey Andrews and Jerry Bennett. This is a picture book on the topic that would be appropriate for preschool age and young elementary school children, and it is also available in the Community Library.

Participants who register and pay the \$10.00 registration fee by August 1st will receive a t-shirt and are asked to wear that shirt the day of the walk.

We encourage all participants to ask their family and friends to sponsor them in the Walk or in the Water Awareness Challenge. It is anticipated that this is how most of the money needed to build the well will be raised. Pledge forms will be e-mailed to participants upon registration. #### Q: Who is RVA Rapid Transit?

A: RVA Rapid Transit is a citizen-led movement to bring Bus Rapid Transit – a modern, reliable, and convenient form of public transportation – to metropolitan Richmond. Our goal is to unite citizens of Richmond, Henrico, and Chesterfield as one voice, asking our elected officials and transportation organizations to fully connect all 1.2 million Metro Richmonders by public transit.

#### Q: What is Bus Rapid Transit?

A: Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) functions just like a metro or light rail system. It runs consistently every ten to fifteen minutes on dedicated routes coordinated with traffic signals, which makes BRT travel about as fast as travel by car. Since BRT uses specially designed buses rather than rail cars, it provides all the benefits of a light rail system at 1/10 of the infrastructural cost.

#### Q: What is the proposal?

A: Four major BRT trunk lines will run along the four major arteries of metro Richmond – 250 (Broad Street), 60 (Midlothian Turnpike), 360 (Hull Street), and 1 (Jeff Davis / Chamberlayne/ Brook Road) The routes would run in Henrico, Chesterfield, Hanover, and Richmond, extending to the beltway.

#### Q: Why does this matter?

A: If Richmond is going to fulfill its potential as a top-tier city

and compete on a national and international level, then we need an effective mass transit system that's available to everyone in the metro area.


#### Q: Who would benefit?

A: This system will connect employers to job seekers, give seniors significantly greater mobility, and help attract talented students and young professionals who see effective public transportation as the hallmark of a highly livable city. Additionally, the environmental benefits and economic growth driven by RVA Rapid Transit will improve life for all residents of Metro Richmond.

## Q: How can I help make RVA Rapid Transit a reality?

A: Detailed plans for the first Rapid Transit line are already nearing completion. The most important thing you can do is help raise public support so state and local leaders fund the project. 

## DO YOU USE THE SHELTER COVE OR HARBOUR PARK PARKING LOTS? DO YOU LAUNCH A BOAT IN EITHER OF THESE AREAS?

The parking and facilities at the Shelter Cove and Harbour Park boat launch areas are Woodlake Common Property, and as such, they are strictly for the use of Woodlake residents and property owners. Guests must be in the company of a Woodlake resident or property owner at all times when using these areas. WCA does not issue guest parking and/or boating passes.



# WHAT CAN YOU DO? Pet Waste Control Begins With You!

#### Bring It!

Always bring a plastic bag, or two, when you walk your dog! You can carry bags in your pocket, tie them to your leash or belt loop, or use a doggy bag holder that fits on to your leash.

## BAG IT!

Use the bag as a glove to scoop the waste, then turn the bag inside out and seal. You can keep a small bottle of hand sanitizer with you or wash your hands with soap and water when you are done bagging.

#### DISPOSE OF IT!

Place the bag in a trash can or flush it, unbagged, down a toilet. Never dispose of pet waste in a storm drain, as it will then flow directly, untreated, to your local waterway. All boats housed at a Woodlake property AND/OR used at the boat launch areas or on Swift Creek Reservoir MUST be registered with the Woodlake Community Association, per the WCA Boating Rules & Regulations (found on page 10 the blue pages of the 2014 Community Directory, or at woodlakeonline. com). This includes boats stored at residents' homes (on the shoreline, under a deck, in a garage, etc.) or on mooring posts or t-racks, and boats using the Shelter Cove or Harbour Park boat launch areas.

If you launch a boat at either of these areas, your <u>boat</u>, <u>vehicle</u> AND <u>trailer</u> must be the sole property of a Woodlake resident or property owner, and must be properly registered with WCA. Registration and stickers for vehicles and trailers are free. Boats not stored at WCA mooring posts or t-racks are considered Day Sailors and registration is \$15 per year.

If you use the parking lots to access parks, walking trails, tot-lots, etc., your vehicle must be registered with WCA and must display the proper parking sticker. Only residents' vehicles may be registered with WCA to receive a parking sticker - no exceptions.

To obtain a parking sticker, bring the following to the WCA office:

#### Resident Owners and Tenants:

- Valid/Current Vehicle Registration bearing the name of the owner or tenant of record
- AND Valid/Current Driver's License or Military I.D. bearing Woodlake address

## Non-Resident Woodlake Property Owners:

- Valid/Current Vehicle Registration bearing a Woodlake property owner's name and address and matching those on I.D.
- AND Valid/Current Driver's License or Military I.D. bearing address on record with WCA

#### **Boat Owners:**

Boats AND their trailers will be required to bear a WCA sticker, and a valid/current registration for the trailer will be required in order to obtain a parking permit.

Parking permits will be available during regular WCA operating hours:

Monday-Friday 8:30 AM-1:00 PM 2:00 PM-5:30 PM





## Thirteen Back To School Safety Tips

- 1. Plan & practice a walking route to school or the bus stop. Plan the route away from parks, vacant lots, fields and other places where there aren't many people around.
- 2. Teach your child never to talk to strangers or accept rides or gifts from strangers.
- 3. Be sure your child walks to and from school with a sibling, friend, or neighbor.
- 4. Teach your kids to obey all traffic signals, signs and traffic officers, whether walking or biking. Remind them to be extra careful in bad weather.
- 5. When driving kids, deliver and pick them up as close to the school as possible. Don't leave until they are in the schoolyard or building
- 6. If your child bikes to school, make sure that he always wears a helmet.
- 7. Teach children to arrive at the bus stop early, stay out of the street, wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before approaching the street, watch for cars, and avoid the driver's blind spot.
- 8. Remind your children to stay seated at all times and keep their heads and arms inside the bus while riding. When exiting the bus, children should wait until the bus comes to a complete stop, exit from the front using the handrail to avoid falls, and cross the street at least 10 feet (or 10 giant steps) in front of the bus.

9. Tell your child not to bend down in front of the bus to tie shoes or pick up objects, as the driver may not see him before starting to move. 10. Be sure that your child knows his or her home phone number and address, your work number, the number of



another trusted adult, and how to call 911 for emergencies.

- 11. Avoid any drawstrings on the hood or around the neck of jackets and sweatshirts. Drawstrings at the waist or bottom of jackets should extend no more than three inches long to prevent catching in car and school bus doors or getting caught on playground equipment.
- 12. Teach children proper playground behavior: no pushing, shoving, or crowding.
- 13. Give your child some strategies for coping with bullies. He should not give in to a bully's demands, but should simply walk away or tell the bully to stop. If the bullying continues, talk to the teacher.



As temperatures continue to be well above average, many of the area's lawns are starting to show signs of damage. According the Turf Resource Center, (TRC), an international not-for-profit organization based in suburban Chicago, homeowners can take steps to help their lawns survive.

To protect the economic and environmental value of a lawn, homeowners in areas where water is not heavily restricted are encouraged to take the following steps until temperatures return to lower levels:

- Reduce traffic on the lawn or spread the necessary traffic across as wide an area as possible;
- Do not apply nitrogen fertilizers or pesticides;
- Water late at night or early in the morning to minimize evaporation;
- Water infrequently and deeply, avoiding frequent light sprinklings;
- Increase watering near buildings and other heat reflecting surfaces:
- Be cautious not to over-water, just because water is available;
- Mow only with a sharp blade;
- Raise the mowing height 25% or more;
- Mow often enough so that no more than the top one-third to one-half of the grass blade is cut at any mowing;
- Leave the clippings on the lawn as you mow, unless they produce clumps.
