STEP 1: PRE-CAMP PROGRAM DETAILS

WELCOME

We are so glad that you chose to come to FUGE Combo Camp this summer. We hope that this information packet will be helpful in your camp planning.

WHAT IS COMBO CAMP?

Combo Camp is a chance for your students to all attend the same camp location (Ridgecrest) but attend different camp programs (Centrifuge, XFUGE, or XFUGE on Mission) as you so choose. When you register for this week at Ridgecrest you must determine how many students will be in each program, you cannot decide upon arrival at camp.

WHAT DOES COMBO CAMP AT RIDGECREST LOOK LIKE?

Combo Camp at Ridgecrest involves: Centrifuge, XFUGE, and XFUGE on Mission.

- **CENTRIFUGE** is for your students who want the typical Centrifuge program. This involves graded Bible studies with students from other churches, recreation, and afternoon track times, all facilitated by Fuge camp staff.
- **XFUGE** is for your students who want a little more freedom in their daily schedule. Your own church leaders will teach Bible study to your students and you can have the chance to do group building recreation activities, explore the city, or attend Centrifuge track times.
- **XFUGE ON MISSION** is a chance for your students to do missions in the city as a church group. Like XFUGE, your church leaders will lead Bible study for your own students and then the Fuge office will work with you to set up your ministry options in the city.

REGISTRATION POLICY AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE REGISTRATION POLICY FOR ALL LIFEWAY CAMPS

BEFORE FEBRUARY 1: You may reserve your spot at camp anytime before February 1, 2009 with no deposit.

FEBRUARY 1: A \$50 per person deposit is required for each reservation to be paid on or before February 1. If you have already registered, you are required to pay a \$50 deposit per person to hold your reservation. Any new or additional reservations made after February 1 will require an immediate \$50 deposit per person. ALL deposits are non-refundable and cannot be applied toward balance due.

MAY 1 - CANCELLATION DEADLINE: All cancellations made after May 1 will incur an additional \$50.00 fee for each person dropped. When cancellations occur, deposits cannot be applied toward balance due.

14 DAYS PRIOR TO CAMP: Final balance must be received 14 days before your arrival at camp. If it is not, your group will be charged a one-time \$75.00 late fee.*

***AUTO PAYMENT OPTION:** Authorized Group Leaders may give permission to charge the remaining balance to a church LifeWay account or credit card by calling LifeWay Events Registration at 1-877-CAMP-123. This must be done by May 1, 2009. Any adjustments for drops or additions will be applied to the specified account after camp.

WHAT TO BRING

- Linens, towels, pillows, blankets
- Water bottle that you can refill and carry with you
- Closed toe, closed heel shoes (for outdoor activities)
- Bible, notepad, and pen
- Toiletries such as toothbrush and shampoo
- Sun protection
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering (optional)
- Ministry supplies if your group is doing XFUGE on Mission
- **DO NOT BRING** alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon
- **DO NOT BRING** radios, iPods, CD players, play station portables or other gaming devices, roller blades, skateboards – if students do bring cell phones please help be sure it is not a distraction at camp

QUIET TIME FOCUS: Worship

SPECIAL NEEDS REQUESTS

Fuge takes the special needs of students and adults seriously. Meeting your needs and setting up your group for a great week of camp is important to us.

If one of your students has a special need that should be handled before camp starts, please call our camp toll free line (1.877.CAMP.123) and share that with our events registration team so that it can be handled properly. The special need can also be shared with us via email to fuge@lifeway.com.

If your student's need should be known by our camp staff at camp, you have the option of completing a "Special Attention Card" for your student so that this need can be addressed by the Fuge staff. You can print and fill out this card before camp, or you can fill it out on registration day at camp. You can find a copy of the Fuge Special Attention Card in the Appendix of this document.

NIGHT LIFE

Night Life at Fuge camps is a time for the whole camp to come together and get a little crazy. Each night has a different fellowship activity.

We don't want to ruin the surprise by telling you too much, but we will be having one Night Life where students and adults have the option of dressing up. The dress up night will have an athletic theme. Bring old gym uniforms, knee socks, sweatbands and anything else fun you can think of! You will have time to change into your dress up clothes before the Night Life begins that evening.

DAMAGES

Please be aware that your group is personally responsible for damages to any facilities including but not limited to the dorm room your group occupies. You will also be asked by the facility to pay for any lost keys.

DRESS CODE

Please ask your students and adult sponsors **NOT** to pack anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations
- Has spaghetti straps, except for sleepwear
- Is excessively short or tight fitting.

While at camp, we ask that students and adults:

- Wear modest, one-piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a colored t-shirt;
- Wear modest shorts, dresses, slacks, and jeans for worship. Long pants or knee-length skirts are required for students or adults participating in worship on stage;

- Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc);
- A dark t-shirt if you plan to take the messy games or water games track.
- We invite you to join us as leaders in monitoring your group to ensure they are dressing appropriately.

MISSIONS OFFERING

The summer of 2009 we will celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Fuge missions offering. Students have given more than 8 million dollars and last year alone students gave over \$611,000. This mission offering goes to support the work of both the International Mission Board (IMB) and the North American Mission Board (NAMB).

These agencies have allowed us to target specific ministries with which students can identify. Our offering going to the IMB will continue to support the work of missionaries working with the Romany people in Central and Eastern Europe. More than 350 students responded last summer by going with their youth groups to minister and multiply the hands and feet of the Roma missionaries.

Our offering going to NAMB will help to support their Current Canada summer missions program. Current Canada is a partnership project between the North American Mission Board and the Canadian National Baptist Convention. This program is open to students who have completed the 11th grade or higher. You can check out their website at www.currentcanada.com.

You have the opportunity to pray, give, and go to help these people groups learn about the gospel. A missions offering will be collected at camp this summer, we hope you will begin praying now about what your church group can give.

SPONSOR QUALIFICATIONS

- In order to provide the best atmosphere and supervision, we ask that all groups bring 1 male sponsor for every 5 boys, and 1 female sponsor for every 5 girls.
- All sponsors must be at least 21 years old.
- Help enforce curfew and supervise clean up of your groups' housing.
- Aid in monitoring the dress code of your students.
- Encourage participation and promptness by setting an example.
- If you have a college student coming with your group who is under age

21 that person cannot be counted as a sponsor. However, those college students do not have to be included in your student ratio – for example, if you bring 5 high school boys and 4 college-aged boys, you will only need 1 male sponsor since the 4 college-aged boys don't count in your sponsor to student ratio.

BRINGING CHILDREN TO CAMP

We want you to be able to spend more time with the ones you love during your busy summer. Children too young to participate in our camp programming (completed 5th grade or younger) can join you at camp with the following parameters:

- Bed space and meals = full price
- No bed space or meals = no charge

We want your family to experience worship together, but not at the expense of everyone else. We ask that you please take your child out of the service if they are a distraction to others. Children must have adult supervision at all times. Please also consider the needs of your students and ensure enough adults accompany your group to build relationships and focus on their camp experience.

CHURCH GROUP AND PARENT DEVOTIONS

Church Group Devotion is a time for each church group to be together in the evenings to debrief the day. This time usually lasts one hour. The Group Leader needs to determine what should be discussed or taught. The Fuge office provides devotions for this time which can be found on the Fuge website after April 1. Print this and bring it to camp with you, if you choose to use it.

Parent Devotions are also available on the Fuge website after April 1. This resource is for you to give parents so that they can follow along and know what your students are learning in Bible study.

AFTER CAMP BIBLE STUDY

This year, Fuge is providing an After Camp Bible Study that is designed to follow the camp experience. You can use it as Sunday school curriculum or for your mid-week events. There are three sessions of this study and it can be found on the Fuge website beginning April 1.

PARTICIPANT FORM INFORMATION

Every person coming to camp (adult sponsors and students) needs to complete two Fuge Participant Forms. Both copies need to be notarized. You can find the Ridgecrest Participant Form in the Appendix of this document.

XFUGE TRACK TIMES

XFUGE Tracks are a time each afternoon for students to explore and develop a variety of interests. Students will sign up for their track choices on registration day. Some of the tracks included at Ridgecrest are listed above (under Centrifuge Tracks). You also have the opportunity as a church to go to tracks some days and do team building or sight seeing on other days.

XFUGE ON MISSION TRACKS

If your group is registered for XFUGE on Mission the Site Director for Ridgecrest will contact you in the spring to talk with you about your church's needs for serving. You will have the choice to do ministry each day you are at camp, or participate in ministry all but one day and use that day to do team building, sight seeing, or something on the Ridgecrest campus. You are responsible for transporting your students to ministry site as well as supervising

them while they are there.

Your choices for the type of ministry your church wants to do are:

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

This ministry track involves working with children in a variety of settings. These tracks could include Vacation Bible Schools, Backyard Bible Clubs, Day Camps, and other site-specific work with children. The purpose of this track is to minister to children, providing your students with the opportunity to teach and lead children in telling Bible stories, making crafts, and playing games.

SOCIAL MINISTRY

This ministry track involves a variety of ministry opportunities for meeting the physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual needs of people. This track ministers to the following populations and organizations: mentally/physically handicapped centers, homeless shelters, soup kitchens, food banks, clothing closets, furniture distribution centers, refugee ministries, centers for teaching adults and children English as a second language (ESL), prison ministries, Baptist Centers, Salvation Army Sites, and other community organizations with like purposes.

PAINTING, CONSTRUCTION, AND YARDWORK MINISTRY

Students in this track will spend their week building houses, roofing, repairing, cleaning, painting, and doing yardwork. These tracks work with various organizations such as Habitat for Humanity and the local housing authorities.

MORE INFORMATION ON XFUGE

More specifics on the XFUGE schedule are:

MORNING //

- The AM Show begins your day and is a time for the whole camp to come together.
- Centrifuge students will leave for Quiet Time and Bible Study. XFUGE students will stay in the auditorium for quiet time and a continued session with band and speaker. During this time the speaker will begin the Master Teacher Style Bible study.
- Following this time, XFUGE participants will move to a time to debrief and discuss the Bible study for that day. This debriefing time is led by adults from your own church group. Divide your group as you need to and assign chaperones to lead the time.
- More information on Bible study can be found below.
- XFUGE on Mission students will then depart for ministry.
- XFUGE students can then participate in team building activities such as ropes courses, laser tag, miniature golf, etc. More information on

signing up for these activities are below.

LUNCH //

- All XFUGE participants will go to lunch in the cafeteria. XFUGE on Mission participants will eat lunch on site.

AFTERNOON //

- XFUGE participants have flexibility in the afternoon schedule. You can plan group outings such as white water rafting, hiking, shopping, etc or you can stay on campus and participate in track times.

EVENINGS //

- All students will be together for evening activities: Worship, Night Life, Church Group Devotion, and hang time.

BIBLE STUDY INFORMATION

XFUGE and XFUGE on Mission participants will be offered Bible Study in a large group setting, led by the Camp Pastor, with time set aside at the end for discussion and application within your own group.

The FUGE office will email all of the XFUGE churches the 2009 Bible Study Leader Guide before April 1, 2009. If you do not receive this email by April 1 please contact fuge@lifeway.com.

Each morning, the Camp Pastor will focus primarily on the scripture and truths portrayed in the EXAMINATION portion of this material. For those who want to move into more of a small group discussion, you may use the questions listed throughout the EXAMINATION section. For those who want to challenge students through experiential activities, we recommend you focus your group time on the APPLICATION portion of this material (supplies are NOT provided).

FREE TIME ACTIVITIES
