Portsmouth Police Chief Harriet Tonya Chapman currently serves as the Chief of Police for the Portsmouth Police Department, becoming Virginia's first African American female chief of a municipal police department. Her professional career in law enforcement spans over 29 years.



Gianni Graham is the founder of Dolls for Dolls Foundation, a nonprofit organization launched in 2015 to collect 1,000 Barbie brand dolls for homeless girls. But after news outlets shared her story, she hand-delivered 5,000 dolls to local homeless shelters and shipped others to people in other countries.
