



## **Adoption of the Canadian and International Federation of Golf Anti-Doping Policies**

The Royal Canadian Golf Association, operating as Golf Canada (“Golf Canada”), hereby formally adopts and agrees to participate in the revised 2011 Canadian Anti-Doping Policy (CADP) including general principles and associated rules and standards to take effect immediately.

As stated in the Canadian Anti-Doping Policy, adoption of the program by Sport Organizations reflects a fundamental commitment to respect its principles, to fulfill its prescribed roles and responsibilities and to comply with the broad scope of its application. Sport Organizations adopt the Canadian Anti-Doping Program to express a fundamental commitment to engage in a collaborative effort to eliminate doping in sport; to promote doping-free sport in Canada; to ensure harmonized, coordinated and effective anti-doping measures; and to respect the rights of individuals and organizations through appropriate and fair procedures.

Golf Canada also formally adopts and agrees to the sport specific International Golf Federation (IGF) 2013 Anti-Doping Policy and procedures.
