



Junior Code of Conduct

Golf Canada takes great pride in the quality of its competitions, host facilities and broad community involvement at each championship. In order to continue making Golf Canada championships enjoyable for everyone, all competitors are required to adhere to the Golf Canada Code of Conduct.

The Golf Canada Code of Conduct must be followed throughout the entire championship, including the practice round.

Violations of the Code of Conduct:

- Unsportsmanlike conduct, including abusive language, club throwing, disrespect to volunteers, officials or fellow competitors, or abuse of golf course property.
- Any use or association with drugs or alcohol, smoking or chewing tobacco products. Failure to adhere to the dress code policy while on host facility property.
- Any Vandalism at a host hotel, abusive behaviour to host family or their property.
- Any other conduct unbecoming of a Golf Canada competitor.

Code of Conduct Penalties:

- A competitor's entry may be withdrawn at any time (including during the championship) by Golf Canada.
- Suspension from future Golf Canada championships.

The Golf Canada Tournament Committee is the sole judge in determining conduct unbecoming and may assess any or all of the preceding penalties based on the severity and frequency of the violation(s). Any Code of Conduct violation will result in a written letter to the participant. In the event of a suspension, the participant will be required to submit a written account of the Code of Conduct violation to the Golf Canada Amateur Competitions Committee within 30 days of the suspension. The Committee will determine the length of the suspension after reviewing all submitted materials, including a Golf Canada tournament official/staff account of the violation. Any participant who is under suspension will not be eligible for post-season honours.
