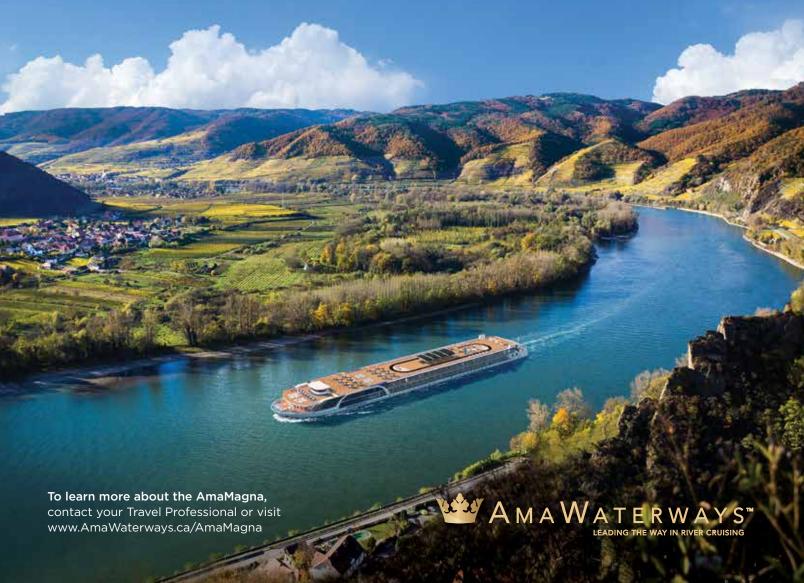

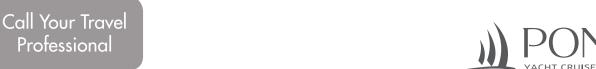

FOREHEADS TOUCHING and eyes closed, we gently inhale one another's breath. The courtly gentleman in his traditional lei and sarong greets each of us in the same way as we walk up the pathway to his secluded home on the tiny island of Molokai. It's a welcoming ritual that's hauntingly familiar and I know what to do instinctively - though I've never been to the islands of Hawaii before.

I recognize too, the sound of the conch shell he blows to herald our arrival - a sound that fills the leafy valley and reminds me of other greetings, on other islands, far away. I've shared the breath of life with other friends, in just this way, in the islands of Tahiti and again, with the warmly welcoming Maori people in a small village, in New Zealand, hundreds of ocean kilometers away.

As I breathe in, something in my brain goes 'click' and the connection is made.

Anthropologists would explain that New Zealand, Tahiti and Hawaii are the three corners of the Polynesian triangle. The people in each place were once connected by perilous canoe journeys over seemingly impossible distances - sometimes to trade and sometimes to make war. Bloodlines mingled and customs were shared with the end result being three very similar, yet far-flung cultures.

Travel is all about hearing that 'click' as we make connections between people, places, customs, thoughts and ideas. Today's uber-technological world makes it easy to know what's going on in any corner of the world, any time but it doesn't allow us to make genuine connections. A traveler will tell you that feeling the 'click' involves first-hand experiences - hearing the call to prayer in the souks of Marrakech, tasting a fresh mango picked from the tree, smelling the wood smoke from an open fire on a Rocky Mountain trail, or gazing into the eyes of a lion from the safety of a safari jeep in the Maasai Mara. Connecting means being there.

One of my earliest adventures was trekking through the ancient ruins of Machu Picchu, learning about the snakes, panthers and eagles worshipped by the ancient Incans. Years and many other explorations later, while wandering through the ruins of Mexico's Chichen Itza, I found Mayan and Aztec symbols that echoed their Incan counterparts - jaguar, condor and winged serpent gods. Separated by thousands of kilometers, two distinct cultures were links in the same chain and as I saw the symbols, I heard that 'click.'

What's best about travel is the chance it gives you to explore, to taste, to see and to feel, making connections between the places you've been, that part of the globe you're experiencing right now, and the next destination on your list. Open your mind to the possibilities and compare what you've learned, revel in whatever you're in the midst of, and allow yourself to wonder about what you're yet to discover.

Just be sure you have a reservation - the buzzing bistro-style resto and bar with granite tables is hugely popular. In the mornings, a breakfast buffet (included in the rates) is offered here - try the traditional Swedish soured milk (like yogurt) with lingonberries. Then when you're ready to venture out sightseeing, most tourist sites are within walking distance.

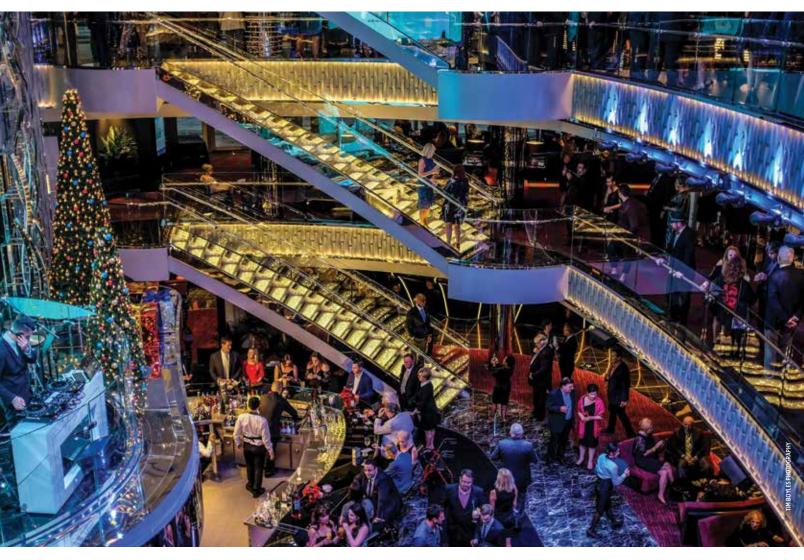

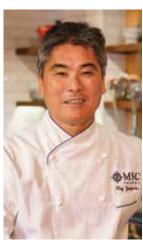

NE OF THE NEWEST SHIPS to grace our shores, the lovely MSC Seaside, which debuted in December 2017, is a ship specifically developed and designed for the North American market - and it's a winner.

The bold and innovative design, with a wrap-around promenade on Deck 8 offers guests many choices for outside dining and relaxing. Deck 7 aft has a small "South Beach" pool and bar but it's the Miami condo look - unusual but attractive - that sets it apart. With two panoramic elevators set between two towers of rooms it's quite impressive and topped by a catwalk dubbed "the bridge of sighs" affording phenomenal views.

The Seaside is ultra-glam but also has many attributes that will suit a wide and varied audience - including families of all ages.

One of the most magnificent spots is the mid-ship four-level Atrium anchoring decks 5 through 8 and connected by two sets of gorgeous, swooping Swarovski staircases. This space is vibrant and buzzing - the heart of the ship essentially. With a variety of bars and lounges created on each level, an ever-changing, fabulous backdrop of LED screens and a small "stage" for live musical entertainment, or a DJ playing favorite tunes, this is the place to be - at any time of day.

The Atrium is just one example where MSC has really upped their game in the overall ship design and décor of the Seaside. For the most part, the public spaces are attractive and appealing with virtually no jarring notes. The alternative restaurants on Deck 16 clustered around a welcoming and romantic cocktail lounge, include a Steak House, the really charming Ocean Cav for Seafood and the threein-one restaurant space located on one side of the ship, created by celebrity chef Roy Yamaguchi. This is a natural ship for families, with lots to do; the kids will love the bowling alley, the two ziplines, the fantastic water-park with its variety of slides, plus the terrific Jungle Pool and play area. Naturally there are Kids Clubs for all ages and a babysitting program as well.

And there's more - much more. The Sports Bar, the French Brasserie, the Champagne Bar and the elegant and popular Venchi, a coffee bar, Cioccogelateria (chocolates and ice cream) and creperie that is delicious in every way. Add to this a wide range of award-winning entertainment in the theater every night plus music of all kinds in various lounges throughout the ship. There's a spacious Spa and the Yacht Club, the ship-within-aship concept is larger and even better than on other ships. A key factor here is that the restaurant for the Yacht Club guests (special key-card entry) is now contained within the several decks that this ship category occupies rather than being out in another area. Dublin, Ireland's captivating capital city, packs a powerful historic punch while embracing the new and trendy in an eclectic mix of brimming-with-personality attractions. One of the friendliest cities in Europe, it has the advantage of being big enough to be cosmopolitan but small enough to maintain a friendly village vibe.

Founded by the Vikings in the ninth century, the Irish government recognises 988 as the year in which the city that would become Dublin was settled. With both mountains and sea minutes away, it's a unique location for a national capital. Today it's one of Europe's most youthful cities, with an estimated 50 percent of the population under 25. It's an exciting place to visit not only because of its engaging attractions, but also because of its easy-going vibe and tradition of emotional stories to tell and people with a knack of telling them.





HE SMILING IRISH EYES and lilting voice that welcomed our group to Ireland belonged to Dennis O'Conor, the disarming gentleman who would be our driver and tour guide. "You are very welcome to Ireland," he said, shaking hands all around. And, knowing we were Canadians, adding, "You'll be glad to know there is a Tim Hortons here, but first, I am going to take you to Dollard & Co., our brand-new food hall, where you can have a cup of Dublin's finest, roasted from hand-selected beans by TwoFifty Square coffee company." Dubliners, we quickly discovered, are fiercely proud of their city – right down to a great latte. This trendy enterprise is a foodie's dream all under one roof. Bursting with the best Irish and international provisions, you can also grab a take-home meal, or sit and enjoy delicious fare for breakfast, lunch or dinner.

Raising a glass at the Guinness storehouse

Well-fortified with coffee and fresh-from-the-oven pastries, we were off to one of the most-visited attractions in all of Europe. To be honest, beer is not my favorite Friday-night tipple. If I hadn't known about the popularity of Guinness Storehouse, and the fact that this 'black stuff' has colored Dublin's history for more than 250 years, I might have missed an extraordinary experience.

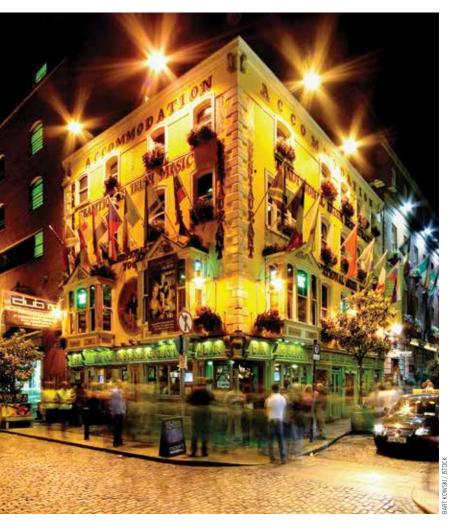
Arthur Guinness founded his brewery on the cobbled, inner-city streets in 1759. The building that is now a seven-storey, high-tech, Disney-style exhibition space once housed the company's fermentation plant. Our self-guided tour began at ground level in a giant atrium, shaped like a Guinness glass large enough to hold 14.3 million pints. On each floor, we experienced how the company's rich history unfolded while learning about the involved process that creates Ireland's iconic stout.

Stopping midway for a tasting, we not only discovered how perfectly certain foods pair with different brews, but also learned to pull the perfect pint – holding the glass at a precise 45-degree angle – and were presented with a diploma to prove we could do it. Seven flights up, our reward was the Gravity Bar with the best 360-degree view of the city skyline and the pint that's included in the 17.50 Euro price of admission. Even if you don't love the suds, this is a don't-miss attraction. www.guiness-storehouse.com

An EPIC Museum

EPIC, Dublin's newest museum is a fresh take on the stories of the estimated ten million people who have left Ireland over the centuries, as well as the legacies they have left behind. High-tech and family-friendly, this interactive experience is both a commemoration and a celebration. The restored warehouse that houses the museum is in Docklands, the original departure point for many of Ireland's emigrants. Their sad yet inspiring stories came to life as we meandered through 20 galleries, each with its own theme. www.epicchq.com

The Literary Pub Crawl

A literary pub crawl, we agreed, was an essential night in a UNESCO City of Literature - designated in 2010. Books and beer marry happily at this hugely popular pub crawl, demonstrating that a Dubliner's affection for storytelling rivals that of their attachment to the city's some 800 pubs. The two-and-a-half hour trek through cobblestone streets was led by a pair of rambunctious actors, reciting bits of Irish literature, between brief stops for a pint at some of Dublin's oldest watering holes once frequented by the likes of James Joyce, Oscar Wilde and Jonathan Swift. What our guides called, "a quick cultural detour" through Trinity College, the city's most prestigious university, was tantalizing enough that we knew we would return to spend time in the library's Long Room. It's here where dusty shelves house an overwhelming collection including the Book of Kells, a breathtaking, illustrated manuscript of the four gospels of the New Testament in Latin. Created circa AD 800, it is one of the world's oldest manuscripts. www.tcd.ie



The charms of Glasnevin Cemetery

Central Casting couldn't have picked a more charismatic storyteller than Paddy Gleeson who guided us around the 124-acre Glasnevin Cemetery on the 'Dead Interesting Tour'. Paddy, who could sell sand in a desert, spun weird, tragic and humorous tales of the famous and infamous people who rest underfoot. "Did you know," he said, "more people are buried here than are alive in Ireland today?"

Maria Higgins? She died once and was buried twice. Then there were the ghoulish grave-robbing, body-snatchers who started their excavations shortly after Glasnevin opened in 1832, selling their booty to medical schools. And the practical joker, Francis de Groot, the Dubliner who flew to Australia in 1932 only to be arrested, having decided he, rather than the local appointed dignitary, would cut the ribbon to open the Sydney Harbour Bridge.

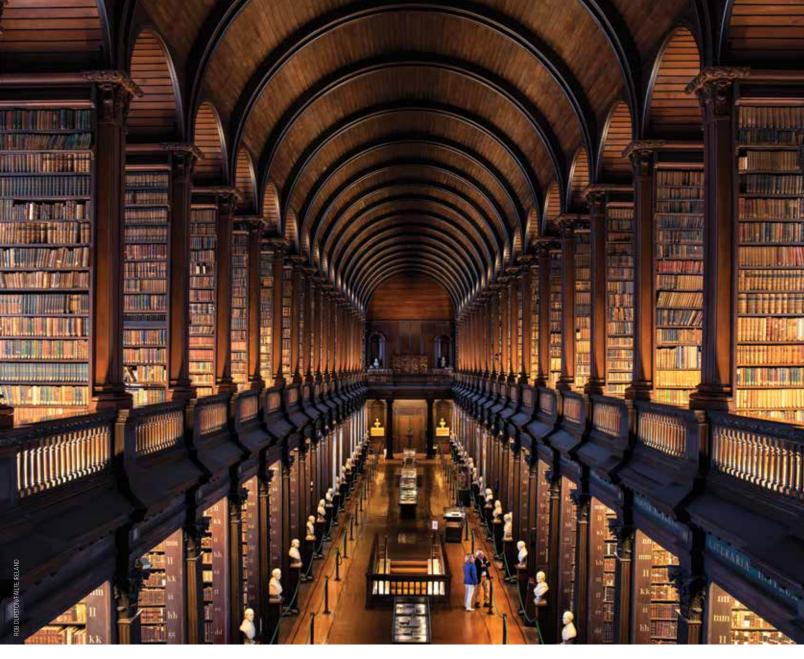
"This stroll through the history of Ireland," Paddy said, "is a particularly meaningful experience for the 43 million North Americans who have Irish roots - especially those who want to trace those roots at our Glasnevin Museum." www.glasnevintrust.ie

A pint at the Gravediggers Pub

What do you do after spending two hours among the dead? "You do what the workers did after a long day burying people," Paddy tells us, "have a pint at the Gravediggers Pub." Scarcely changed and family-owned since it opened 1833, this hidden treasure is a step back into another century. Conveniently located just outside the old cemetery gates, it serves up home cooking and the cozy feel of old-time Irish hospitality. Oh yes, and a pint.

Indulge in the freebies

Among the best things the city offers travelers are the many free attractions. The National Gallery of Ireland, for instance, has an unmatched collection of Irish art, in addition to impressive European masterpieces. History buffs won't want to miss the collection of Celtic and medieval treasures in the National Museum of Ireland or the story of 20th-century Dublin that's told by the quirky Little Museum of Dublin. For more unnerving bits of history, there's Kilmainham Gaol Museum. As modern as tomorrow, the Science Gallery is an exploration of big, compelling, cutting-edge endeavors to appeal to all ages.





Stroll the streets

With suggestions from Denis O'Conor, we discovered some of the finest examples of Georgian architecture, explored the shopping delights along world famous Grafton Street, and stopped for afternoon tea at the iconic Bewley's Grafton Street café. We toured the Temple Bar Food Market which is open every Saturday and everywhere we went, met friendly locals who, with their ready wit, were eager to share their stories, and make us smile.

We learned the meaning of the iconic 'craic' - getting together for fun and enjoyable conversation - and we discovered that a craic is more than reason enough to visit this enchanting city.

In the psychedelic sixties,

drawn by warm weather, an inexpensive lifestyle and relaxed policing, and with icons like Bob Dylan leading the way, young people from around the world descended on the small, sun-drenched islands of Ibiza and Formentera in happy, hippy droves. They bought old farmhouses and set up impromptu markets, selling everything from home-grown vegetables to hand-strung beads. It was a blissful escape from the world then and, the good news is, it still is.

Today, hippy markets, organic restaurants, a boom in agro-tourism and a generally laid-back lifestyle mix with the old stone buildings, rugged cliff faces and white sandy beaches of the island to make Ibiza and Formentera perfect escapes from the madness of the world. There, both the people and the climate are warm year-round – with the temperature rarely dipping below 15 degrees C even on the coldest days. It's a getaway from which you might never want to return.

Toby Clarke, owner of the popular tour company Walking Ibiza, is the perfect example of a man who couldn't resist the pull of the island. Born on Ibiza to counter-culture British parents, he spent his childhood happily roaming the beaches and attending an independent school run by hippy families. The smell of pot, he says, brings back fond school day memories!



Though his parents ultimately returned to a more buttoned-down life in England and Clarke finished his education in traditional boarding schools, he never lost his passion for Ibiza. After years of international travel as he searched for a career, Clarke realized his future was on the island of his birth and he returned with wife Belinda and their family. Since coming back, Clarke has dedicated his life to introducing guests to his beloved Ibiza through a series of guided hikes across and around the island. "It began a few years ago," he explains philosophically, "when I was searching for a new path in life, and thought a solo hike around the perimeter of the island would give me time to think."

The cliffs and rugged terrain of the island were seriously challenging, but Clarke decided to make things even tougher by taking along neither money nor provisions. "I thought I could rely on the generosity and hospitality of Ibizans," he said, and it turned out that he could. Throughout his multi-day trek, Clarke was welcomed, fed and sheltered by strangers – and that kindness convinced him to found his tour company, Walking Ibiza as a means of sharing the unique island vibe and promoting his home to others.

While it's possible for the ambitious visitor to do a week-long camping trek (note: food and shelter are provided – no cadging meals or beds from strangers required), shorter, less strenuous hikes are also available.

I spent a glorious afternoon with Clarke and wife Belinda, hiking to the top of a cliff to view the small, mysterious Es Vedra island at sunset. Though it's said to have magnetic properties similar to Machu Picchu and Sedona, what I felt was the pull of its beauty alone.

As we walked, Clarke pointed out fascinating treasures I'd have strolled right past, such as an ancient shelter - a circle of smooth rocks where a tired shepherd would have rested for the night as his sheep grazed nearby - and a sort of kiln where fires blazed hot enough to melt rock into the white, limey substance used to cover and protect farm houses and sheds. Medicinal plants, edible berries... everything we passed was the inspiration for a story from Clarke, but best of all were his memories of growing up wild and happy on the island. Though his parents ultimately fell out of love with each other and the hippy movement, Clarke's heart remained in Ibiza. It's easy to see why. There's a gentle sense of welcome everywhere you turn.

I biked the quiet roadways, kayaked the spectacular shoreline at Benirrás Beach, and experienced the warmth of an agro-tourism inn at Cap Gazi, where a working farm has been transformed into an elegant retreat, complete with a horizon pool, spa, gym and outdoor yoga pavilion. The farm provides the freshest possible produce and the chef creates local dishes with flair.

One wet evening, I drove across the island to the weekly hippy market, half expecting a plasticized, tongue-incheek spoof of the sixties, but what I found was anything but. A field full of tarpaulin-covered booths sheltered a group of serious artists - silversmiths, leather designers, potters and more. Hand-embroidered necklaces hung beside shaggy sheepskin vests and fringed bags that had a definite Mamas and Papas appeal. Everything had a vintage feel - except the people. Not leftovers from the age of Aquarius, these artists and vendors were latter day hippies - young Ibizans who've embraced the peace and love philosophy of their parents and spun it into a vibrant new lifestyle.

Although the capital city of Ibiza is known for its hot clubbing scene arguably one of the most famous in Europe - which starts at midnight with internationally renowned DJs keeping the dance floors packed until sunrise - it's a relatively isolated phenomenon. Though I enjoyed my night of euro-cool living and loved the over-the-top amenities of the ultrachic OD Talamanca Hotel, where the beautiful people recuperate around the pool in preparation for the next night's excesses, I was happy to find that driving five kilometres outside the city took me back decades in time and lifestyle.

In the countryside, there are no jam-packed highways and few over-crowded resorts. Instead, a sense of peace descends as you roll along two-lane roads, through tranquil farmland, heading for some of the most beautiful beaches in Spain.

If Ibiza is laid back, Formentera, her sister island located just a short ferry ride away, is even more so. With just a few main roads and almost no stoplights, Formentera is a place that you explore slowly and savor joyfully. You could easily bike the whole island and many visitors do.

The small beach town of es Pujols is a favorite escape, where you can stay at the friendly, family-owned Hotel Sa Volta, then enjoy fresh caught fish at the Capri, another family-owned establishment where the owner himself comes out to make certain that you're enjoying every bite. Be sure to try the Formentera salad – a delicious mix of bread, dried fish, and tomatoes. You'll be back for more the next day!

Because the island is so small – just 20 km long and two km wide at its narrowest spot – the ocean is always with you. Don't resist her charms – surrender yourself to the waves.

My most fabulous morning was spent sailing a catamaran with a friendly local guide whose English was not much more extensive than my Spanish. It didn't matter. We had the sun on our backs, the wind in our sails and the brilliant blue water all around us and as we crashed through the waves, salt spray in our faces, I understood not only what brought the hippies to these islands more than fifty years ago, but also what lures the rest of us here to share it with them today.

MAKING WAVES on the Seine

N THE WORLD OF TRAVEL, it's all about more: how to fit more guests on a ship, squeeze more people into a plane, take more travelers onto tours. There's even a sexy financial catchphrase to describe this phenomenon: economy of scale. One company, though, is going in the opposite direction – and it's making waves for all the right reasons.

When American tour and river cruise operator Tauck decided to retrofit four of its oldest river cruise ships in Europe, it made all the right moves. Tauck announced that these rejuvenated ships would feature larger suites, better bathrooms, and more luxurious amenities in keeping with its all-inclusive, 'no-optionssold' mantra. And, most importantly, a critical detail: Tauck would be decreasing the number of guests aboard each ship, taking the entire guest complement down to just 98 people. As it turns out, space just might be the biggest luxury of all.

This Sapphire sparkles

I noticed the difference as soon as I embarked Tauck's newly-refitted ms Sapphire in Paris: no lines. Queues aren't common on river cruises to start with, but you do sometimes find them on ships that accommodate more than 200 guests. With just 98 guests onboard I was able to walk right on, have a welcome drink, and complete check-in formalities with absolutely no waiting. The ease of it was almost disorienting. I looked around helplessly at nearby crew members as if to say, "What now?" Surely someone wants me to sit down or stand in line? No. Keycard in hand, I made my way to my stateroom, a mere five minutes after stepping onboard.

The *Sapphire* debuted her new look in time for the start of the 2017 season, and the changes were more than just a superficial sprucing-up here and there. The ship's corridors were completely redone with new

wall treatments and floor-level accent lighting. Soft furnishings had been replaced, and entire blocks of staterooms removed to make way for larger suites.

One of the features added during the refit was Arthur's, a new casual dining venue situated all the way at the stern on Diamond Deck. Incredibly, it's open for continental breakfast, lunch, and even casual dinner. No reservations needed and best of all, no additional charge.

After a few days onboard, Arthur's – named after Tauck's chairman, Arthur Tauck, Jr. – became a subject of much discussion. Even though Tauck offers spectacular multi-course dinners each evening, word spread around the ship that the hamburger at Arthur's was, as one guest put it, "To die for." He was right: it was superb. Just because you're on a luxury river cruise doesn't mean that the pleasures of less complicated cuisine can't be enjoyed.

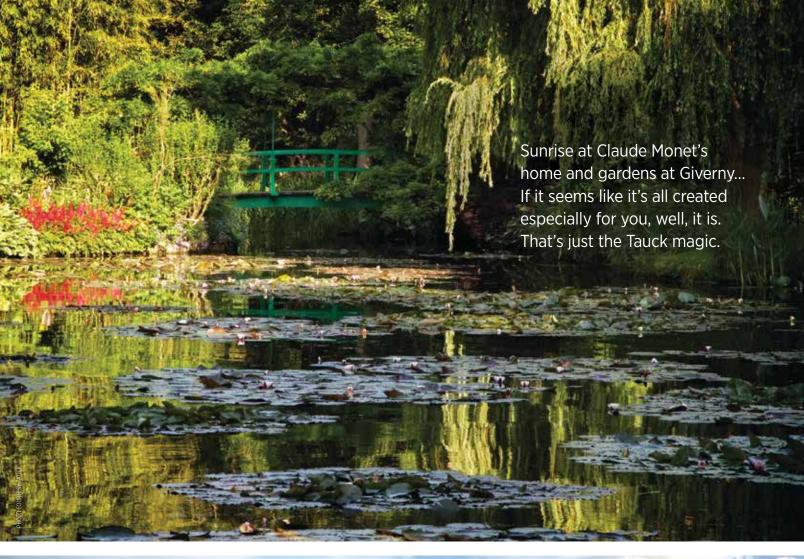

More suite life

Because Tauck reduced the overall guest complement aboard the ms Sapphire to just 98, it could afford to increase the number of suites. In fact, most accommodations come in at 225 or 300 sq. ft. - more spacious than the average river cruise stateroom, by far.

My Category 6 stateroom was one of the new 225 sq. ft. rooms. With a full-sized French balcony and a halfwidth floor-to-ceiling window, these rooms are as light and airy as they are spacious. A super-soft bed faces the French balcony, allowing you to enjoy a coffee from the in-room Nespresso maker while sitting in bed.

A small sitting area with a proper table and two chairs makes it easy to relax, and I was impressed at the amount of storage space that Tauck was able to fit into this new room. The award for most jaw-dropping improvement, however, goes to the bathrooms in these new suites: marble-clad affairs bookended by a rainforest shower and stocked with Molton Brown toiletries. Don't be surprised if you catch yourself taking photos of it, along with the rest of this beautiful ship.

The brilliance of Normandy

The Sapphire sails Tauck's nine-night Rendezvous on the Seine cruise-tour itinerary. With seven cruising days (plus two days at a luxury hotel in Paris), the company really pulls out all the stops on this fabulous cruise through France's Normandy region.

Known for its inclusive events, Tauck does not disappoint on the Seine. A welcome dinner at the Pullman Paris Tour Eiffel Hotel saw guests dining in the rooftop restaurant, just blocks from Gustave Eiffel's iconic creation. A few days later, a French country château, nestled into the hills by an off-thebeaten-path rural road, served as the setting for a traditional, candle-lit dinner that recreated the grand galas of times gone by.



These are events that you would not be able to purchase on your own, and they're exclusive to Tauck. And, with just 98 guests, these events are even more intimate and unique than they have been in the past.

As wonderful as this itinerary is, it was also sombre and reflective. A fog-filled day introduced us to the D-Day landing beaches, where Allied forces came ashore on June 6, 1944.

Particularly moving is the visit to the American Cemetery at Omaha Beach, where over 9,000 soldiers are interred. The fog obliterated the landscape and I found myself in a sea of white crosses that disappeared over the hills in every direction, crushed by the weight of the past.

Tauck ends this river cruise on a high note, with a private visit to Claude Monet's home and gardens at Giverny. At sunrise. If it seems like it's all created especially for you, well, it is. That's just part of the Tauck magic.

In a world where travel is dictated by the numbers, Tauck's "less-is more" approach is as refreshing as it is enjoyable. Let's hope it catches on.

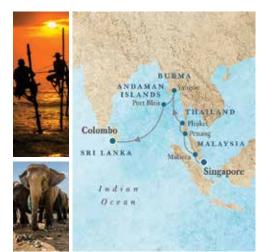

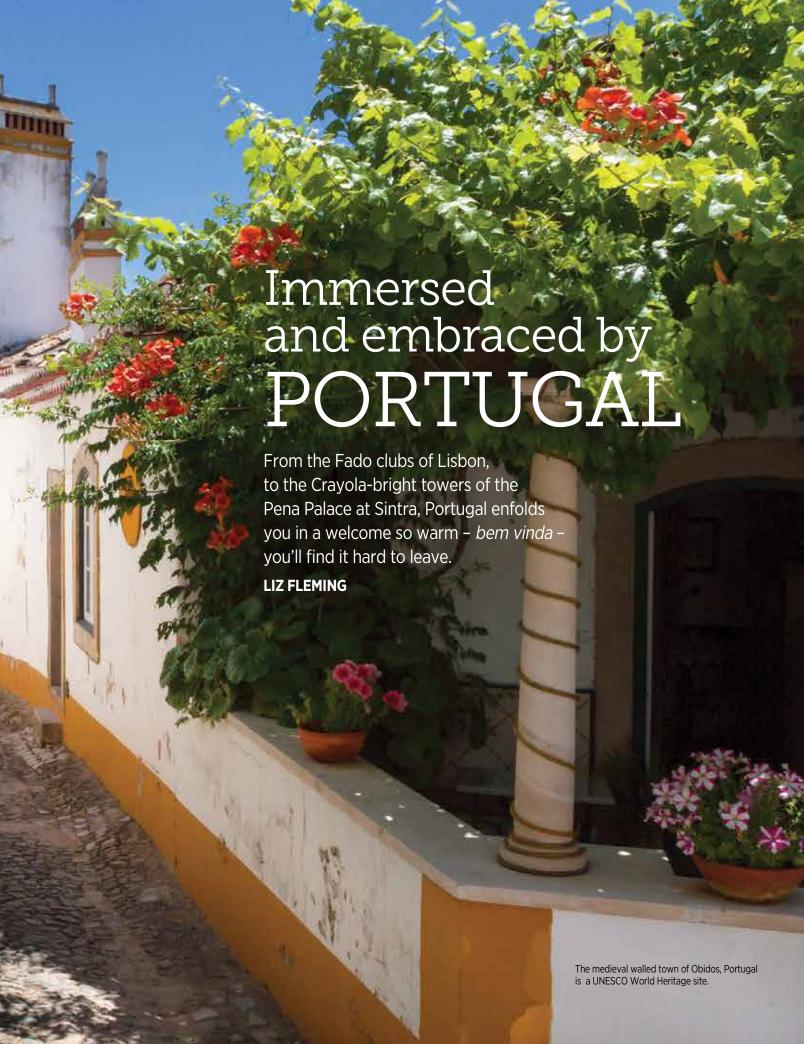

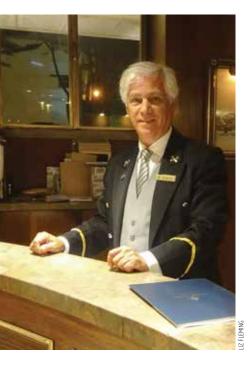












T'S NOT OFTEN YOU MEET someone who's worked at the same job, in the same place for more than fifty years. José Diogo Vieira, concierge at the über elegant Hotel Palácio Estoril in Cascais, Portugal is an exception. The Palácio is José's home and he radiates hospitality – when he says 'bem vinda', it's a very personal welcome.

José began as a bell hop in the 1960's, and can tell you every detail of the hotel's history. In 1941, he explains, Ian Fleming, creator of the James Bond series, was a regular at the hotel bar, drinking with Serbian double agent Dusko Popov.

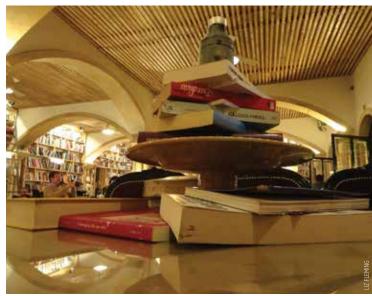
"He would sit right here", says José, patting Fleming's favorite couch in what is affectionately called the 'spy bar.' "You sit here too!" he insists.

In 1969, the movie *On Her Majesty's Secret Service* was shot at the Hotel Palácio Estoril and José shared a scene with George Lazenby. He has the movie stills to prove it. "That's me," he says, pointing proudly "Just behind James Bond."











After my barefoot sunset wander on the Cascais beach, the Palácio is a contrast. In the polished-mahoganyand-crisp-linen world of the dining room, white-coated waiters hover, expertly recommending, presenting and serving. No matter how lean, green and minimalist your diet at home might be, you'll order the decadently delicious grilled foie gras with sweet figs and balsamic, rich shrimp and scallop risotto and crepes Suzette, flambéed tableside - of course. It's the highest-end, old-school comfort food imaginable and it feels incredibly welcoming.

The enthusiasm for hospitality is a hallmark of the Hotel Palácio Estoril and a reflection of an all-encompassing sense of welcome you'll find everywhere in Portugal. It's a country embraces visitors at every turn.

There's a different sort of hospitality in the ancient town of Obidos where the twisting cobblestone streets are lined with not only shops selling the expected souvenirs and gifts, but also tiny bars selling traditional ginja, a cherry liqueur served in tiny chocolate cups. As you wander, shop, admire the geraniums poking out of window boxes, and walk the ancient battlement wall that surrounds the old fortified town, you'll stop, sip and chat with the owners of the little bars, feeling the glow of the liqueur warming your belly. If you've had more than a little ginja, stay the night! The Obidos castle-turned-posada at the edge of the original village awaits but the small town nearby also offers another, slightly quirky and undeniably welcoming option - the Literary Man Hotel.

"We have 60,000 books in the hotel," the desk clerk tells you proudly as you check in, "and every one of them is for sale." In this small boutique hotel, books are everywhere - filling huge shelves behind the reception desk, waiting invitingly on the bedside tables in every guest room and lining the walls of every public space.

In the dining room, bookshelves cover the walls and piles of novels topped with simple candlesticks are the centerpieces on each table. As a talented jazz duo plays softly in one corner, guests flip through books, read books, touch books and savor books as much as they're savoring their meals. It's a bibliophile's dream come true. Don't be surprised if your luggage is heavier when you check out.

Traditional ginja, a cherry liqueur served in tiny chocolate

One world-famous welcome in Portugal has nothing to do with a hotel, a restaurant or even an earthly host. It's all about the embrace offered to believers at the shine at Fatima.

According to the story, on May 13, 1917, the Virgin Mary appeared to three young shepherd children. After returning to them on several other occasions, the Virgin is finally believed to have caused the sun to spin like a disc to prove that the children were telling the truth. The children now believed, an enormous sanctuary was built that has since drawn millions of people to one of the most important shrines in Europe.

Some simply sight-see, many take part in the daily masses, while others show their devotion by crawling across the massive paved courtyard and circling the church on their knees - a punishing feat. At nearby shops, many visitors buy armloads of candles, or wax effigies of the three shepherds, Christ or the Virgin while others buy beeswax representations of human body parts like arms, legs, heads, livers, kidneys etc. symbolizing the various illnesses they believe have been cured by divine intervention. Carrying their offerings solemnly, the pilgrims toss the wax effigies and candles into the flames of an enormous fire pit inside the shrine grounds, murmuring prayers of thanks for favors received and loved ones healed.

The gleaming white Basilica of our Lady of the Rosary, the smoking fires, the sweet smell of melting beeswax, faces of the devoted believers on their knees, the holy water fountain and the massive crucifix towering over the Basilica of the Holy Trinity all combine to create an experience you won't soon forget, regardless of your religious beliefs a place that offers a unique welcome.

In the UNESCO World Heritage site at Sintra, where neo-Moorish, neo-Manueline and neo-Mogul architectural styles collide and blend with whimsical abandon to create the stunning Pena Palace, the most impressive areas are those where guests were entertained. Imagine how the ornately painted ceilings and richly tiled walls of the dining rooms echoed with the laughter of noble guests.

Like José of the Palacio Estoril, our Sintra historian guide Vitor Santos clearly takes a personal pride in the Pena Palace – from the delicate porcelain, crystal, and silver to the wealth of paintings on the walls. This, you feel, is his Portuguese heritage, his treasure and he is graciously sharing it with you.

You might think that the warmth of the Portuguese welcome would be diluted by urban sophistication in the capital city of Lisbon but you'd be wrong. Coffee shops on terraces in every part of the city of the seven hills lure guests with some of Europe's finest pastries - like the Bolo de Mel da Madeira (honey cake), Travesseiro de Sintra (egg yolk-filled confections called Sintra's pillows) and of course, Pastel de Belém (the best of the traditional Portuguese egg cream tarts in a crisp, delicate crust.) It's impossible not to indulge, but the pastries aren't the city's sweetest treat. Lisbon, after all, is the home of Portugal's beloved fado tradition music that tells of loves won and lost in a city and a country to which each singer seems completely devoted.

Fado is everywhere in Lisbon playing on the radio, on the loudspeaker systems in the shops and most importantly, in the Fado clubs of the Alfama, Mouraria, and Bairro Alto districts of the city.

Visit Luso, one of the most famous fado clubs in Lisbon, and you'll be welcomed into a tightly packed dining room filled with fado fans. The menu features Portuguese specialties with lots of fresh fish and seafood options - but no matter how good the food, the meal will be secondary to the music. As you're sipping your first spoonful of soup, the lights will dim to darkness as the Fado singer and his or her guitarists arrive. All conversation will stop as the dramatic, tragic music fills the room and engulfs you. This is not sing-along, hand-clapping, fingersnapping fare - these songs tell of heartbreak, loss, despair and longing - for a loved one perhaps - but most importantly for Lisbon and Portugal.

Whether or not you understand the words of the Fado singer, the passion will be unmistakeable and irresistible. As the songs rise to each heartfelt crescendo, you'll feel immersed, embraced, and endlessly welcomed into the very heart of Portugal.

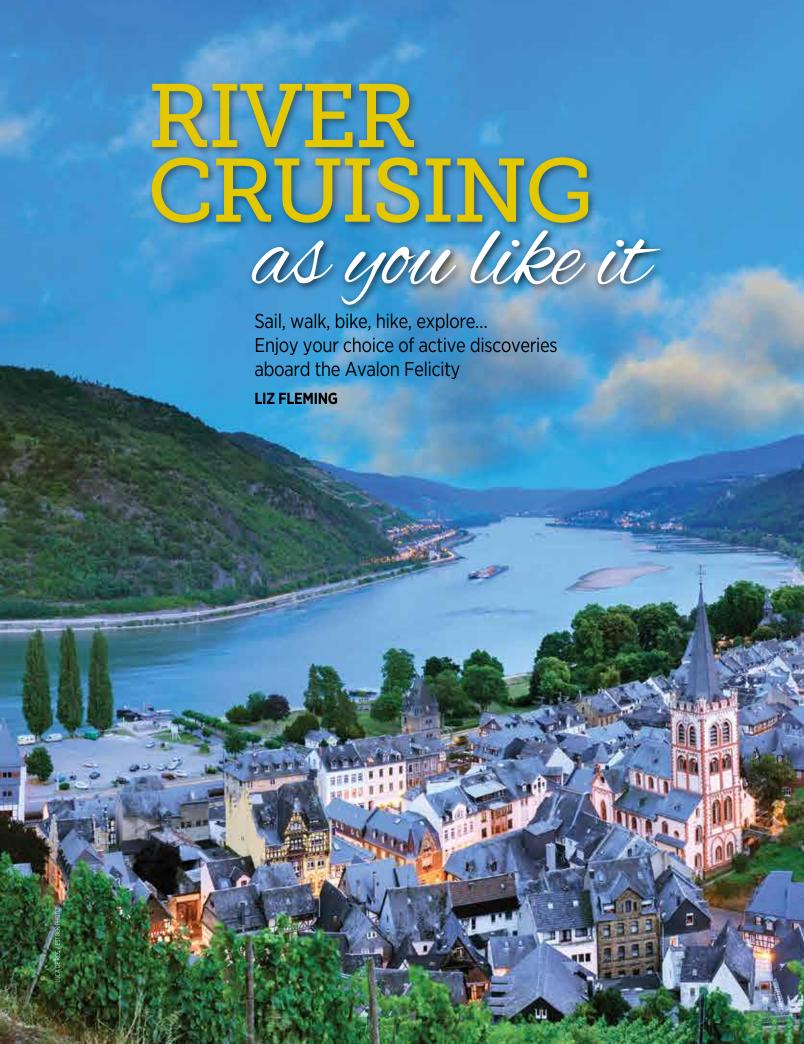

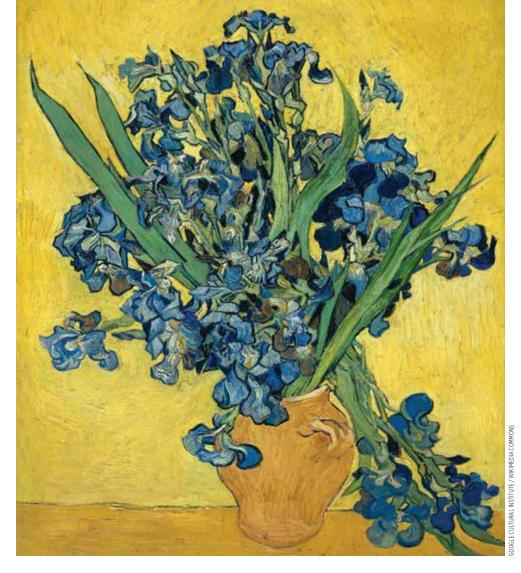

looked the same to him, I thought, and irises, after all, are still irises, no matter what century they're viewed in. More than a hundred years after the death of famous artist Vincent Van Gogh, his influence lives on. As I picked up my palette and brush in the Amsterdam studio, near his old haunts, I could almost imagine Vincent himself looking over my shoulder. He wouldn't have been impressed by my painting skills, but I'd like to think he'd have been pleased to see the roomful of wannabe artists learning about his techniques from the resident experts at a tiny Amsterdam studio and trying our hands at recreating his style.

This unusual painting afternoon was just one element in the hands-on, full-on immersion into Dutch and German culture that characterized our Avalon Active Discovery cruise from Amsterdam to Nuremberg. Though the itinerary of charming ports was familiar, Avalon's innovative approach to exploring and experiencing the landscape, the cuisine, and the culture was refreshingly new.

Recreating Van Gogh's brushstrokes was only the beginning. After we'd wiped the paint from our hands, our guide took us on a completely different voyage of discovery through the old streets of the city, to some of Amsterdam's finest foodie spots. We learned to hold a slippery pickled herring by its tail and lower it carefully into our mouths, as the Dutch do, and then discovered that we'd all been quite hideously mispronouncing the name of Holland's most famous cheese. Gouda isn't pronounced "goodah". It's "how-dah". No worries it's delicious no matter how you say it. Transitioning from cheese to chocolate, our guide led us to a tiny shop where a wonderfully mad chocolatier

spends his days crafting tiny, delectable Gucci bags and other designer look-alikes out of chocolate. So beautiful, they were almost too precious to eat - almost. We gobbled every creative morsel, then washed them down heartlessly with a chaser of Dutch, salted licorice.

A fully-translated tour of Amsterdam's iconic canal system and an impromptu Indonesian 'rijstaffel" - a rice table dinner - an important part of Dutch culture, thanks to their long history with that part of the world rounded out our first two cruise days and set the entertaining tone for the rest of the tour.

Each port offered a new surprise. We spent one glorious fall afternoon riding an open-air lift up a mountainside near Rudesheim, Germany, soaking up the scenery and filling our memories (and our memory cards!), then strolling down through a lush vineyard, chatting with pickers, tasting sun-warmed grapes, and watching the exacting farmer and vintner as they carefully checked their harvest.

One morning, like crusaders storming the castle walls in Miltenberg, we hiked up a hillside to explore the ancient ruins, then returned to the town below where we were rewarded for our efforts with a tasting of the local wurst - which we thought was actually the best! Our tour in Wurzburg took us along Roman roads to the castle of the bishop with its gorgeous gardens and bloodcurdling stories of what happened to those who displeased the mighty man - nasty but fascinating.

Along our various routes, we sampled local foods and even found ourselves in the tasting room of a family winery for a just-us sampling of their very best. A bike ride through Bamberg on our last day began with a very interesting introduction to the area's Salem-like history of witchburning and was topped off with a giant hand-twisted pretzel and a glass of beer at an ancient brewery.

Although the Avalon Felicity can accommodate 138 guests, not everyone joined us on the tours we'd selected. Avalon's Active Discovery program, after all, is about choice. Guests were free to decide which best suited their interests and the process of natural selection seemed to create a pretty even division, meaning that none of the tours felt overcrowded. Back on board each evening, dinner table conversation was always lively because everyone had a different story to tell about the day's adventures.

The ship itself is elegant and welldesigned, with a gracious dining room and lounge, as well as a spacious upper Sky Deck. Huge expanses of glass in all the public areas, in addition to the wall-to-wall panoramic windows in all staterooms seem to envelope the beautiful landscape you sail through. In the dining room, chefs eager to make each meal an experience, offer generous buffet feasts at breakfast and lunch, while at dinner a menu of wonderful choices, based largely on locally sourced recipes, make it hard to decide.

Beginning in 2019, Avalon guests will enjoy Flex, a new program that will offer open dining times, more tables for two, bar service on the Sky Deck and daily night fare at the bar. For those looking for a romantic get-away, the chefs will even be happy to pack picnic lunches!

Also beginning in 2019, as a special feature for the more active cruise guests on all European cruises, the company will add the services of an Avalon Adventure Host. Based in a new Adventure Center, the Host will help guests sign out bicycles, grab Nordic walking sticks, arrange a kayaking excursion on the river or find a complimentary fitness class on the Sky Deck. Another great 2019 innovation will be the introduction of the most dynamic special interest cruises to date, featuring in-depth tours of breweries and wineries, visits to Christmas markets and Jewish heritage sites, explorations of tulip gardens and castles, golfing at great courses and more. Also in 2019 - the 75th anniversary of the Normandy invasion - there will be itineraries that honour our proud WWII history, and if you're a Jann Arden fan, you'll be able to cruise with this world-famous Canadian singer. In 2020 you can enjoy a once-in-a-decade performance of the Passion Play by the villagers of Oberammergau, Bavaria. In terms of passion, whatever yours may be, Avalon has a cruise for you.

On board the Felicity, the mood is immersive, as if the goal each day is to bathe us in all that's best and most interesting about the Rhine and her surroundings. While every day offers gloriously self-indulgent opportunities to slip into my luxurious suite, flop on the all-too-inviting bed and watch the shore glide by, my favorite afternoon onboard the Felicity is spent lolling on the Sky Deck as we sail through the jaw-dropping Rhine Valley. With an abundance of remarkable castles at practically every bend in the river, it's a regal way to experience Germany.

A new take on Tauck

Tauck's ms Treasures and ms Esprit have been welcomed back into its riverboat fleet following a massive reconfiguration of the vessels' interior spaces that created enlarged staterooms while reducing quest numbers. Treasures and Esprit are the last of Tauck's four 110-meter ships to undergo the radical transformation - the other two 110-meter ships. the ms Sapphire and ms Emerald, were similarly reconfigured last year. Rather than maximizing guest count, Tauck's priority is creating roomier public areas for its guests as well as larger staterooms. Following their "down to the studs" refurbishment. the total number of staterooms were reduced from 59 to 49, with each ship's overall capacity being reduced from 118 passengers to 98 per vessel - a 17 percent reduction. Staterooms measuring 225 sq. ft. or larger now account for 69 percent of all Tauck ship accommodations - the highest percentage on any 110-meter riverboats in Europe.

Another great enhancement is the upgrade of the ships' second dining venue - now called Arthur's in tribute to company chairman Arthur Tauck Jr. - to include its own dedicated kitchen and chef. The renowned Tauck onboard experience

Located 25 km west of Dublin in Straffan, Co. Kildare, the countryside hideaway sits on 20 acres of formal gardens and oh-so-green lawns.

The oldest section dates back to 1288, with additional wings added during Elizabethan and Victorian times. There have been 37 owners, including, from 1979 - 1987, Eric Clapton. Since purchasing the property from Clapton, Ken Heath, entrepreneur and jovial innkeeper, has embarked upon significant restorations. Considering it his duty to be the guardian of the castle's fascinating history, he has blended the age-old infrastructure with modern comforts and a dash of contemporary elegance. "If there is such a thing as a ghost," says Heath, a twinkle in his eye, "this house definitely has one."
